Notes from the Social Ministry Committee

During September, members of the Sardis congregation continued to support the Social Ministry Committee as the Committee strives to share the many blessings.

#1 A big Thank You from the Catawba County Sherriff's department to the members of Sardis for their contributions to the HUGS AND KISSES stuff

Animals' program. The deputies give out the stuffed animals to children who are experiencing trauma or a crisis of some kind. Sergeant Rosenbaum from the Department came by Sardis and collected the donations. (see picture). He stressed how much the deputies appreciated having these "comfort items" when they need them.

#2 Thanks to all who helped pack 240 lunches for the unhoused in our area. 120 lunches were taken to the Hickory Soup Kitchen and 120 were taken to the Newton Corner Table. Staff from both locations were very appreciative and expressed their gratitude. Since the kitchens do not serve meals over the weekend, both organizations hand out the bags on Fridays so the unhoused will have a meal over the weekend. Again, members used their "hands to do God's work."

Upcoming Opportunities

Although the temperature does not feel like it, wintry weather will be here soon. During October and November, the Social Ministry Committee will be collecting wintry weather wear to share with the unhoused. This year there is an emphasis on socks, gloves, and hats. As you are out and about, please remember to pick up socks, gloves, and hats to donate. Of course, gently used hats, gloves, coats, sweaters, sweatshirts, and other outerwear will be appreciated also. The items collected will be delivered to the Soup Kitchen and the Corner Table the Friday before Thanksgiving. The organizations share the articles with the people who eat there – no charge.

Dot Lutz has set a goal to make one hundred knit caps by Thanksgiving. Wow! If you have extra yarn, she will put it to beneficial use.

Council Minutes Sardis Lutheran Church August 10, 2025

*No meetings were held for June or July due to no items or actions needing discussion. The council minutes from the May meeting and the financial reports for June and July were previously approved by council vote on-line.

Joe called the meeting to order at 7pm with 9 council members and the Pastor present. Jon provided devotions which focused on not building up treasures on earth and being prepared for the Lord's return by treasuring others instead of things.

The financial reports ending July 31st were reviewed. Two months of benevolence were paid in July with plans to pay two more months in August. This still leaves us two months behind on paying the 2025 benevolence. Some funds from the Building Fund are still being used to pay monthly bills as needed. With no further discussion, Jon made a motion to accept the financial reports as presented and this was seconded by Rick. The motion was approved.

Pastor's Report:

Pastor Oscar provided a detailed ministry overview of his activities in July which highlighted: Has had a very busy summer with visitations of hospitalized and home-bound members also providing communion and support as needed.

Took a trip to Germany and explored the history of the Lutheran faith. He is working on a presentation/overview of the trip to be presented to the congregation at a later date.

Stated that supply pastor Glen Deal was very appreciative of Sardis and donated his supply pastor pay and mileage earnings to the Sardis Youth Fund.

Stated the he and April Fulbright will be attending planning sessions for an area youth "Lock-in" to be held at Holy Trinity.

Posted office hours which will be each Wednesday from 11am until 3pm but he is also "on-call" as needed during daytime hours.

Old Business:

Fire Pit/Eagle Scout project update: (Josh Alling)

The project is still awaiting approval from the Eagle Scout board.

New Business:

Committee funding requests:

All committees needing funding for 2026 need to submit these requests to Dwayne asap. The Finance committee will begin meeting in September to prepare the budget for 2026. The final budget recommendation will be presented to the church council in October. Jane and Dwayne will work to finalize these dates.

Homecoming plans:

Homecoming will be held on Sunday, September 14th. Pastor Oscar will be the speaker with a pot-luck lunch following the service. Jane will post this information in the bulletin.

Mike and Jane will contact Cintas to stop this service.

Working on repairs to the Bell Tower (Mike M. to get quotes for repairs)

Fire escape needs to be sanded and repainted. (The plan is to complete this later this fall once the weather is cooler)

Refinishing the doors to the Narthex (Mike M will discuss this project with Terry Bledsoe)

The September Church Council meeting will be held on Sunday, September 14th at 7pm.

With no other items to discuss, Darrell made a motion that the meeting be adjourned, and Ken seconded the motion.

The meeting closed with the Lord's Prayer.
