
YouthQuake 2024: East & West

Upcoming Outreach Opportunities

The Social Ministry will again be collecting winter coats, sweaters, hats, <u>and socks</u> for the homeless during October and November. As you are getting your family ready for the wintry weather, please consider donating any gently used or new outerwear for the homeless. Besides outwear, the Head of the Hickory Soup Kitchen told Rita there is a need for socks of all sizes. The Soup Kitchen and the Corner Table distribute coats and socks of all sizes (adult and children) to the people attending their meals at no cost.

Hats off and Thanks for the outreaches in August and September

In August and September, members of the Sardis Congregation made positive differences through two outreaches in our community.

School Supplies-August

First, in August school supplies were donated to Blackburn and Banoak Elementary to help those families who cannot afford the tools their children need to succeed in school. Everything from pencil, to markers, to crayons, to earphones, to paper to bookbags were delivered. In addition, hand soap, hand sanitizer, Kleenex and band aids were donated for typical use in the classroom.

Homeless Lunches-September

Secondly, in September, after Homecoming, members helped pack 240 bag lunches for the homeless. The Hickory Soup Kitchen and The Corner Table in Newton each received 120 lunches. Both outreaches are closed on the weekend, so the bag lunches are distributed to the homeless so they can have food over the weekend.

Thanks for continuing to share your blessings and help those less fortunate in our area.

Sleep in Heavenly Peace Build-A-Bed Project

On Saturday, Sept 14 I attended the Lowes sponsored Build-a-bed project in Mooresville. Pre-registration was done online at the shpbeds.org website. A week prior to the event I received an email detailing what to do. Since you may be sanding or operating a drill or saw, PPE was provided – gloves, eye protection, and ear plugs. Doughnuts and coffee were provided along with a T-shirt once we registered.

After a brief explanation of the day's events, we were told to find a station to work. I chose the sanding tables-about 12 tables with 3 sanders on each. Basically, we were to sand down the edges on boards that were either for the head or footboard, or slats for the mattress to rest on. It was only a few minutes until the boards arrived. Maybe some had been precut to give us a supply to work on, but drills and saws were going at full speed. A DJ provided loud pop music that I feel was intended to keep us working at a break-neck speed! Those earplugs would have been handy had I noticed them when I signed in.

Occasionally a board would have a staple in it, or stamped writing that head to be sanded off, but most of the day was monotonous sanding. My hand-sander actually lasted about 90 minutes before needing a new charged battery. People were everywhere, taking our sanded boards and bringing more. We broke for sandwiches and chips provided by a sponsor. There were 5-6 sponsors there, Carhartt being the main sponsor. Prizes were raffled off during the day. Most of the people there volunteering seemed to be Lowes employees.

Back to sanding after a short break. During the day the DJ announced the number of beds that were finished. I was expecting to see an actual bed, but we only put headboards and footboards together. The side rails are brought to the child's home and connected there. A mattress and sheet and comforter set are also provided.

I'm not sure if Lowes supplied the lumber, but money is needed to provide the mattresses, sheets, pillows, and comforter. I feel certain that the money raised through the Pennies Project thru NC WELCA will be used to purchase those items.

After 150 beds were completed, all the noise ended! While we were working, others gathered the needed parts for the headboards and footboards, nailed them together, branded the SHP logo on them, and then dipped them into a vat of varnish (?) from which they quickly dried. They were stacked into huge orderly sections. The side rails were also prepared and dipped. Amazing that 150 beds were completed in about 5 hours!!

A last raffle to give away all the door prizes. I actually won! I chose a Carhartt blanket as it seemed the most useable. Austin thinks it supposed to be for your hunting dog! So, I guess
