As we enter the peak of this election season, it is crucial to remind ourselves of our central calling that transcends all earthly debates, opinions, and political stances: the call to love our neighbor. And love them as ourselves. This commandment, which Jesus Himself gave and emphasized, becomes even more important during times of division and discord. The way we engage with others—especially those with whom we may disagree—reflects not only our faith but also our commitment to the Kingdom of God.

In his writings on the Two Kingdoms, Martin Luther taught that God rules in two distinct ways: through the "kingdom of the world" and the "kingdom of grace." In the kingdom of the world, God works through governments and social structures to maintain order and justice. It is through this kingdom that we see laws, policies, and the political processes that can often feel overwhelming, especially in an election year. But it is important to remember that as followers of Christ, we are also citizens of another, higher kingdom—the kingdom of grace. The kingdom of Heaven.

In this kingdom, we are not governed by law, division, or political allegiances, but by love, mercy, grace, and forgiveness. It is a kingdom that reflects the very heart of Christ, who calls us to live as ambassadors of His love to all people, regardless of their background, beliefs, or political positions. God's grace extends to all, and as God's people, we are called to embody this grace in our relationships with one another.

During this election season, let us stand firm in our calling to be citizens of God's loving kingdom. While we may participate in the kingdom of the world, let us do so in a way that reflects the values of Christ's kingdom of mercy, peace, and love. Let us remember that no matter what happens at the polls, God's love in Christ remains constant, and His kingdom endures forever.

I know it can feel discouraging and difficult. But remember the radical love that has named and claimed you. Remember who and whose you are and that God loves you and so do I!
