

Giving Added Meaning to "Love Thy Neighbor" BY PATTI O'BRIEN

When Nancy DiPasquale invites people into her home, she treats them as honored guests. Her husband Henry and son Colin, 15, do the same. They have, by their own admission, taken the "Love Thy Neighbor" verse to a whole new level.

Their story began in Belmar, NJ, where Nancy and Henry were next-door neighbors. They met in 1996 and married three years later. "I married the girl next door," says Henry.

Henry had graduated from Trenton State College (now TCNJ) with a BS in May, 1987 and owned a successful business in Monmouth County (in Central Jersey—yes, it exists!) for 30 years. Now semi-retired, he manages residential and commercial real estate with his wife.

Nancy graduated from Seton Hall with a BA in 1990, and an MA in 1994. She worked for her alma mater for 10 years after graduation, moving onto an Executive Director position at a nonprofit adult school and tv production facility, which eventually led to 15 years working parttime in the broadcast industry as a local television host and commercial voiceover artist on the Cablevision/Optimum network. And just last year, she became a guest speaker for a Mass Communication class at Rowan College at Burlington County.

CHOOSING MOORESTOWN

In 2015, the DiPasquale family moved into the Northwest Estates section of town. Like many residents, they came to Moorestown for the school system and the sense of community they so valued.

"We had narrowed down our choices to three towns in New Jersey, but after learning there was a kindness initiative in Moorestown, it tipped the scales for us," Nancy explains. "Holly Meyers ran a book club in town at the library then, and the week we moved into town they were just beginning a prolonged study of the book The Power of Kindness by Piero Ferrucci. That's how we knew for sure we were in the right place!"

Nancy met regularly with the like-minded group members who shared their own kindness ideas with one another, eventually leading to several members seeing through their own visions of "bringing more kindness and connectivity into the community of Moorestown." One member, Karen Reiner, brings neighbors together through community events planned by her own nonprofit: MooreUnity.

"Although it's been five years since moving to Moorestown, we remember that feeling of living

somewhere unfamiliar like it was yesterday! Central and South Jersey may as well be different states. Eventually it all fell into place, meeting people, finding our way. But if it weren't for the kindness of others along the way, it could have been much less pleasant," Nancy says.


Because of that, Nancy volunteers for the Welcome New Families Committee at school each year, to welcome, assure, and connect with new families in the district. This year will be her fourth year giving back as one of the 'Welcome Ladies' for Moorestown Township Public Schools.

DISASTER BRINGS OPPORTUNITY

When Super Storm Sandy hit the Jersey Shore in 2012, the family felt for those devastated by loss. So, they gathered some supplies to donate, then asked their town of Cream Ridge, along with surrounding areas, to join them. Supplies poured in, and someone donated the use of a tractor-trailer and driver. The community helped their neighbors-inneed by filling an entire 53-foot tractortrailer with disaster-relief supplies in one weekend at a local park.

"We called it the Tractor-Trailer Challenge," explains Nancy.

Fast forward to 2017, when Hurricane Irma devastated the Florida Keys.



The DiPasquale family knew they had to resurrect their town-wide supplies drive initiative, so they put their new town to the Tractor-Trailer Challenge™. Moorestown rose to that challenge, not just once in 2017, but again in 2018 when Hurricane Florence hit North Carolina. Both times, teen volunteers and their families filled a 53-foot truck with supplies from Moorestown residents, schools, organizations, and businesses. (www. TractorTrailerChallenge.orgw)

In awe of the neighborly response to help others, and Mother Nature's break from nearby hurricanes in 2019, the DiPasquale family put forth their other philanthropic ideas and created the Local Acts of Kindness Foundation™ on November 13, 2019— World Kindness Day. The couple celebrated their 20th wedding anniversary there last October, with a supersecret vow renewal.

"It was just the two of us and our son, Colin, along with a photographer and violinist. We told no one until it was over, which totally added to the excitement and romance of it! The weather was just as perfect as it had been 20 years ago on our wedding day when we'd sailed out of the Atlantic Highlands Marina to the Statue of Liberty and back with all of our wedding guests aboard the Cornucopia Princess," recalls Nancy.

"Two great days by the sea we will never forget!"

Winters see the family chasing the sunshine by flying south, or getting away for quick ski trips to Pennsylvania or Vermont. And although they're from Central Jersey, they've always followed Philly teams, and take an annual trip to a Phillies game.

"Our family tradition has always been watching the Super Bowl together at home with an unreasonable amount of homemade nachos. It was a real thrill to witness the Eagles win the Super Bowl as South Jersey residents," Henry says.

THE APPLE DOESN'T FALL FAR FROM THE TREE

In 2005, Henry and Nancy welcomed their son, Colin. Now 15, Colin is a sophomore at Moorestown High School, a member of the

Theater, and Moorestown Crew.

Colin has been playing piano since 2011. Last summer, he created a program called Senior Serenades™, where musical teens donate their time and talents entertaining local seniors at assisted living facilities, playing piano and various band instruments. (www.SeniorSerenades.org)

"I've been playing piano for my grandmother for years and she always seems to enjoy it. So, I figured if MY grandmother enjoys it, maybe other grandparents would enjoy it! Two summers ago, I tested it out by volunteering to play piano at an assisted-living facility near Long Beach Island, then launched Senior Serenades™ in Moorestown that fall," savs Colin.

Senior Serenades™ recently received national attention when Colin and fellow Senior Serenades™ musicians were featured on The TODAY Show to celebrate Colin's efforts in creating a virtual version of his program in response to the COVID-19 pandemic, thereby expanding his program nationally, entertaining senior citizens throughout the country who are cut-off from their loved ones during quarantine.


EVEN THE DOG'S A STAR




