Road Report

John Cypher read the Road Report submitted. The 2019 Ford 550 truck was inspected. Front tires are still leaking on the payloader. Equipment maintenance will continue to be done as needed; misc. parts were picked up. Sweepster broom was reassembled (with new parts received) and tested.

The road crew installed inlet and additional storm pipe was modified at 331 Hannahstown Rd. to accommodate the SFTF per DEP requirement.

The pool chairs and pool cover were returned to the pool as requested. The new leaf blower is mounted and ready for use. Park maintenance is in progress.

The second area of Schnur's road edge (Bonniebrook Rd.) was filled and graded Oct. 7 and 8. Brush was trimmed at O'Hara Rd. and Dinnerbell Rd. A shed that was blown onto Great Belt Rd. roadway was removed 9/30/20. A hanging tree limb was removed over Patterson Rd. Township grounds were mowed and groomed. Roads will be reviewed prior to winter for ponding water and corrected if necessary. A written compliment was received about road crew for berm mowing and increasing site visibility. Patterson Rd. has been crack-sealed. Other roads (i.e. Rennick, Marwood, Neupert and West Jefferson Roads) cannot be done safely unless the road crew gets more help.

Snow fence to start after Oct. 20th. The foreman may pick and choose what to put up due to lack of help and possible mild winter (predicted by the Farmers' Almanac.) Trucks will be changed over for winter maintenance in early November, depending on the weather/forecasts.

Weeds and brush were mowed on Frazier at intersection with Saxonburg Rd., so the road crew could locate a pipe outlet that crosses Frazier Rd. The road crew would like to continue to mow that area. The Supervisors indicated that the manager should contact PennDOT about 'in kind services' (agility or shared services program) for this area and perhaps Rt. 356 at Great Belt Rd. The manager will also talk to PennDOT again about the vehicles parked on Saxonburg Rd. (state road) across from the vehicle repair shop.

Planning Commission

Leo Rosenbauer, P.C. Chairman, reported there was no meeting on Sept. 21, 2020 as there was no business scheduled. The Ferraro Plan Sewage Module was finally approved by DEP and since the 90-day recording window has expired (it was approved in March 2020 contingent upon DEP approval) and it must be reaffirmed as approved. The Supervisors voted to re-approve the <u>T. Ferraro Plan</u> with contingency met.

REMINDER: Subdivision Plans, Land Development Plans, and Modification Requests are REQUIRED to be submitted 2 weeks prior to the Planning Commission meeting!

Recreation Committee

The Recreation Committee Chairman reported on the Oct. 7, 2020 Recreation Committee. Action Items: 1. Road crew to winterize the water service at the baseball concession stand as time permits. 2. Dumpster removals should be scheduled per the 'revised' dates provided: pool 9/30; baseball and softball 11/2; and soccer 11/9. 3. Review/inspect the parking lot (between softball and baseball areas) in front of the Lions pavilion to determine if a remedy for the large aggregate is possible. 4. Road crew to lock park gates for the winter early in November. (Soccer's last game is Nov. 1st and soccer's dumpster removal is Nov. 9th.) Mr.

Patten noted that the associations were reminded to 'lock up' after each time the gates are opened for misc. work

October 12, 2020 Unfinished Business

The proposed, revised Burning Ordinance was reviewed by the attorney and the 'corrected' copy was received. Only a few changes were made to clarify wording and to re-number the ordinance in chapter form. After some consideration, the Supervisors voted to authorize advertisement of the Burning Ordinance #459 as revised for adoption at the Nov. 9, 2020 meeting. Supervisor Rankin stated that she is not happy with the DEP regulations regarding prohibiting commercial burning (or anything other than single family/duplex residential burning). The manager noted that it was DEP that strongly suggested that the burning ordinance be revised. The motion carried 2 to 1.

October 12, 2020

There was a very lengthy discussion with Ms. Marie Grabe regarding the use of an existing septic system for a proposed modular home due to the system being placed within a utility right-of-way. The manager distributed a drawing and a copy of the letter sent to Ms. Grabe under the direction of Attorney Marshall to each Supervisor to review. Although there was some confusion, it was finally determined that Ms. Grabe must exhaust all efforts to find an alternate viable site for a septic system.

Miscellaneous Business – October 12, 2020

Members of Cub Scout Pack #51 from Saxonburg with their leader Mr. Perry Dawson and several parents were present to observe. The Supervisors introduced themselves and explained how local government works, how the supervisor election process works and explained the difference between state and township governing. The Planning Commission Secretary, the Recreation Committee Chairman and the Road Foreman introduced themselves and explained their responsibilities. Mr. Dawson thanked the Board for talking to the scouts and noted the good job that the road crew does on the township roads.

- During the upcoming winter months, as per the Township Ordinances, NO ONE is to park on the cul-de-sacs or any public road so that the road can easily be cleaned of snow. Please <u>DO NOT PUSH SNOW ONTO THE ROADS</u> when plowing your driveway. Should this cause an accident, you could be named in a claim or lawsuit. <u>In addition</u>, this is a reminder that the Township is NOT responsible for replacing or repairing mailboxes damaged during the plowing/salting process. Mailbox installation guidelines are available at the USPS website "Regulations for Installing a Mailbox."

Also, residents living along the Butler-Freeport Community Trail are asked to be considerate when plowing snow from their property. Some residents are plowing snow onto the trail and in front of the gates, which blocks emergency vehicle access. If there would be an emergency, Emergency Services / 1st Responders would have difficulty getting to the scene.

NOTICE: Jefferson Township's responsibility during & following storms and excessive rain events is to clear and protect the Township rights-of-way. The Township is NOT authorized to clean-up any private property; the only exception would be for Emergency access for 9-1-1 responders! It also not legal for property owners to place any storm/rain/wind debris from their property along the township road rights-of-way.

⇒ Jefferson Township Burning Ordinance

The Township Burning Ordinance limits burning of 'ordinary' (domestic) waste materials (paper, cartons, boxes, leaves, wood, and other similar items) by residents to between the hours of 6 AM to 6 PM from Monday through Saturday. Items intended to be 'excluded' from burning are: sewage, all putrescible animal & vegetable matter resulting from handling, preparation, cooking and consumption of food, rags, old clothes, leather, rubber, carpets, furniture, tin cans, glass, crockery, masonry, metals, chemicals, tires, shingles and petroleum products such as (but not limited to) paint, grease, oil and plastic products. PLEASE use common sense!

Many items that cannot be burned can be recycled. All fires are to be completely extinguished no later than 6 P.M. PLEASE be considerate of your neighbors and do NOT permit leaves and other 'allowed' materials to be left smoldering after 6 PM.

BUSINESSES/COMMERCIAL (ALL non-residential) and MULTI-FAMILY, according to the PA Dept. of Environmental Protection, are PROHIBITED from ANY burning at ANY time.

TIRES are NEVER to be burned by ANYONE. Dumping of Tires is ILLEGAL and subject to fines.
