Road Report – Sept. 12th meeting

Chairman John Cypher read the road report.

- The side deck mowing is completed, but the boom mowing will take a few more days to complete.
- All paving and sealing have been completed; the road crew and the Supervisors are pleased with the results, including the fog seal and grip tight applied to some roads. Rennick Road shoulders are being filled in and several gravel driveways will be addressed as soon as possible.
- A new vac hose had to be ordered for the leaf vac.
- A private driveway culvert at 126 Jones Rd. which was covered over by grass and weeds, was damaged by the side deck mower. The roadcrew will investigate and repair if necessary.
- A Vac truck can be rented from A & H Equipment in Zelienople. Cost is \$3,750 per week or \$10,500 for a month. All the catch basins (about 700) in the township need cleaned out and the foreman asked the Supervisors to consider renting it for next year. The Supervisors voted to include \$12,000 in the 2023 budget for rental of a Vac truck.
- The foreman reported that the rear tires on the 2019 F550 need replaced before winter; and all four tires on the 2015 F550 should be replaced. He is waiting for 'state pricing' and availability via Elliott Tire in Butler.
- The roadcrew has patch work to do on Fisher, Great Belt, and Golden City Roads and crack sealing is needed on Fisher Rd., Oak Dr., May Dr. and Jason Dr. before inclement weather arrives.
- The new salt contract (Co-Stars) resulted in an increase per ton, bringing it up to \$79.05 for this 2022/2023 season.
- Stop signs at Mushrush/Bullcreek and Frazier/Dinnerbell intersections had to be replaced due to hit and runs.
- A sink hole showed up below the trestle on Golden City Rd. and was repaired by the roadcrew. It is believed that it was caused by old lumber or stumps that were covered up by the railroad during construction and it finally rotted away causing a void.

Recreation Committee – Sept. 12th meeting

Brian Patten, Recreation Committee Chairman, reported on the Aug. 10, 2022 and Sept. 7, 2022 meetings. <u>Baseball</u>: They are holding fall ball. Action Requests:

- The Pool Association asked that the road crew deliver the pool cover on or about Sept. 21st.
- It was announced that the Township received notification of the DCNR grant award and some discussion followed. The \$555,000 grant still has paperwork to complete via Butler County Parks & Recreation. Necessary additional funding is still being researched.

- The <u>Soccer Association</u> requested that the Township review overhanging limbs on the trees along the right side of the main soccer parking lot behind the guiderail. The Manager looked at the trees on the right side of the main soccer parking lot. They are ash trees, and he plans to have them cut down, rather than trim limbs. There was discussion about the requested ADA parking and viewing area. The Manager noted that CDBG funds cannot be used for this proposed project since there is not already ADA parking there. Supervisor Rankin would like to see ARPA (American Rescue Plan) funds for this; but the Board needs a drawing and cost estimates to review prior to making a decision.
- It was noted that the walking trail has been washed out (rutted) in the area behind field #3. A request that the roadcrew inspect and repair as needed was presented.

Planning Commission

Leo Rosenbauer, P.C. Chair., reported on the August 15, 2022 Planning Commission meeting. Mr. John Frydrych from Civil & Environmental Consultants, Inc.) went over some of the Knoch Stadium Turf Land Development's field details with the Supervisors this evening (9/12/22). Manager Rosenbauer noted that they have satisfied the HRG comments (Plan Review Letter 01). Copies of the land development had been sent to the Butler County Planning Commission and the Butler Conservation District. The only outstanding items are the NPDES Permit and the Operations & Maintenance agreement. After some discussion, the Supervisors voted to approve the Knoch Stadium Turf Land Development contingent upon receipt of the NPDES Permit and the execution and recording of the O & M Agreement.

Mr. and Mrs. Gary Morgan spoke to the P.C. on Aug. 15th to get information and inquire about options for a proposed land development to move a 'floral/aquatic/fish' small business to the storage building on his property on Great Belt Rd. The P.C. noted several problems, and urged him to continue to look for lease or purchase properties. They gave him several places into which he can look.

Sept. 12, 2022 Unfinished Business - None.

Sept. 12, 2022 New Business

The cooperation agreement with the County of Butler for the 2022 CDBG (Community Development Block Grant) regular funds totaling \$108,012 (projects \$88,635 and administration \$19,377) is ready to execute and designate use of the funds. The Supervisors voted to sign the agreement and designate the fund for 'housing rehab.' The Supervisors voted to adopt the "Three-Year Plan" Resolution #494 for use of the funds and to adopt the new "Fair Housing" Resolution #495 (for non-discrimination).

The Resolution for Plan Revision for New Land Development (Resolution #496) needed to be adopted for the DEP Sewage Module for a 'small flow treatment facility' at the property at 394 Bullcreek Rd. to 'replace' the malfunction septic system. The Supervisors voted to adopt Resolution #496.

Manager Rosenbauer noted that Riemer Gas called about placing a new gas line on the north side of Alwine Rd. The road foreman and the manager met with their representatives and they agreed to place the line according to township guidelines. The Supervisors agreed.

⇒ Jefferson Township Burning Ordinance

The Township Burning Ordinance limits burning of 'ordinary' (domestic) waste materials (paper, cartons, boxes, yard waste, wood, and other similar items) by residents to 'dawn to dusk'; see on-line ordinance for excluded items. PLEASE use common sense! Many items that cannot be burned can be recycled. All fires are to be completely extinguished before leaving unattended.

Recreational fires are permitted by Ordinance #459 (Chapter 7 of the Code of Ordinances.)

PLEASE be considerate of your neighbors and do NOT permit leaves and other 'allowed' materials to be left smoldering after dusk.

ALL COMMERCIAL/INDUSTRIAL BUSINESSES, NON-RESIDENTIAL and MULTI-FAMILY are PROHIBITED from ANY burning at ANY time per the Dept. of Environmental Protection.
