



Did you know...Alpine is nestled against the mountainsides at the convergence of three rivers, the Snake, the Greys, and the Salt River. All three rivers merge and flow into the Palisades Reservoir. Alpine has long been a place of movement where ancient travel routes converged - first for Native peoples, then fur trappers, and later early travelers navigating the rugged West.

Did you know...A ferry operated across the Snake River at the Alpine flat from 1889 until the first steel bridge was built across the river in 1914.

Did you know...In 1939 the Civilian Conservation Corps finished a narrow two-laned gravel road between Alpine and Jackson. Prior to 1939, only a narrow horse trail existed between Alpine and Jackson with the primary route of travel being a journey of almost 110 miles through Victor, Idaho then up over rugged Teton Pass, through Wilson then on to Jackson.

Did you know...The Alpine landscape as seen today was dramatically reshaped by the construction of the Palisades dam. Construction of the 270-foot-high earth fill dam was started in 1952 and completed in 1957. The rising waters of the Palisades Reservoir swallowed the original valley floor completely inundating the historic roads, farms and original 1900s Alpine settlement infrastructure, all which had to be relocated uphill to build the modern Town of Alpine.

Did you know...Alpine sits at the northern end of Star Valley, which is seismically active. The valley is dropping relative to the bounding Salt River Range at a rate of about 1 cm/year along the Grand Valley Fault system.

Did you know...Wyoming used to be covered by seas many millions of years ago. The 350-million-year-old Madison Limestone can be found high in the adjacent mountain ranges and yields spectacular ocean fossils like horn coral, crinoids, and brachiopods. Today, land snails are plentiful on these same rocks because limestone provides a calcium-rich environment essential for shell development.

Did you know...Alpine's annual snowfall averages 150 inches, making winter sports such as snowshoeing, ice fishing, cross-country skiing and fat-biking readily available. There are over 150 miles of groomed winter trails in the area.

Trail Information

Trail 055 Long Spring Trail to Long Spring Basin, 4 miles roundtrip, 1,440 feet elevation gain, located 2.8 miles from Alpine.

Trail 097 Big Elk Creek Trail to Siddoway Fork, 11.6 miles roundtrip, 680 feet elevation gain, located 15.7 miles from Alpine.

Trail 4056 Red Creek Trail, 10.6 miles roundtrip to Red Peak, 10.6 miles roundtrip, 3,973 feet elevation gain, located 5 miles from Alpine.

Trail 3073 Middle Ridge Trail, 7.2 mile loop, 1,496 feet elevation gain, located 8 miles from Alpine.

Be Prepared, Respect the Rules

Stay on designated routes and respect closures.
Drive only where motorized use is allowed.
Use developed campgrounds where available, or dispersed camp only where allowed.
Keep campsites clean and pack out trash.
This is bear country! Always carry bear spray and make noise when recreating outside.
Proper food storage is required.
Never leave a fire unattended and extinguish it until cold to the touch. Follow any current fire restrictions and burn bans.
Be sure to bring water, food, and sun protection with you when recreating. Know before you go.

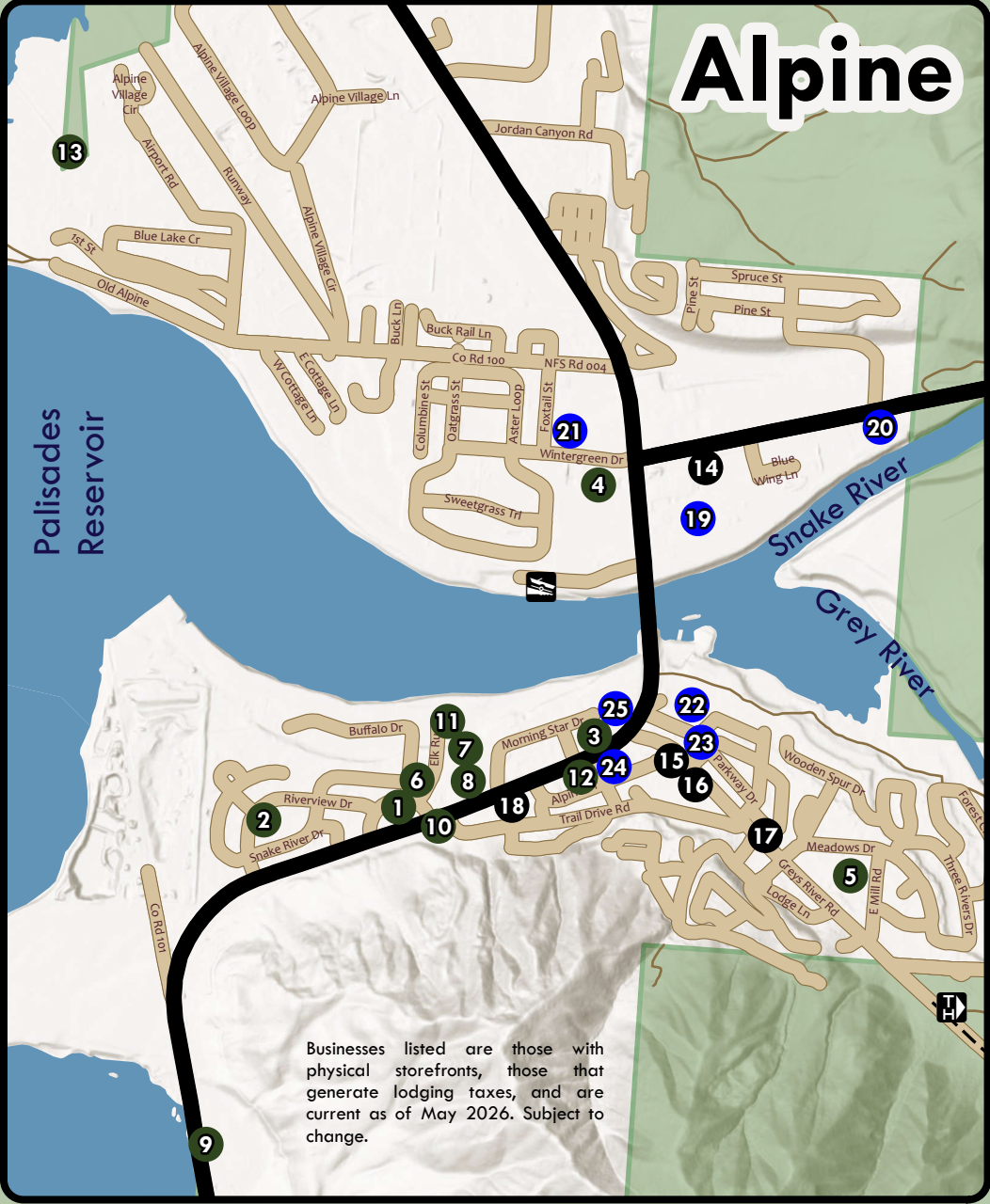
