Our company was the Construction Manager and General Contractor for the new Performing Arts Center in Appleton, Wisconsin which was designed by the Zeidler Partnership. We had an exceptionally successful experience with this firm which was above and beyond most any other service which we had previously received from any of the national firms with whom we have worked.

Our company is 114 years old and operates in many parts of the country and has worked for most of the well known architectural firms. The PAC experience was superior in that not only was Zeidler Partnership's personnel strong, but the consulting firms which they hired for acoustical design, mechanical, plumbing, sprinkler and structural work were exceptionally high in quality. This was necessary because the project had an absolute completion date requirement 25 months from the day the first concrete was poured.
