Academics for this Week

Phonics & Handwriting

This week we are learning how to sound out CVC (consonant-vowel-consonant) words as well as build these words! We are learning how to identify the beginning, middle, and ending sounds!

Reading Workshop/Guided Reading

Throughout our new unit, we will explore both fiction and non-fiction stories about weather. When reading non-fiction texts, students will focus on identifying main topics and key details. For our fiction stories, students will practice the 5-finger retelling strategy. Students will also develop their reading skills by comparing fiction and non-fiction stories about weather. Your child's reading folder has both fiction and non-fiction retell visuals!

<u>Writing</u>

We are learning what writers do! Writers:

1. Think

- 2. Draw
- 3. Label
- 4. Write

We are now learning that writers write sentences! Writers write sentences by:

- Sound out words by saying them slow like a turtle. Then write the sounds they hear.
- Put a finger space between each word
- Begin the sentence with an uppercase letter and end it with a period.

We are continuing our work with personal narratives. Next week, we will focus on telling our stories in sequential order using transition words such as "first," "then," and "last."

<u>Math</u>

We have begun working with teen numbers. Our focus has been on understanding teen numbers as combinations of tens and ones, as well as practicing number writing. Additionally, we are developing counting skills, including counting to 100 by ones and tens.

For the 3rd quarter, our goals include:

- Counting to 100 by ones and tens
- Counting backwards from 20
- Counting forward from any given number up to 100

These skills can be easily practiced during daily activities, such as car rides or bath time. For additional support, Jack Hartmann offers educational counting songs on YouTube that make learning fun and engaging.

Science/Social Studies

In Social Studies, we will be working on learning important personal information, including phone numbers and addresses. This is a valuable life skill for our students, and we greatly appreciate your support in helping them learn this information. Early next week, I will send home a form where you can provide the most appropriate phone number and address for your child to memorize.
