Message from Leadership

Surviving and Thriving During COVID

At the end of our last fiscal year, we were only three months into the COVID-19 pandemic, and few of us thought we would still be dealing with it at the end of this fiscal year. It has been an amazing time in both good and bad ways, bringing out the best and worst in people. The virus pointed out the terrible disparities in health care in our country, evidenced by people of color dying at higher rates than white people. Our worst instincts had us hoarding toilet paper. Our best selves afforded us an opportunity to be creative and innovative in responding.

Our community certainly rose up immediately – the United Way of Carlisle & Cumberland County, United Way of the Capital Region, and the Partnership for Better Health all made money available quickly to help agencies deal with the new challenges presented by the virus. DVSCP received nearly \$159,000 of CARES Act funding from the PA Coalition Against Domestic Violence, which could be allocated to anything COVID related – cleaning supplies, building repairs, and moteling clients. Dickinson College pulled together a huge network of people who met weekly to problem solve around any issue the community was facing. DVSCP, and many other nonprofits, learned to deliver services over ZOOM, found interactive ways to counsel child clients, and continued to offer counseling and assistance with Protection from Abuse Orders, following guidelines from the CDC and State Health Department.

The Board of Directors thought long and hard about ‘social distancing fundraisers,’ and the generosity of the community became apparent quickly as DVSCP reached its funding goals. We sold and delivered holiday wreaths for the first time and offered ‘meals to go’ through Evolution Catering. Though we couldn’t hold the Sunflower Gala live, corporate sponsors were as supportive as ever, and the online auction was very successful. DVSCP had so many offers of help in so many varieties – gift cards, diapers, baby formula, homemade meals to deliver to residents. While it was an unbelievably hard year in so many ways, it was also an extremely heart-warming time, as offer after offer of help poured into the office.

In keeping with the unrest that was rocking the country, staff focused on racial justice and attempted to educate ourselves more fully about the impact race might have on services being offered. Staff will start the new year at a facilitated retreat with a theme of cultural humility and continue to explore ways to be inclusive, equitable and diverse in our work.

We thank you for keeping this agency in your thoughts throughout the past year and supporting us in so many open-hearted ways.

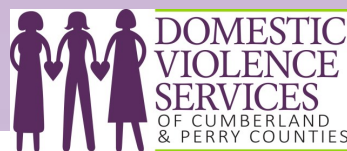

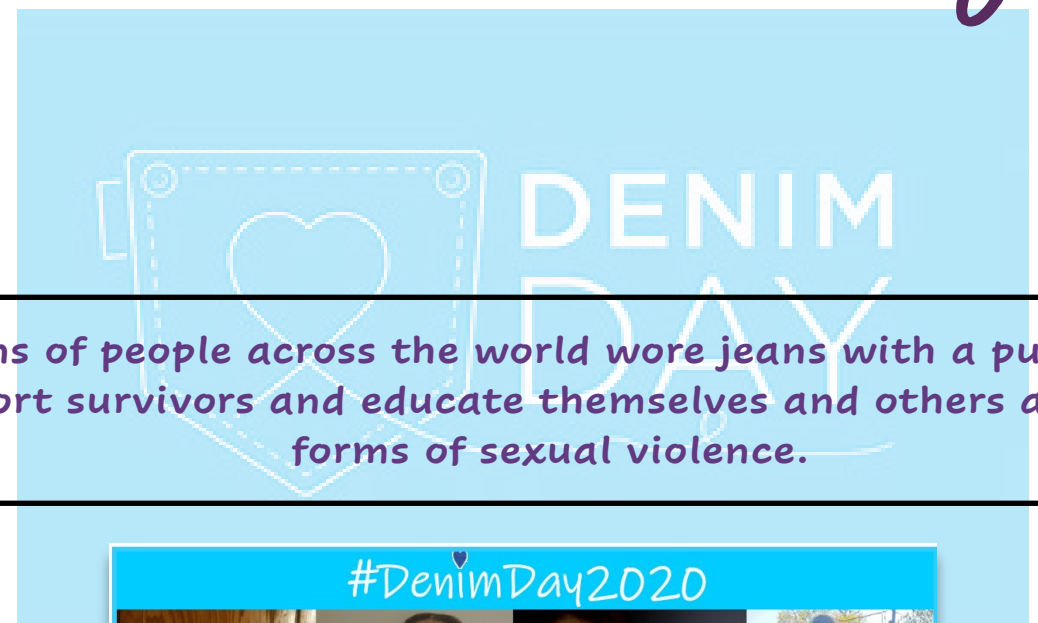

Every October, during Domestic Violence Awareness Month, DVSCP partners with YWCA Greater Harrisburg to hold an event to honor First Responders for their work with victims of domestic violence. However, due to COVID-19, this event could not be held. DVSCP decided to get creative to ensure that our First Responder partners in Cumberland and Perry counties knew how much we appreciated the hard work.

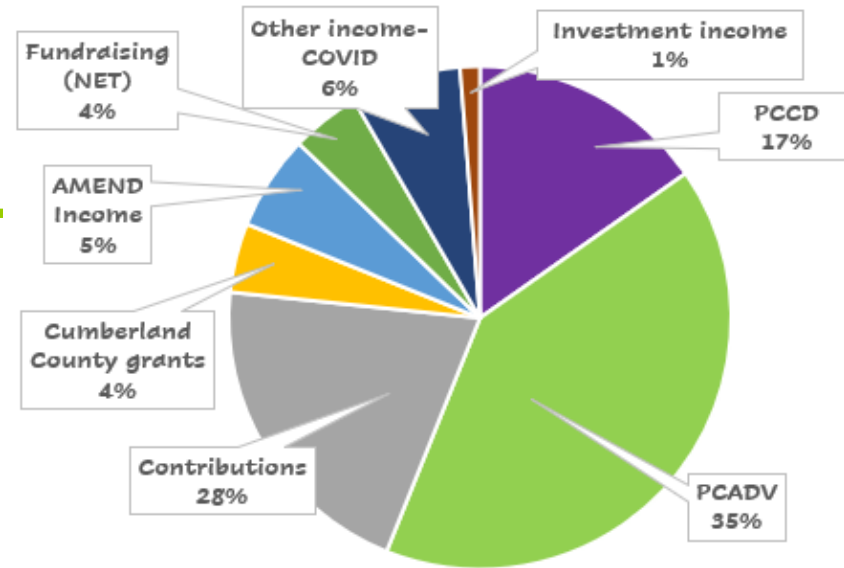
