NCEON Newsletter – March 2021

Dear NCEON Supporters and Volunteers –

NCEON STATS

The following food and financial distributions were made during the months of January and February 2021. Please note the food items that we share with other ministries are perishable items that are left over and cannot be used at NCEON. All donated shelf items are retained at NCEON for distribution to our local community:

January 2021

1. Medical - \$98.31
 2. Bags of Food - Families – 306 x \$30 = \$9,180.00
 3. Bags of Food – Hands & Feet for Jesus - 210 x \$30 = \$6,300.00
 4. Bags of Food – Lutheran Mission – 285 x 30 = \$8,550.00
 5. Bags of Food – Calvary - 40 x 30 = \$1,200.00
 6. Total number of families served – 70
 7. Total number of people served – 164

February 2021

Expenses for January and February 2021:

NCEON's total combined operating expenses for January and February 2021 was \$8505.99. These expenses include rent, BGE, Verizon (phone and

internet), water & sewage, pest control service, trash & recycling removal, and miscellaneous expenses for various office supplies.

We resumed our monetary assistance on January 18, 2021. Our total monetary distribution to our clients for the period of January-February 2021 was \$1,393.49, last year it was \$15,838.94. Financial assistance has gotten off to a slow start, we anticipate that it will begin to pick-up in the near future.

DONATIONS TO NCEON

NCEON continues to be blessed by the generosity of many churches, organizations and loving people that support us both financially and with food donations. Our financial donations for January and February 2021 are 10K more than for the same period as in 2020.

NCEON SERVICES UPDATE

NCEON resumed financial assistance for our community on January 18, 2021 on Monday's and Wednesday's, beginning on February 5 we opened on Fridays as well. Financial assistance interviews are set-up by prior appointment and the interview process is handled by telephone in order to practice a no-contact environment for the safety of both our volunteers and clients. **Appointments are made by contacting NCEON at 410-766-1826.**

During the month of February NCEON was open on Tuesdays for food assistance during the hours of 10:00 to 1:00 PM.

NCEON UPDATES

Both Jan Murphy, NCEON President and Dianne Tabor, NCEON Treasurer have decided that they wish to continue their volunteer service at NCEON and will be seeking reelection of their current offices in 2022. Also, Bill Roesler would like to run for the office of President and Kathy Grimes, a current NCEON volunteer wishes to run for Treasurer in 2022.

BY-LAWS AND AUDITS

NCEON has formed a committee to review and update our current by-laws. Our plan is to share a first draft with the Board Members at our next quarterly board meeting on April 21st and vote on the changes at the July 21st Board meeting. We are also looking for an attorney to review the by-laws to make sure our business practices are in legal compliance. If anyone knows of an attorney that could help us and might be willing to work for us pro-bono, please let us know. We also want to consult with a CPA for audit purposes and to ensure financial compliance and responsibility to our partnership donors.
