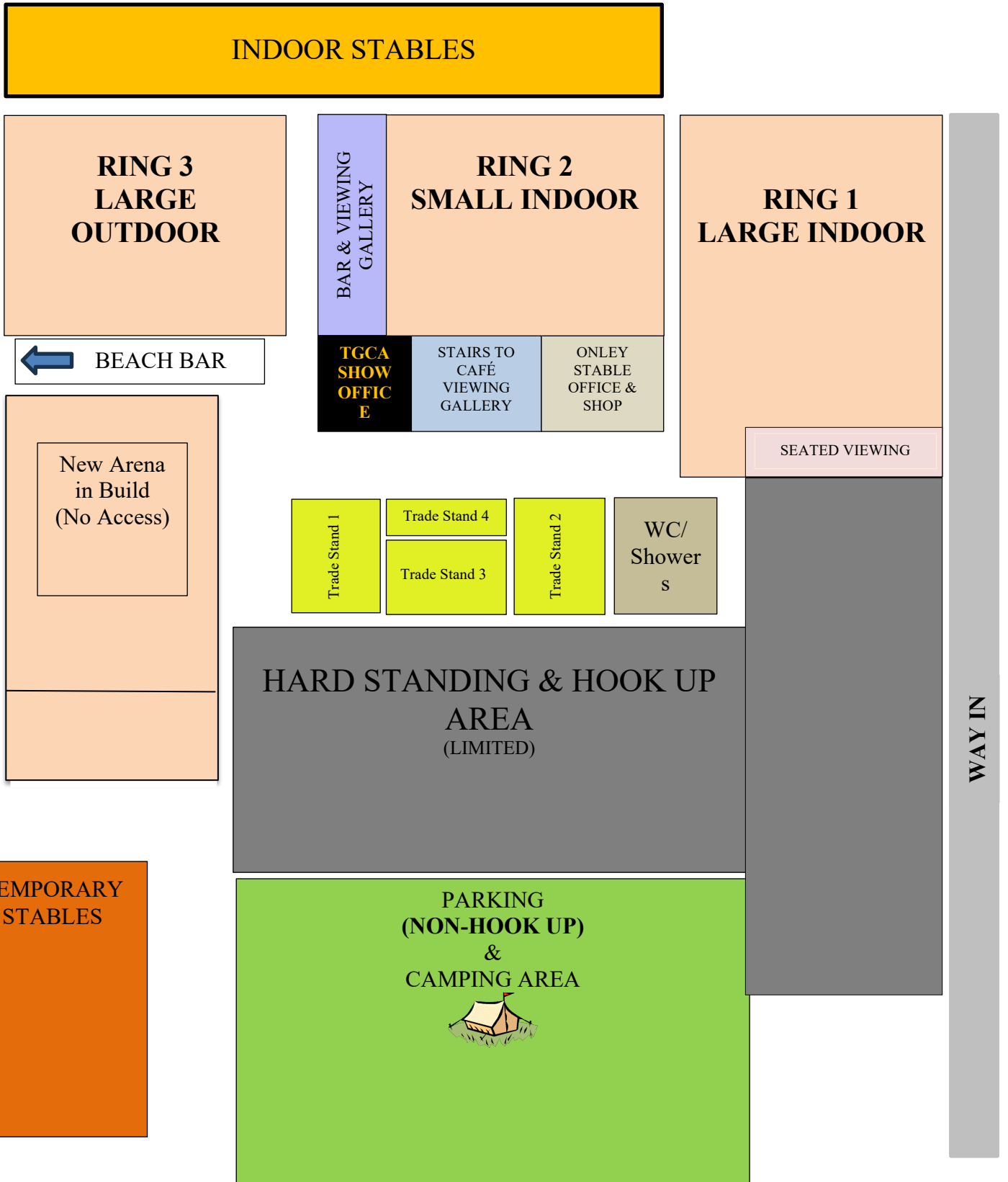

- ❖ Owner/rider/handler does not derive their main income from working with horses/ponies(including benefits, goods in kind).

This does not exclude Grass Roots competitors from having lessons, clinics, etc., at any time with an instructor, providing the horse/pony remains stabled at home (or as a DIY Livery).

It should be noted that professional showing producers are NOT allowed into the competition ring/arena to groom for or strip any horse/pony competing within a Home Produced class/section/final or championship nor must they prepare the horse/pony on a showground, ride them or work them in ready for competing.

Before making any entries, you are required to read the Rules and Regulations (inc the Members' Handbook) of TGCA and of this Show - all entries, howsoever made, are made in accordance with these rules/regulations and are deemed as acceptance of them. By entering this event: You (and all related parties, e.g. grooms, helpers, members of the public attending with or to watch you, etc) agree in all respects to comply with and be bound by these Rules & Regulations; and acknowledge that the organisers of TGCA have no liability to you for any accident, injury, damage, illness, disease or other loss occurring to your property and/or animals and shall only have liability to you for personal injury or death to the extent caused by or contributed to by their negligence. Additionally, you shall be responsible to the Organising Team of/and TGCA, for losses suffered by them to the extent that it arises from, or is contributed to in any way, by any act, neglect, or omission by you or by any person for whom or of any animal for which you are responsible; and that you have in place adequate, sufficient third party insurance cover for the participation at a TGCA Show. By entering this event you also agree to your details being used in conjunction with any TGCA Show, Qualifier/Finals class or within the Society's own publications either digitally or in printed format. You should also understand that your details will be stored on the TGCA system/entry system. Child/Vulnerable Adult and Media guidelines are as published on www.tgca.co.uk

ALL CLASSES are run in accordance with guidelines in current TGCA Members' Handbook plus all relevant subsequent amendments, and the Rules in this Schedule.

1. The ruling of Judges/Officials is Final. TGCA reserves the right to substitute judges as necessary.
2. Full and correct attire must be worn by all competitors and their grooms. Hard hats must be worn whilst mounted on any part of the Showground. Grooms must wear suitable hats whilst attending in the Ring. All Junior Exhibitors (18yrs and under at 1st January of current year) MUST wear correctly fitting CURRENT safety standard hats whilst mounted.
3. All ages are taken to be as of 1st January of the current year.
4. The Organisers reserve the right to amalgamate classes or to alter any class/ring without explanation.
5. All dogs must be kept on leads at all times and all mess cleared up.
6. Neither the Organisers, Landowners, Committee or Agents of the Society accept liability for any accident, loss, damage, injury or illness to horses, owners, riders, spectators, land or any person or property whatsoever, whether caused by negligence, breach of contract or in any way whatsoever.
7. TGCA judges must not knowingly Judge any horse/pony that is or has been owned, bred, produced or exhibited by themselves or immediate family or business partner. (Immediate family - grandparents, parents/parents' partners, husband/wife and partners, brothers and sisters, sons/daughters, step grandparents, stepparents, stepbrother/sister, legal guardians, father-/mother-/sister- and/or brothers-in-law). No horse/pony under the age of 4 years old may be ridden on the showground. No galloping allowed on the showground except as required by the Judge.
8. Any person participating in any way at this Show who conducts themselves in a manner which might bring the Society into disrepute will be asked to leave the Showground; may be subject to disciplinary proceedings and/or membership may be revoked.
9. Exhibitors shall take good care of and shall not cause any damage or suffer any damage to be done to the site/showground or to any furniture, fittings, equipment, stables or other property therein and shall be responsible to pay for any damage thereby (including accidental damage) caused by an act of neglect or in use.
10. Trophies: All named Trophies are Perpetual Trophies and must be returned in same condition they were awarded in, one month before the following year's Championship Show. Failure to do so will result in the implementation of a fine and names posted on website & Social Media. Please return trophies to TGCA UK Ltd, Po Box 1120, CT1 9UL to arrive BEFORE 1st July of current year.
11. Stallions: Where stallions are eligible to enter must be TGCA Graded and TGCA Stallion Disc(s) must be worn in the ring.
12. All exhibits must be registered with TGCA. Owners/exhibitors must be paid-up current Showing Members of TGCA. Where height limits are stated, these are taken to be AT MATURITY in all cases.
13. ENTRIES: No entries accepted without correct fees including compulsory First Aid contribution. Postal & On-line Entries closing date as stated on Entry Form/On-line system. Entries after this date to be made AT THE SHOW at surcharged fees. See Entry Fees on Entry Form for details. All entries on Show Days MUST be paid in CASH, NO CHEQUES on show days. No late or show-day entries for Dressage or Breed Evaluations. Performance Evaluations entries MAY be taken if entries limit has not been reached).
14. The stabling of horses or ponies in trailers or horseboxes/lorries overnight is NOT permitted. Stables must be left clean and mucked out. No responsibility will be accepted by this Society nor its representatives for any items of tack, grooming kit, clothing, horses or ponies etc left in stable area or whilst at the show.
15. PRIZE MONEY: All prize-monies MUST be collected by 10am the following morning from Show Office; no prize money posted out after the Show; uncollected monies; without exception, are deemed a donation to the Show.
16. Refunds: A 50% (only) refund will be granted on entries where a valid veterinary or doctor's certificate is received within 7 (seven) days of the date of Show.
17. Dope Testing: May take place at this Show under the guidelines set down in the current TGCA Members' Handbook.
18. Objections: Any objection must be made in writing, by a current TGCA Member, within 30 minutes of alleged offence and accompanied by £50 cash deposit, refundable if objection is upheld.
19. EVENING DRESS: Where Evening Dress is requested this is taken to be: IN-HAND - Gents, dark suit, bow tie; Ladies, dark suit, black/blue trousers/skirt and suitable top, suitable shoes. RIDDEN - Blue or black jackets, stock, top hat/hunting cap (adults only). Juniors to wear correctly fastened current safety standard hats.
20. Finals Classes requires pre-qualification to enter. Entries will NOT be accepted without quoting affiliated show number for Show at which qualification was gained (these can be found on TGCA website alongside the relevant show in the list of Affiliated Shows), and TGCA Qualification Card - (Card MUST be produced at the Show when requested by Show Secretary to validate entry).
21. Where a class is intended for Home Produced any breaches of these rules will be taken seriously and may result in disqualification from future classes.

COLOURED HORSE & PONY OF THE YEAR SPONSORED BY CHAPS UK

This competition is open to mares, geldings, and CHAPS (UK) graded stallions are permitted, excluding in Section A. Ponies must be four years old or over, to be registered in, and complying with the showing requirements of, the main body of the stud books of the Coloured Horse and Pony Society CHAPS (UK) or the Traditional Gypsy Cob Association (TGCA). Stallions are required to wear stallion discs in order to compete.

All Riders and owners must be Members of the Coloured Horse and Pony Society, The Showing Register or the Traditional Gypsy Cob Association.

Exhibitors are required by DEFRA to carry with them Official Identity Documents for all horses/ponies when competing or travelling. Competitors are reminded that it is a DEFRA requirement that the Official Identity Documents must be in the name of the legal owner within 30 days of ownership. This must be registered with the breed society, relevant studbook or ID issuing agency, dependent on breed/type of animal. Spot checks may be carried out at qualifying shows and by breed societies.

This class will be divided into two sections:

Section D Ridden Native/Cob/Traditional Ponies up to and including 148cm.
Section E Ridden Native/Cob/Traditional Horses exceeding 148cm.

These classes will be run in accordance with the general rules as set out in the Horse of the Year Show rulebook, a copy of which can be downloaded from www.hoys.co.uk.

This is a Horse of the Year Show Qualifier, all data given upon entry of this class is provided to Grandstand Media Limited and stored on the Grandstand Entries System. For full policy details please visit www.grandstandentries.com.

Marks will be awarded in the following way:

Ride/Performance	50 Marks Maximum
Movement & Quality	Conformation, 50 Marks Maximum

In the case of equality, the horse with the highest Ride/Performance mark will be deemed the winner. If there is still equality at this point, then the judges' decision will be final.

This class is a qualifying class for Horse of the Year Show, NEC, Birmingham, 7th-11th - October 2026. Qualification will not pass below 5th place. Qualification will be verified by the Horse of the Year Show office.

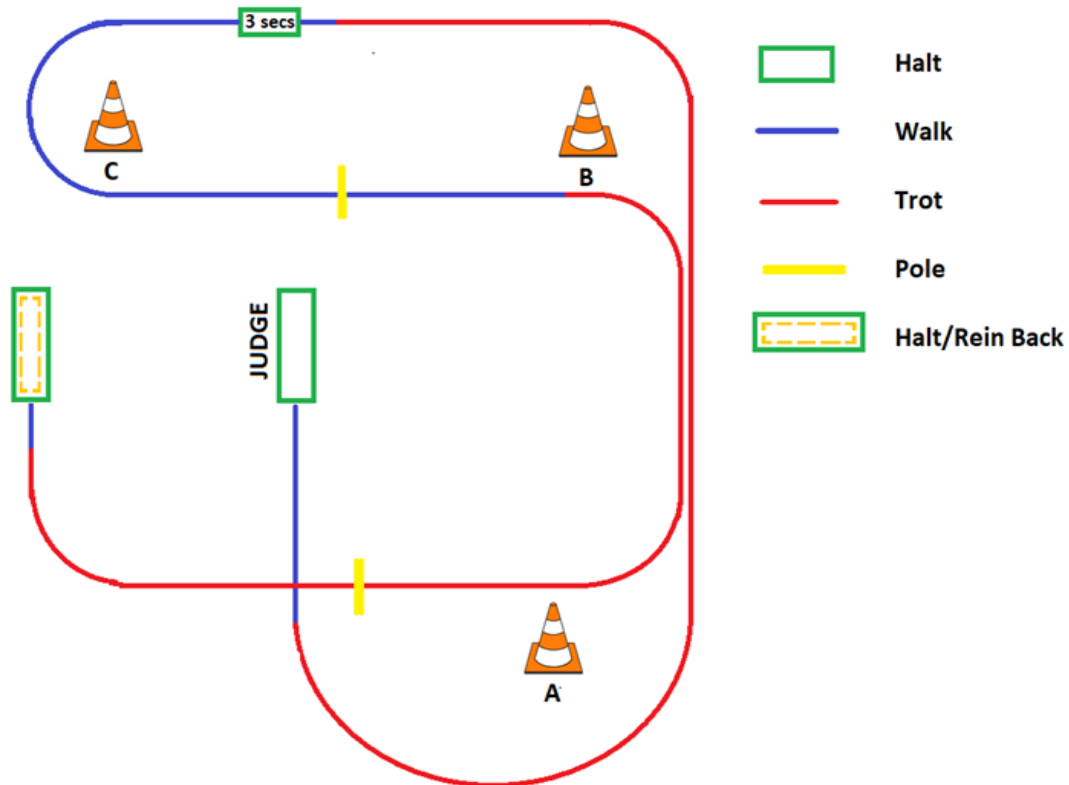

11. Track right before 'Cone A' around and over ground pole
12. Commence walk 3 strides prior to poles
13. Halt between the poles
14. Rein back 3 steps
15. Halt and Salute
