





- Any person participating in any way or who conducts themselves in a manner that might bring the Association into disrepute will be asked to leave the showground and may be subject to disciplinary action.
- Neither the organisers, Landowners, Committee or Agents of the TGCA accept liability for any accident, loss, damage, injury or illness to horses, owners, riders, spectators, land or any person or property whatsoever, whether caused by negligence, breach of contract or in any way whatsoever

RESTRICTED RIDDEN CLASSES:

Open to exhibits 4 years and over, not to have qualified for HOYS, RIHS or been placed 1st – 3rd in any TOYS Finals in the previous year.

Should a qualification for either HOYS or RIHS before the relevant years TGCA Championship Show (TOYS) be obtained, then qualification for the Restricted Ridden Final will be forfeited.

JUNIOR COMPETITORS: (under 18 as of 1st January in current year):

- Ridden classes Snaffle bridles only may be used (TOYS Qualifiers & TOYS National Show Junior Classes)
- Riding hat or skull cap correctly done up and complying to the latest hat rules must be worn.
- Spurs must not be worn by junior riders (under 18 as of 1st January in current year) or any rider of an exhibit 148cm and under. In mixed height classes no competitor may wear spurs.

Failure to comply with any of the above ruling will result in elimination from class/show.

HOME PRODUCED

- Competitors are the riders/handlers of the Horse/Pony on a full-time/daily basis.
- Open to horses and ponies that have been stabled at home (without any paid assistance) or kept at livery on a DIY basis in the previous or current year. Horses/ponies must not have been shown or trained by a professional Producer or kept at full livery at any time during this period (except for service in the case of Brood Mares).
- Riders/handlers must NOT have shown any equine produced by a professional producer/trainer/groom at any show since 1st January of the current season or previous season, NOR may any equine be shown by a rider/handler who has shown for a professional producer/trainer/groom at any show since 1st January of the current season or previous season.
- Owner/rider/handler does not show a horse/pony owned or sponsored by a company or Professional Owner/Producer of Show horses.
- Horse/Pony not to have been shown at Horse of Year Show by a Professional Producer.
- Owner/rider/handler does not derive their main income from working with horses/ponies(including benefits, goods in kind)

This does not exclude Home Produced competitors from having lessons, clinics, etc., at any time with an instructor, providing the horse/pony remains stabled at home (or as a DIY Livery).

It should be noted that professional showing producers are NOT allowed into the competition ring/arena to groom for or strip any horse/pony competing within a Home Produced class/section/final or championship nor must they prepare the horse/pony on a showground, ride them or work them in ready for competing.

The TGCA takes very seriously the spirit of these Home Produced conditions any member found to be contravening them may be subject to exclusion from the society with immediate effect. If you are in any doubt about your status please ask the office for guidance, the decision of The TGCA on eligibility will be final.

GRASS ROOTS:

- Competitors are the riders/handlers of the Horse/Pony on a full-time/daily basis.
- Open to horses and ponies that have been stabled at home (without any paid assistance) or kept at livery on a DIY basis in the previous or current year. Horses/ponies must not have been shown or trained by a professional Producer or kept at full livery at any time during this period (except for service in the case of Brood Mares).
- Riders/handlers must NOT have shown any equine produced by a professional producer/trainer/groom at any show since 1st January of the current season or previous season, NOR may any equine be shown by a rider/handler who has shown for a professional producer/trainer/groom at any show since 1st January of the current season or previous season.
- Owner/rider/handler does not show a horse/pony owned or sponsored by a company or Professional Owner/Producer of Show horses.
- Owner/rider/handler is not in receipt of any kind of payment, whether monetary, goods in kind or brand discount/ambassador.
- Horse/Pony not to have been shown at Horse of Year Show/Royal International by a Professional Producer.
- Owner/rider/handler must not judge/have judged in any capacity whatsoever whether as a panel judge or otherwise.
- Owner/rider/handler does not derive their main income from working with horses/ponies(including benefits, goods in kind).

This does not exclude Grass Roots competitors from having lessons, clinics, etc., at any time with an instructor, providing the horse/pony remains stabled at home (or as a DIY Livery).

It should be noted that professional showing producers are NOT allowed into the competition ring/arena to groom for or strip any horse/pony competing within a Home Produced class/section/final or championship nor must they prepare the horse/pony on a showground, ride them or work them in ready for competing.

The TGCA takes very seriously the spirit of these Grass Roots conditions any member found to be contravening them may be subject to exclusion from the society with immediate effect. If you are in any doubt about your status please ask the office for guidance, the decision of The TGCA on eligibility will be final.

Exhibitors are reminded to consider clashing of either horse/pony or rider/handler BEFORE entering. NO REFUNDS WILL BE MADE FOR ANY MISSED OR CLASHING CLASSES.

Every effort has been made to avoid classes clashing, but if an exhibitor finds their classes clashing, it is suggested permission be obtained from the Steward and Judge to give individual shows, ridden or in-hand, early in classes and then move to other ring. However, exhibits will not be placed unless they (or a representative) are present for final presentation of awards. Classes will not be held for missing competitors.

- Full and correct attire must be worn by all competitors and their grooms. Hard hats must be worn whilst mounted on any part of the Showground. Grooms must wear suitable hats whilst attending in the Ring. All Junior Exhibitors (18yrs and under at 1st January of current year) MUST wear correctly fitting CURRENT safety standard hats whilst mounted.
- 3. All ages are taken to be as of 1st January of the current year.
- 4. The Organisers reserve the right to amalgamate classes or to alter any class/ring without explanation.
- 5. All dogs must be kept on leads at all times and all mess cleared up.
- 6. Neither the Organisers, Landowners, Committee or Agents of the Society accept liability for any accident, loss, damage, injury or illness to horses, owners, riders, spectators, land or any person or property whatsoever, whether caused by negligence, breach of contract or in any way whatsoever.
- 7. TGCA judges must not knowingly Judge any horse/pony that is or has been owned, bred, produced or exhibited by themselves or immediate family or business partner. (Immediate family grandparents, parents/parents' partners, husband/wife and partners, brothers and sisters, sons/daughters, step grandparents, stepparents, stepbrother/sister, legal guardians, father-/mother-/sister- and/or brothers-in-law). No horse/pony under the age of 4 years old may be ridden on the showground. No galloping allowed on the showground except as required by the Judge.
- 8. Any person participating in any way at this Show who conducts themselves in a manner which might bring the Society into disrepute will be asked to leave the Showground; may be subject to disciplinary proceedings and/or membership may be revoked.
- 9. Exhibitors shall take good care of and shall not cause any damage or suffer any damage to be done to the site/showground or to any furniture, fittings, equipment, stables or other property therein and shall be responsible to pay for any damage thereby (including accidental damage) caused by an act of neglect or in use.
- 10. Trophies: All named Trophies are Perpetual Trophies and must be returned in same condition they were awarded in, one month before the following year's Championship Show. - 11. Stallions: Where stallions are eligible to enter must be TGCA Graded and TGCA Stallion Disc(s) must be worn in the ring.
- 12. All exhibits must be registered with TGCA. Owners/exhibitors must be paid-up current Showing Members of TGCA. Where height limits are stated, these are taken to be AT MATURITY in all cases.
- 13. ENTRIES: No entries accepted without correct fees including compulsory First Aid contribution. Postal & On-line Entries closing date as stated on Entry Form/On-line system. Entries after this date to be made AT THE SHOW at surcharged fees. See Entry Fees on Entry Form for details. All entries on Show Days MUST be paid in CASH, NO CHEQUES on show days. No late or show-day entries for Dressage or Breed Evaluations. Performance Evaluations entries MAY be taken if entries limit has not been reached).

- 21. Finals Classes requires pre-qualification to enter. Entries will NOT be accepted without quoting affiliated show number for Show at which qualification was gained (these can be found on TGCA website alongside the relevant show in the list of Affiliated Shows), and TGCA Qualification Card (Card MUST be produced at the Show when requested by Show Secretary to validate entry).
- 22. Where a class is intended for Home Produced any breaches of these rules will be taken seriously and may result in disqualification from future classes.

COLOURED HORSE & PONY OF THE YEAR SPONSORED BY CHAPS (UK)

This competition is open to mares, geldings, and CHAPS (UK) graded stallions are permitted. Ponies must be four years old or over, to be registered in, and complying with the showing requirements of, the main body of the stud books of the Coloured Horse and Pony Society CHAPS (UK) or the Traditional Gypsy Cob Association (TGCA). Stallions are required to wear stallion discs in order to compete.

All Riders and owners must be Members of the Coloured Horse and Pony Society, The Showing Register or the Traditional Gypsy Cob Association.

Exhibitors are required by DEFRA to carry with them Official Identity Documents for all horses/ponies when competing or travelling. Competitors are reminded that it is a DEFRA requirement that the Official Identity Documents must be in the name of the legal owner within 30 days of ownership. This must be registered with the breed society, relevant studbook or ID issuing agency, dependant on breed/type of animal. Spot checks may be carried out at qualifying shows and by breed societies.

This class will be divided into two sections:

100A Ridden Native/Cob/Traditional Ponies up to and including 148cm sponsored by CHAPS (UK)/ The White Crow.

100B Ridden Native/Cob/Traditional Horses exceeding 148cm sponsored by CHAPS (UK)/ EJL Stud and Livery.

Please note that at Horse of the Year Show, ponies must not compete in both the Junior Coloured Ridden Pony of the Year and the Coloured Ridden Pony of the Year classes. The pony will compete in the class in which it qualifies first during the season. Riders and ponies may compete in both section A, section B and section D at HOYS qualifiers. Once a pony has qualified in either section A, section B or section D, it will no longer be eligible to compete in the section in which it has not qualified.

These classes will be run in accordance with the general rules as set out in the Horse of the Year Show rulebook, a copy of which can be downloaded from www.hovs.co.uk.

This is a Horse of the Year Show Qualifier, all data given upon entry of this class is provided to Grandstand Media Limited and stored on the Grandstand Entries System. For full policy details please visit www.grandstandentries.com.

Marks will be awarded in the following way:

Ride/Performance 50 Marks Maximum

Conformation, Movement & Quality 50 Marks Maximum

In the case of equality, the horse with the highest Ride/Performance mark will be deemed the winner. If there is still equality at this point, then the judges' decision will be final.

This class is a qualifying class for Horse of the Year Show, NEC, Birmingham, 9th- 13th October 2024. Qualification will not pass below 5th place. Qualification will be verified by the Horse of the Year Show office.


