

Hopefully you got over to Jim Hodde's house after the April meeting to see the last run on the Cincinnati Central. Jim wasted little time in starting the dismantling operation. I think some of the locomotives were still warm when a couple of the bridges were being removed. A couple of Friday evening work sessions later and the layout was pretty much gone. The entire river section came out in 2 pieces, and even made it up the steps and out to the garage without damage to the house or the scenery. A coalmine module was also removed for incorporation into another layout. Even the puffball trees were being harvested for replanting. In addition to the scenery, a lot of Cincinnati Central locomotives were saved from retirement.

Bruce De Young had an interesting column in the May / June issue of the NMRA e-Bulletin urging divisions to get involved with the Boy Scout's Model Railroad merit badge program. As you know, Division 7 is already involved with this scout program through our Community Involvement activities. Jim MacKnight and Dick White started this program several years ago. Recently, Tom Bredestege, Steve Dishion, Dick White, Anton Zillich and Jim MacKnight worked with the scouts at Fairfield HS, while Tom Brueggeman, Charlie McKay and Frank Fieler were at Sycamore HS. Anthony Zillich, Sam Swanson and Pat Homan presented clinics during the scouts visit to the Cincinnati Model Railway Club's O-scale layout. Thanks to all of these people and to the folks at the O-Scale group for donating their time to this activity.

While you were at the spring flea market, you may have noticed the new tabletop membership booth. Bill Edwards had acquired the display from a neighbor and he then donated it to the division. The new booth needs just one container to transport it and can be setup in less than 5 minutes. The old booth we had been using for many years needed 3 large containers for transportation and 20 to 30 minutes for setup. At the March BOD meeting, we decided to offer the old booth to other divisions in the MCR. Well, the old booth has found a new home with Division 6 in Columbus. Bob Lee and Bill Connell came down a couple of weeks ago to get the booth, freeing up some space in the division storage locker.

Since the National Convention will be in our region this year, there will not be an MCR Regional Convention in 2014. There will be an MCR membership meeting at the Marion, Ohio Union Station on Saturday, June 14th. Division 6 will be holding their "Trainfest" that day with lots of clinics and other activities. Closer to home, the next Division 7 BOD meeting will be on Friday, June 6th at the Good Shepherd Lutheran Church in Kenwood. One of the items on the agenda will be the advertising for the CMTS show in October.

Last month I discussed the importance of raising our attendance figures at the CMTS. This year, we will be looking at some new advertising options. These include ads in the local papers in Butler and Warren counties, and doing a targeted postcard campaign for selected areas of Butler and / or Warren counties. The intent of these methods will be to reach the families residing close to the location of the show at Lakota West. Rick Crumrine will present a proposal at the June BOD meeting showing the costs of the various options.

Well, that's all I have for this month. I hope to see you at one of the upcoming events. Let's see, there is the bus trip on May 31^{st} , a BOD meeting on June 6^{th} , Division 7 meeting on June 8^{th} , and then the MCR membership meeting / trainfest on June 14^{th} . SECOND SECTION

There was no May regular meeting. Instead, we had our annual bus tour. But as I write this article, that is still a week away. However mid-May has also meant it was annual N Scale Weekend time in Columbus. For the past six years, Central Ohio N-Trak has hosted a meeting of N scalers that draws clubs from the East coast to the upper Midwest. So I am recovering from a long weekend of hard work and concentrated model railroading as I anticipate the Louisville Express bus tour and then getting back to the schedule of Division 7 events.

In June, our meeting will be on Sunday June 8th at the Anderson Senior Center. Our clinic will be a program presented by Ed Swain, talking about the Pennsylvania Railroad in Dennison, Ohio. After the meeting, we will be visiting the layouts of John Listermann and Bob Shaw. The model contest in June is for on-line thin-line structures. The photo contest theme is switch machines.

The following weekend is the Mid-Central Region Membership meeting in Marion Ohio on Saturday June 14th. This event is in lieu of a regional convention this year (due to the NMRA National convention being in the region). This event is open to all regional members. Marion station is a great train watching location with busy CSX and NS lines. In addition to the train watching, there will be clinics, a model contest, a brief general membership meeting, the regional BOD meeting, and a joint Division 6 and Division 9 meeting. Even if you are going to Cleveland, you may want to include this regional event in your travel plans.

Looking ahead, in July we will be meeting on the <u>first</u> Sunday - July 6th - instead of the usual second Sunday, because the NMRA National Convention in Cleveland begins on the 13th. The July meeting will be held at the St. Mathias Catholic Church in Forest Park. Our clinician for July is Phil Gliebe. He will be presenting a clinic on kitbashing HOn30 motive power. The monthly model contest will be for servicing facilities, and the photo contest will be for railroad structures. Afterwards, for the layout visits, we will be returning to Bill Doll's and John Miller's layouts in Colerain Township; and Jim Bonnett's layout in Liberty Township. Like Jim Hodde in April, Jim Bonnett's open house will be the final run for his Kettle Valley Railroad, as he will be tearing it down. This layout was featured in the August 2012 Model Railroader, so you'll want to get a last look. Jim tells me everything will be for sale, but nothing will be removed until we get to see it.

In August, we will meet in Kenwood, at the Good Shepherd Lutheran Church. Our clinician in August will be Mike Finkler, talking about Oil Refineries. The contest subjects are models of passenger cars and photos of railroad people. The layout visits will include Gerry Albers. In September, we will be in Northern Kentucky. Chuck Bogart from Lexington will be presenting on Street Cars and Interurbans of Kentucky.

Our 2014 Division 7 car project, Virginia & Ohio USRA 2-bay hopper, by Accurail, in four numbers, are priced at \$18 for singles and \$70 for a four-car set plus Ohio tax, They will be for sale at our June meeting and afterwards through our company store. We have already sold 66 cars through May 23rd, mostly via mail order sales. Division 7 members have only purchased 23 cars so far. Please take out your wallet or write a check and support your division's car projects. The announcement and photo are on page 49 of the June issue of the NMRA Magazine. The did a great job of getting our publicity out quickly.

Our 2013 Division 7 car project, Merchants Dispatch Transportation's 40' ice reefer by Accurail in wood or all-steel versions, is offered in two numbers for each type of reefer and priced at \$18 for singles and \$70 for a four-car set plus Ohio tax. We have sold 331 cars during the first 11 months and have 171 car kits available. We broke even on these cars in February, 2014.

Our 2012 car project, Allegheny Midland 41'-6" steel gondola by Accurail is offered in three numbers. They are priced at \$18 for singles and \$51 for a three-car set plus Ohio tax. We have sold 244 cars during the first 23 months. We have 142 car kits available. We broke even on these cars in December, 2013.






Bob Immscher's animated three rail O gauge layout








