# HEADLIGHTS

Well, here it is: my first column as Superintendent. As the Assistant Superintendent, my job was to set up the meeting locations, clinicians, and layout visits, so the subjects of the Second Section articles were always easy: What did we do and what will we do. As Superintendent, while my articles will touch on the activities of the past meeting, I'll leave the discussion of upcoming meetings to John Shields, our new Assistant Superintendent. I mentioned to Randy Kerka recently that I was going to start a list of "column starters". He just smiled and mumbled something about a "grasshopper".

I'll start by thanking Randy for the great job he did over the past 4 years as Superintendent. He has led our division through several changes to our operating procedures and has worked tirelessly at attracting new members into the NMRA and making the Fall Shows better. He was very helpful to me as I was learning the ropes of the Assistant Super position. He was very eager to show me how to operate all the audio / visual equipment he then gleefully loaded into my car. Congratulations, Randy. You done good. Enjoy the view of the meeting from the audience side.

I'm looking forward to working with the Board of Directors and the other members of the executive board: John Shields, Bruce Knapp, and Laddie Henninger. John has done an excellent job over the past four years as Secretary and should be just as good in his new role as Assistant Super. I must admit, as I was unloading the audio / visual equipment at John's house several nights ago, I knew how Randy felt four years earlier. Bruce Knapp has served as Division 7 secretary in the past, so I have no doubt he will do an excellent job again. Laddie has been keeping a close watch over our finances for the past 2 years, so I am confident we are in good hands there. I ask that discussions of division policies be held during the quarterly BOD meetings or directly with the executive officers, rather than during the monthly membership meetings.

At the December Division 7 BOD meeting, we reviewed the proposed budget for 2014. While it is true the division has reserve funds, we do work to a balanced budget each year. While reviewing the budgets for the year, we identified some areas where we could reduce expenses. One of those was the money spent on plaques and awards during the year. For our monthly contests, plaques were being awarded for overall first, second, and third place finishers in both model and photo categories, as well as top finishers in the combined points total. Plagues are also awarded to overall winners in the junior contest categories. By contrast, the Achievement Program certificates issued by the National office are simpler framed printed certificates and represent a much higher level of effort to earn. We felt that by switching our local contest awards from plaques to simple framed awards, we could reduce our costs while still recognizing the contest results of our local members. This change would have been effective with the overall contest awards for the 2013 contest schedule, which actually finished at the January meeting. Contest chair Jack Laubisch disagreed with this decision. Prior to the start of the January meeting, Superintendent Kerka informed Jack that we would still fund a complete set of plaques for the 2013 contest, but we would move to the simpler awards for the 2014 contest. During the meeting, Jack submitted a letter resigning as the Monthly Contest chair. Brad Jonas had been assisting Jack with the contest and has agreed to take over as the Monthly Contest chair. Brad's comrade in logging Mike Tener will be helping Brad as needed. Brad and I will review the current costs for the plaques and reach a consensus on the best combination of plaques and certificates for the 2014 contests and beyond.

The January meeting was well attended, with several spouses in attendance. Randy Kerka presided over the last business meeting of his term of office then turned the division gavel over to me. Funny, he seemed to have that same gleeful look on his face as he did 4 years ago.

The Burchnall / Jarman travel agency has put together another bus excursion that's sure to be an enjoyable trip. Be sure to check out the info flyer elsewhere in this issue of the Oil Can. I have been on several of their trips and it's always a great time. Seating is limited so don't delay reserving your seat.

Next month's meeting is on February 9<sup>th</sup> at St. Susanna church in Mason. I'm looking forward to Michael York's presentation on 3D Printing.





### William Edwards, Esq.


