

Locomotives are probably a main focus 100% of the time.... Freight and passenger cars.... Redi built/kits/scratch in every facet....Scenery is very broad....Scene details, figures, artistic painting of everything.... Photography.... Regional shows....

### BUT, THIS LIST and MORE ARE ALL ENHANCED BY STRUCTURES!!!

I believe that I can introduce you to the importance of utilizing structures to enhance your layout. Choose from ready built, kits, or kit bashed structures. All railroads become real with attention to the structures especially when they are built on scenic bases. This is true, even on the smallest structures similar to the outhouses you may have seen peddled occasionally at Division 7 shows.

- 1. First, choose an era for your railroad. That determines choices for almost every category listed above. There are many modelers who choose to "freelance everything". All of these choices will be a good guide.
- 2. Next choose the "scene" in which each structure will be a part of. This means rail yard, small towns, city, rural, or others.
- 3. Learn about suppliers, available materials, kits, and more.

## Introducing the Cincinnati Division 7 Groups.io Discussion Group/Forum.

### What is it?

Groups.io was introduced in 2014.

Some of you may already be aware of "Groups.io" and are using it. I belong to the "HO Swap" group (and many others) which is a place for people to buy and sell model railroad stuff. It's way better than eBay because there are no fees. But I digress...

It is basically an email list that facilitates communication within a group of people about a common interest. I think of it as a "push" communications tool since it sends an email to all members when something new is posted. Similar to email, but that requires the sender to have everyone's email address in their address book and then remembering to add EVERYBODY to that individual email. Groups.IO simplifies that task.

So, we've established a "Cincinnati Division 7 NMRA" group on that site whose purpose is to facilitate communication within Cincinnati Division 7 (NMRA, Mid-Central Region). Any member may post at any time. Posts must be relevant to the hobby of model railroading and/or the business of Cincinnati Division 7

### What is it for?

It can be used to post things like (but not limited to):

- \* Inviting people to an upcoming Op Session of yours
- \* Asking for help on a modeling issue you may have
- \* Sharing a modeling technique, tip or trick.
- \* Posting items for sale
- \* Sick call
- \* Notification of the death of a member
- \* Requesting help for an upcoming Division Train Show or Flea Market
- \* Coordinating car-pooling activities for an out-of-town event.

### Notification

After joining, you can choose how frequently you want to receive notifications of a post. Here are the possible options:

**Individual Messages:** Receive each message, as they are posted, in an individual email.

**Full Featured Digest:** Receive up to 12 messages grouped together in one email instead of receiving each message individually (rich text formatting).

**Plain Digest:** Receive up to 12 messages grouped together in one email instead of receiving each message individually (plain text formatting).

**Daily Summary:** Receive one email every morning that contains only a list of the topics posted to the group the previous day.

**Special Notices Only:** Receive only special notices sent by the moderators. (Go to the group's website to view other messages.)

I would recommend the "Full Featured Digest" to start with as I don't expect a significant amount of daily posts to the group and this way you will still be notified in a timely manner.

#### Joining

Groups.io is free for up to 100 people. After that they charge a fee. We've started with the Division 7 BOD and Committee heads. If this thing takes off and becomes popular, the BOD will reassess and determine if we want to subscribe for a monthly fee to accommodate the demand.

Anyone who wants to join the group can simply search on "groups io cincinnati nmra" and you will be taken to the front door. From there simply request membership and I will get notified. I will approve any Cincinnati Division 7 NMRA Member in good standing.

**NOTE:** All posts must be free of disrespectful, derogatory, and/or inflammatory language and/or false statements. Behavior here will be civil with constructive criticism being the standard.

Cincinnati Division 7's Car Project Committee is pleased to announce the availability of our latest, limited-edition car project!

Using Accurail's 2200 Series ACF 2-Bay Covered Hopper as the basis, we are offering it in a Norfolk & Western repaint scheme.

These cars are N&W class HC-46 and are from an original batch of fifty built in 1966 by ACF and were painted in the Round Herald paint scheme.

Sometime subsequent to that some cars went through a general maintenance program where they were repainted in the block N&W livery. Photos were found showing that at least three of these cars (road numbers 170753, 170768 and 170794) were reweighed at some later date because that area is "patched out" on the car with the new data displayed. Those same photos place these three cars as being in service in 1992 and 2004! It is these three, highly unique, road numbers that Cincinnati Division 7 is now offering for sale.

As with all Accurail cars, they are in kit form only.

Pricing is \$25 per car, or a 3-car set at \$70. Shipping (via USPS Priority) is \$9.20 for one car and \$16.25 for two to three cars.

Ohio residents, please add 7.8% sales tax on the total price of the kits and the shipping and handling fee.

Amtrak passes late at night, and may be seen by "re-winding" the video!










































# **LAYOUT VISIT to Ric Case's HO-Scale Layout**








