



Officer Nominations & Election Process

Cincinnati Division 7, MCR, NMRA

Per our Regulations, elections for our Superintendent and Assistant Superintendent occur in the second half of each odd-numbered year. The first step in this process has taken place, with the establishment of the 2025 Nominating Committee consisting of John Burchnall (Chair), Randy Kerka, and Merlyn Jarman. That committee has also appointed Bob Shreve as Teller.

Our Regulations provide four ways for members to be nominated for either of these offices –

- Members can proactively contact one of the Nominating Committee members and express interest in being a candidate
- The Nominating Committee deliberates, identifies and approaches prospects, and then publishes their initial slate in the October Oil Can
- Nominations may also be made by a petition signed by two members and submitted to the Nominating Committee before the end of the October membership meeting
- Nominations from the floor, if any, will be accepted during the October membership meeting

Each nominee must agree to being a candidate. All valid nominations from the last three steps are included in the ballot. The ballot and candidate-provided biographical sketches will be published in either the November Oil Can or on similar timing via a special mailing, emailing, electronic voting or other means.

The voting method will be determined by the BOD, with options including mailed or electronic ballots, printed ballots or a show-of-hands at the November membership meeting. Mailed or electronic ballots, if used, must be received by the Teller by the specified deadline, typically a few days before the end of November. The Teller will also accept physical ballots, if used, at the November membership meeting.

After the voting deadline, the Teller tallies the votes, notifies each candidate, and reports the results to the BOD at the December BOD meeting. Results are verbally reported at the December membership meeting and published in the January Oil Can. The newly elected officers take office at the end of the January membership meeting.

Introducing the Cincinnati Division 7 Groups.io Discussion Group/Forum.

What is it?

Groups.io was introduced in 2014.

Some of you may already be aware of "Groups.io" and are using it. I belong to the "HO Swap" group (and many others) which is a place for people to buy and sell model railroad stuff. It's way better than eBay because there are no fees. But I digress...

It is basically an email list that facilitates communication within a group of people about a common interest. I think of it as a "push" communications tool since it sends an email to all members when something new is posted. Similar to email, but that requires the sender to have everyone's email address in their address book and then remembering to add EVERYBODY to that individual email. Groups.IO simplifies that task.

So, we've established a "Cincinnati Division 7 NMRA" group on that site whose purpose is to facilitate communication within Cincinnati Division 7 (NMRA, Mid-Central Region). Any member may post at any time. Posts must be relevant to the hobby of model railroading and/or the business of Cincinnati Division 7

What is it for?

It can be used to post things like (but not limited to):

- * Inviting people to an upcoming Op Session of yours
- * Asking for help on a modeling issue you may have
- * Sharing a modeling technique, tip or trick.
- * Posting items for sale
- * Sick call
- * Notification of the death of a member
- * Requesting help for an upcoming Division Train Show or Flea Market
- * Coordinating car-pooling activities for an out-of-town event.

Notification

After joining, you can choose how frequently you want to receive notifications of a post. Here are the possible options:

Individual Messages: Receive each message, as they are posted, in an individual email.

Full Featured Digest: Receive up to 12 messages grouped together in one email instead of receiving each message individually (rich text formatting).

Plain Digest: Receive up to 12 messages grouped together in one email instead of receiving each message individually (plain text formatting).

Daily Summary: Receive one email every morning that contains only a list of the topics posted to the group the previous day.

Special Notices Only: Receive only special notices sent by the moderators. (Go to the group's website to view other messages.)

I would recommend the "Full Featured Digest" to start with as I don't expect a significant amount of daily posts to the group and this way you will still be notified in a timely manner.

Joining

Groups.io is free for up to 100 people. After that they charge a fee. We've started with the Division 7 BOD and Committee heads. If this thing takes off and becomes popular, the BOD will reassess and determine if we want to subscribe for a monthly fee to accommodate the demand.

Anyone who wants to join the group can simply search on "groups io cincinnati nmra" and you will be taken to the front door. From there simply request membership and I will get notified. I will approve any Cincinnati Division 7 NMRA Member in good standing.

NOTE: All posts must be free of disrespectful, derogatory, and/or inflammatory language and/or false statements. Behavior here will be civil with constructive criticism being the standard.



Modeling Engine Servicing Facilities – by Stephen Priest, MMR®

This clinic featured at Div 7's meeting on July 13 covers the processes of studying and building engine servicing facilities on a model railroad. Steven will share what should be included, what things are, how prototype facilities are designed and why, while using lots of great model and prototype photographs.





About Stephen Priest, MMR®

Stephen has always loved model railroading. He got his start with N scale in 1967, quickly moving up to a Lionel set his father purchased for him. This was later followed by a move to HO scale where Stephen has remained ever since.

In college, Stephen studied architecture and then engineering at Kansas State University and the University of Kansas before going to work for the Santa Fe (later BNSF) Railway. He has worked as a conductor, engineer, assistant trainmaster, trainmaster, and assistant manager of the Track Geometry Department (Engineering). As a college professor, he has taught conductor and engineer classes at the BNSF training facility in Kansas City.

Using his extensive knowledge and experience with the prototype, Stephen has designed hundreds of models for dozens of well-known manufacturers. His scale drafting work has been featured in many articles, magazines, and books. As a writer and publisher, Stephen has penned dozens of articles that have appeared in various model railroad magazines for more than 35 years. Stephen has been the editor of *Railroad Model Craftsman Magazine*, and *The NMRA Magazine* of the National Model Railroad Association and author of several books. He has also been on the publication teams responsible for *Railroads Illustrated, Model Railroad News*, and *Passenger Train Journal*. Along with his wife Cinthia he has written and edited 32 books on model railroading and its prototype. His most recent book, *Santa Fe Diesel Painting and Lettering for Model Railroaders*, was published for the Santa Fe Railway Historical & Modeling Society, of which he has been a member for years.

Stephen spearheaded the preservation and restoration of the Santa Fe Bi-Centennial SD45-2 5704 which is now complete and will soon be on display in Perris, California at the Southern California Railroad Museum. This beautifully restored locomotive took over a year to rework.

Stephen has built 16 fully completed model railroads with the last two being signaled with complete CTC panels. The last of these, The St. Louis Division was a 3400 sq ft layout built for the 2018 NMRA National Convention in Kansas City. Stephen was the Chair for that convention.

Stephen's latest foray into the model railroad hobby is a new company producing locomotives and rolling stock. *Classonemodelworks.com* was started in 2020 and has grown to a provide many models for discerning modelers.


