This roundtable will cover how I designed my model railroad using track charts, maps, railroad documents (such as timetables, CT 1000, and rule books), photos (from books, internet, historical societies, and private photo collections), blue prints, and drawings. Transferring the plan in drawing the track plan full size, along with using structure mock-ups, along with how the layout operates will also be covered.

#### MRR Program for the First Half of 2024

Bob Lawson, Roy Allan, Ed Swain, and John Listermann hosted sessions at their home. Photos and notes for the MRR gatherings follow.

Bob Lawson hosted the first roundtable of the year in February, where seven attendees discussed planning and building structures and scenes, and saw many examples of Bob's incredible modeling in his relatively new residential space. Bob took us through basic kit, advanced kit, and scratchbuilding approaches, with an emphasis on cost-conscious modeling within a limited budget. He also covered tools, adhesives, paints, and organization of parts, along with arranging scene details (including vehicles, people, and clutter), along with fabricating sturdy structure and diorama bases from insulation foam. Attendees appreciated the insight and wisdom, along observing the hundreds of model examples Bob had on display.

With several of the initial attendees, Bob has continued with weekly work sessions (where numerous techniques, from track work to structure and scene construction takes place routinely). Bob mentioned these weekly gatherings have renewed his enthusiasm for completing the many tasks he has underway on his vast layout.

## **Division 7 Car Project (Limited Edition!)**

Cincinnati Division 7's Car Project Committee is pleased to announce the availability of our latest, limited-edition car project!

Using Accurail's 2200 Series ACF 2-Bay Covered Hopper as the basis, we are offering it in a Norfolk & Western repaint scheme.

These cars are N&W class HC-46 and are from an original batch of fifty built in 1966 by ACF and were painted in the Round Herald paint scheme.

Sometime subsequent to that some cars went through a general maintenance program where they were repainted in the block N&W livery. Photos were found showing that at least three of these cars (road numbers 170753, 170768 and 170794) were reweighed at some later date because that area is "patched out" on the car with the new data displayed. Those same photos place these three cars as being in service in 1992 and 2004! It is these three, highly unique, road numbers that Cincinnati Division 7 is now offering for sale.

As with all Accurail cars, they are in kit form only.

Pricing is \$25 per car, or a 3-car set at \$70. Shipping (via USPS Priority) is \$9.20 for one car and \$16.25 for two to three cars.

Ohio residents, please add 7.8% sales tax on the total price of the kits and the shipping and handling fee.

I received these cars the week of 9/12. Heritage and purchasing details are posted on our Division 7 web site.

A review of the cars. They are \$35 each, or a set of two for \$65. Car numbers are 1968 and 2018, which was the year that the New Jersey Division was founded and the year we celebrated our 50th anniversary. The model is from Tangent Models and is a superb model or a 52'6" Riveted Drop End Gondola with 70 ton tracks. The placement of the brake wheel on the side is an identifying feature of a drop end Gondola. They're ready to run and come with Kadee couplers.


We acquired equal amounts of the two car numbers. Cash or check will consummate the deal and you'll be hauling stuff around your layout in no time!

These are excellent looking and beautifully running cars, but, a car not decorated for a prototypical railroad, they do have the look of a gondola that you might see in any train consist from the 1930's to the 1980's.

Limit of three (3) listings from same Seller at any one time.





## **Everyone's Help Needed - Fall Show Street Signs**

Our large corrugated plastic street signs are extremely important in informing everyone about our 56<sup>th</sup> Annual Fall Cincinnati Model Train Show on October 12-13, 2024. Besides word of mouth, this is the only way new general public attendees find out about our wonderful show. We'll be placing 200 signs this year and we need your help to do this. All the signs are 2 ft x 4 ft, each with 4 all-new straight metal wickets, and come with a small helpful instruction sheet.

We have 10 teams placing 6 to 8 signs each in specified zones within about 8 miles of Lakota West High School. Those areas include much of West Chester, Liberty Township, Fairfield, Hamilton, Mason, Springdale and Sharonville. We also have other members who place 1 to 3 signs elsewhere in our division. We need many more of you all around the division to step up and do likewise. It's very easy and quick to place 1 to 3 signs, no one has ever gotten in trouble doing so, and there are plenty of suitable locations out there.

We hope you'll agree to place one, two or more of these signs. To volunteer, all you need to do is see me at the Aug or Sept Division meetings, or email or phone me with your best phone number and how many signs you want. Your signs will be available at our Aug and Sept meetings, or by other arrangements with me. Here are some details —

- Place your signs between about Sat, Sept 21 and Sat, Sept 28
- Place signs in highly visible locations but very importantly <u>outside</u> of road right-of ways and <u>not at busy</u> <u>intersections</u> otherwise they could be removed by local authorities (and don't worry if they do)
- Best locations are vacant commercial lots, friendly businesses, schools, friends or neighbors, preferably in mulched or seldom mowed areas, or flush with fences or railings where mowing crews won't disturb them
- Use a hammer to pound the short end of the 4 wickets into the ground in a line, then place the sign base edge on the ground next to the wickets, mark where each wicket is, then slip the sign over each wicket into corrugations at the marked points (prevents split flutes), slide the sign down to within about 2 inches of the ground to resist wind make sure you use all 4 wickets per sign to also better resist high winds
- Remove your signs on either Sun night, Oct 13 or by Tue, Oct 15 we need to be good community stewards
- <u>Do not return the signs</u>, as we'll print new ones with new dates next year use them for your projects, recycle them or throw them away you can <u>return the metal wickets to me if they are clean and straight</u>

Also, at the Aug, Sept and Oct meetings, Rick Crumrine will have <u>flyers</u> for you to take and post. You can also download and print those flyers from the Events tab of our website. Post them in friendly schools, churches, places of work and businesses (barber shops, grocers, hardware stores ...). Finally, be sure to talk up this family fun Cincinnati Model Train Show with your neighbors, friends and family!

We thank you in advance for your help in this very important and easy to do matter! I look forward to your immediate reply via email or phone.




