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

# HEADLIGHTS

Our July meeting was in Mason. Thank you to Bruce Knapp for his clinic on upgrading vintage brass locomotives. Thank you as well to Bob Chapman and Bob Lawson for opening their home layouts for us to see. Three excellent answers to the question of why to join the NMRA and come to the monthly meetings. It's like a mini-convention every month and there is no additional fee beyond the National membership.

My club, the Queen City N-Gineers, is about to start construction on two new sections and I am looking forward to learning from this exercise. Historically, we have built our standard 3.5ft by 4ft modules with 1x4 wood framing and 3/8 inch or 1/2 inch plywood tops. Add in scenery, track, and a cover (another 3.5x4 piece of plywood (!) with 1x4 supports) and these get heavy and awkward enough that it generally takes two people to move them (probably one of the reasons that N Trak modules are smaller). This time, we are going to try a lighter weight approach. The framing will be metal studs and much of the tops will be foam (1/4-inch plywood or Luan only as track support – using the cookie cutter method). We've seen this approach a number of times, but now it's time to actually try it ourselves. We have a member who has done this on their home layout and now the rest of us can learn some new techniques.

For years, we have set up a rectangular layout, which required crawling under a section to get to the operating area on the inside. A few years ago we finally built a "door/gate" module as more of us found crawling in and out becoming harder to do than when we were all younger. A good solution, except that the rigidity requirements to make this opening section reliable also made it heavy. We built a "cart" with wheels for it, but there are still occasions when it is not as simple as just rolling it to where we need it.

Further, now that we have a permanent layout at our room at Ross, we had the same issue as with the original modular design – a rectangle requiring a crawl under. The gate solves the problem at Ross as well, but it means we have to take the gate in and out when we do shows. And there are limits to where we can set up our layout because of the rectangular design. About the smallest we can be is 15x22 ft. The solution we are working on is to build two return loop modules. This will allow us to have a "C"- shaped layout at Ross, where we can go around the walls and walk in to the center. At shows, we could actually set up in a straight line in a space only 7 or 8 feet wide (or an L or a C etc). Instead of four mainlines, we would have two mainlines in a dog-bone design. These return loops will be larger than one of our standard modules. Hence, the desire to try out a lighter weight construction technique.

As I said, this project is a chance to try new techniques and to continue to learn from our hobby. Sound familiar? If not, maybe it should. Very few people build only one layout. Even great operating sessions on a layout may eventually leave you less satisfied than you once were with the hobby. A solution is to look for chances to continue to do something new, to learn new things, to get out of your comfort zone and stretch yourself. You hear of people tearing down their layouts and starting over. Sometimes they change scales as well. If that sounds drastic, consider what projects you might still be able to do on your <u>current</u> layout, with a bias toward having to learn new skills to accomplish the change. Do you have mostly plastic structures made from kits (or even "built-ups)? Buy one of the high-end craftsman kits and learn how to assemble one of these. I'll bet when you are done you will find a place for it on the layout. You may have to modify some scenery to make it fit. Hmmmn – sounds like an opportunity to learn some new scenery techniques as well.

I hope to see you in Kenwood on August 19th. (Remember: it's not the usual second Sunday).



# **SECOND SECTION**

The July meeting was held at St. Susanna Church in Mason. Our clinician was Bruce Knapp demonstrating how to upgrade vintage brass. He inspired me to check out some of my old brass locos. I tried to follow his instructions explicitly. I didn't have a glass plate at hand to push the mechanism on, so I improvised. My Better Half gave me some curious looks as I ran a 4-6-0 up and down a living room window. As I tried to explain, she just shook her head and muttered "model railroaders are very 'special' folks". Just kidding, it was a 2-8-0.

Thanks to Bob Chapman and Bob Lawson for hosting our layout tours. It was my first look at Bob Chapman's and I look forward to returning for a lesson in operation. I have been to Bob Lawson's dozens of times and still discover something new each time. Amazing.

We had some very unique models and great photos in the contest, including Georgia Dahlberg's award winning dredger and a humongous water tank by Roy Allan.





I found the shop very easily and was surprised to find a very well stocked hobby shop. The shop had a very nice selection of vintage craftsman kits, and vintage rolling stock, all in several scales. I was also pleased to see a large selection of great modeling tools like Mascot and Zuron.

I was also given a tour of the workshop by Tom Wendt. There were several projects under way, two extremely nice Lionel 3-rail layouts, and two very intricate N scale layouts being combined into one layout. The workmanship on the projects was excellent; the owners should be very pleased with the final product. The shop was very well equipped and very clean. I left with the impression I visited a first-class operation. If you haven't been to American Eagle, it's well worth a trip to their Ludlow location. Besides they are adjacent to the Norfolk Southern Ludlow Yard, and the hobby shop is a trip back in time.

Speaking of custom layouts, my friend, Dan Miller, is producing copies of Lionel store display layouts, using authentic vintage Lionel trains, track, and accessories. I enjoyed looking at a layout he had started for a customer and was taken back to my early years in the hobby. It's great to see dedicated modelers keep our hobby's early traditions alive with their excellent recreations of the past.


