I know it costs too much to tear them down, so it makes sense they survive, but it is still jarring to see modern diesels pulling stack trains past these structures. If I modeled any period later than my actual late '50s target, I would certainly consider having one of these survivors on my layout. Walthers has the kits!

The final results on the Fall Train Show were presented and showed that we had attendance comparable to pre-covid shows and that meant we covered our expenses and helped with the on-going funding of our activities. Now we look forward to the Flea Market in March.

I'd like to thank Roy Hord for his presenting his informative clinic on "The Norfolk Southern Pocahontas Division". We paid our first layout visits to the homes of Bo Sis and new NMRA member Larry Goodridge. Larry, a veteran O-Gauger, has a permanent "high-rail" layout featuring several industries in his basement. He also has built several portable layouts, a western themed O-Gauge, two new ones in HO, plus a new Z scale pike. The latest HO layout was at our October show. The theme is WWII in France with many American military scenes and details. Bo's large fully scenicked HO layout is based on the PRR in Western Pa. 



Eastern Loggers Layout Moved to Pennsylvania Lumber Museum

After one and a half years of delays due to the pandemic, the Eastern Loggers 1920's Era HO/HOn3 Pennsylvania Logging Layout has been safely moved and set-up at the Pennsylvania Lumber Museum. Jerry Strangarity, Mike Tener and I, along with gracious heavy lifting and transport support from the museum staff and volunteers, accomplished this feat in early November.

This is a big milestone and a most appropriate ultimate destination for this one-of-a-kind award-winning layout. The Museum staff and their "friends" group are finishing the lighting, protective panels and supporting exhibits in the wonderful new exhibit room specifically prepared for this. Once that's finished, they'll open the exhibit to the public, use it to interpret and demonstrate the many logging-era industries and practices, plus occasionally operate it.

We encourage everyone to visit the museum in North-Central PA, on US Rt. 6, about equidistant between Coudersport and Galeton. The address is 5660 US-6 W, Ulysses, PA 16948, and their website is <u>lumber-museum.org</u>. The attractive 10-acre campus features a large main exhibit building, steam-powered sawmill, early 1900's lumber camp, 70-ton 3-truck Shay, 15-ton Brookville Loco Works diesel and the only restored Barnhart log loader in the world. They conduct three special events each year with additional exhibits and activities, including running their sawmill. Their signature event is the Bark Peelers' Festival held each July 4th weekend, when their Shay and Barnhart are rolled out.

Why are we donating the layout, and why now? The short answer is we have achieved our group goals and have had 41 years of enjoyment doing so. Further, the layout turned out to be very unique and of museum quality, plus it's portability made such a move feasible. Additionally, we all are now pursuing other modeling interests. Best of all, we're still healthy enough to occasionally travel there to visit and teach them about the railroad, and potentially conduct guest operating and/or photo sessions.

Earlier this year the layout was photographed by Model Railroader Contributing Editor Lou Sassi for a fourth feature article. That article will appear in Model Railroader or Great Model Railroads sometime in the next couple years. Along the way, we made several touch-ups and refinements, including completing some unfinished structure details and wiring, plus many loco and car preparations.

HOLIDAY JUNCTION RETURNS FOR THE 2021 HOLIDAY SEASON

Holiday Junction, a beloved Cincinnati holiday tradition, pulls in to the Cincinnati Museum Center at Union Terminal on Friday, November 12, 2021. This year marks 75 years since the Duke Energy Holiday Trains made their first appearance in the Cincinnati Gas & Electric (CG&E) lobby, much to the delight of generations of Greater Cincinnatians through the years.

The historic O-scale B&O layout's history in Cincinnati goes back to 1946 when the Baltimore & Ohio Railroad shipped it (by rail of course) to town on loan to CG&E to be displayed in their downtown Cincinnati lobby during the holiday season. And so began one of our much loved holiday traditions, filling generations of Greater Cincinnatians with so many memories through the years. The layout has around 1,000 ft. of track, 60 locomotives, and 300 railroad cars which travel approximately 100,000 scale miles in a normal pre-pandemic season.

Don't forget to check out the no-touch interactive storybook filled with photos and the history of the Duke Energy Holiday Trains!

There is more to Holiday Junction than the Duke Energy Holiday Trains. You'll find multiple operating model railroads and railroad artifacts throughout the exhibit. Watch one of the earliest electric toy trains, the c. 1904 Carlisle & Finch train, travel around its track. There's also the winter-themed garden railway layout created by our friends at the Greater Cincinnati Garden Railway Society, Thomas the Train G-scale layout, a 1960s era Lionel Super O layout, and the Lionel pre-war layout for *(my favorite to operate)*. Let's not forget about the impressive Brickopolis exhibit created by the talented folks at OKILug, filled with operating trains and other scenes made with LEGO bricks in a separate gallery.

Again this year, the children's train ride will not be operating. In its place is a scavenger hunt for themed items hidden throughout the garden railway layout. Another advantage of the children's train ride not operating is that adults can now view the entire garden railway layout which just wasn't possible with the ride operating around the layout. So don't forget to take advantage of the view!

Santa will be coming back to the Public Landing beginning on Nov. 26th, where he'll be looking out his window to chat and take photos with guests from a safe distance.




