The Editors Corner:

Are you "soldering-challenged"? For years I have preferred to use a soldering gun, rather a soldering pencil. One reason is that the shape tends to alleviate the possibility of picking up the "wrong end" (You know what I mean!).

I found Weller makes a light-weight electronic gun that uses either of 2 tips, a small round one, or a larger flat chisel tip. But it is has another advantage in that the tip is heated only when the trigger switch is pulled, and thus saves the tip from wearing out due to erosion, and also eliminates resting the tool in a protective holder. Heatup takes only 6 seconds. Ebay seems to be a good source for this gun, Weller Model GT. Mine has lasted over 8 years.



Shirley's Joshua Trees

My friend Shirley Gregory recently decided to join the NMRA and has been helping me clean and finish my layout for a Division visit. Some time ago she mentioned that the stems from some seedless grapes we had been sharing might be appropriate for scenery on my layout. Being a MMR, I sort of poohpoohed her ideas. Not good! Shirley persisted time after time and finally I paid attention.

"What kind of things could these stems be used for?" she asked me. When I finally got to look closely at these dried stems I realized that they bore a close resemblance to the Joshua trees I had observed when working in Las Vegas. Las Vegas was not awash in Joshua trees but there were a few and once out in the high desert there were small forests of them. Their branches were convoluted with a bunch of green spiky balls at each end. My thought turned to how can we make a Joshua tree out of these?

A week or two of drying turned the stems close to hard and brittle. I decided to try breaking them apart into manageable trees and wrapping them with small florist wire... bad results. I tried some grey sewing thread and that seemed to work better. I added a dab of super glue at the base and another at the top. When dry, I coated each tree with super glue and let them dry. The super glue and thread seemed to give the trees added strength. I experimented with dipping the flared branch ends with carpenter's glue and dipping into a small tray of scenic grass. Now we were looking at a miniature Joshua tree!

I borrowed a small paper bag from Shirley and mixed up a concoction of western grey soil and appropriate grey coloring. We then thoroughly sprayed the trees with hair spray and all into the bag for a shaking up. Dumped the trees onto some newspaper and left them alone to dry. A few days later I dipped each branch end in carpenters glue and then in a dish of scenic grass....let dry. I later sanded the end of each tree flat and drilled a .025 inch hole to accept a small piece of music wire for planting. After putting 100 or so Joshua trees on my desert layout, they seemed to disappear into the scenery like they had always belonged there. As they should have!

Moral to this story: Listen to people new to the hobby. They see things differently than those of us old hands and can point out obvious things our old jaded eyes have long ceased to see.




