

Or, take the battery holder apart and there might be a circuit board to flash or twinkle LEDs. Operate the circuit board at 5 volts DC or less.



HEADLIGHTS

Happy holidays and welcome to 2018. Here's hoping that Santa brought you everything on your wish list. And if he didn't, well there's more train shows coming up. I was hoping Santa would stop at my house and take things OUT of my basement, but that didn't happen. I have managed to uncover some floor space and I have some vacation time coming up, so there's still hope some progress will be made before the end of the year.

And then there was one; one last Headlights article to write, that is. It does seem like this last year has gone by pretty fast. Now it's time to pass the gavel to my successor. John Shields has done an admirable job in both the Secretary and Assistant Superintendent positions, so I have no doubt he will be an excellent Superintendent, as well. Having read his Oil Can articles during the past four years, I think you will find his articles more interesting than some of mine were. John probably doesn't realize how much "archival" information gets passed from one Superintendent to the next. Randy placed it my care, it maintained a location in my basement for the past four years, and now it's going to take up residence at John's house. However, John does get to unload all of the A/V equipment to the next Assistant Super.

I would like to thank the members of the Board of Directors for all they do for the division and the support they have given me over the past four years. I can always count on the committee leads to handle the details of their various areas of responsibility.

Since I'm writing this article on the 20th, we are still in the midst of our division election. This was the first time we used an electronic voting method and it worked very well. We were able to distribute over 200, or 90%, of the ballots by email, with only 20 people receiving paper ballots. This meant a cost savings to the division since the electronic balloting only cost \$19, as opposed to \$96 in first class postage we would have paid to mail those 200 ballots. It was important that we get a ballot (in one form or another) to every eligible member in the division since we had 2 people running for one of the offices. I hope you took the opportunity to read over the candidate statements and make your voice heard in this election. Based on the number of ballots that have been recorded so far, it looks like this will be the biggest participation rate we have ever had. I have worked with both Chuck and Kevin over the past several years and feel that either one will be successful in that position.

Rick Crumrine reported at the December meeting our 50th Annual Train and Trade Show in October was very successful. Admissions were up on both Saturday and Sunday (in spite of the nice weather). Income from table sales was also up over previous years. The biggest change for this years' show was we eliminated the ads in the Cincinnati Enquirer and added more of those blue neighborhood signs. The increased income combined with the reduced expenses meant the balance sheet for the 2017 show shows the biggest surplus in quite a while. Thank you to everyone who helped during the show or trudged around their neighborhoods putting up the blue signs. Special kudos to John Burchnall for the job he did organizing the sign distribution.

Randy Kerka has been reviewing the door prize slips to glean insight on where people are hearing about the show. Our decision to skip the newspaper ads this year was based on information we gathered in years past. He also uses the slips to add more names to the database we use when sending out the postcards advertising the Spring Swap Meet and the Fall Train and Trade Show.



Looking ahead:

Our January meeting will be at Good Shepherd Lutheran Church in Kenwood on January 14. The clinician for this meeting will be Joe Ross. He will be giving a talk on the laying of continuous welded rail on the Norfolk Southern. After the meeting, we will be doing return visits to Donald Docter's HO B&O/Pennsylvania and to Paul Miklos' N scale B&O Ohio Division. [Note: this is a change from previous plans, as Jim Stewart had to cancel due to family commitments].

In February (on the 11th), we will be at the Cincinnati Marriott North (West Chester) which is our convention hotel, with clinician Bill Ford giving a presentation on C&O Maintenance of Way Motorcars. After the meeting we will visit Greg Simpson's OO British layout (since he had to cancel for the November joint meeting) and Noah Powers' HO Pennsylvania Limited.

As is normally our schedule, there is no regular meeting in March. This is because on Saturday March 10th, we will have our annual Flea Market at Lakota West Freshman School. This will be our biggest ever, as we were able to get more space than in previous years. As always, we will be needing volunteers to work this show. Look for sign-up sheets at the January meeting. Additionally, if you don't have any room for new purchases, now is the time to start planning on getting some things you may not need listed so they can be sold on the Division's White Elephant table (and thus make room for some new items).

Will it really have been thirteen years since we hosted the National NMRA convention? Fortunately, we still have a lot of the people that made that effort so successful; and so we feel really good about the preparations for this convention. Those who have already registered, should have received their info packet to start signing up for tours, etc. in early December. If you have not returned that form, do it right away to get priority on your favorite tours. If you and your spouse have not registered yet, DO IT NOW. You don't want to miss this one. We want this to be one of the best our visitors from around the region have ever been to. Part of making it great for our visitors will also be having lots of you willing to volunteer to do all the things needed that keep the event going in spite of the unexpected things that always come up. If you are not already on one of the committees' lists of volunteers, expect to be getting calls in the next few months to fill in the big grid of roles that Randy Kerka is maintaining.

A single photo may be submitted for each listing.




