

HEADLIGHTS

I hope that creating the extra issues of the *Oil Can* has given you some benefit during the time we have not been able to meet. We now have a new plan for going forward starting in June. Our June 14th meeting will occur on-line. The group I assigned looked into doing a virtual meeting (as many of us have likely attended for other events) and into doing a live meeting with simultaneous streaming on-line. Their recommendation has been to do a virtual only meeting for this first event. A lot more about this will be found in the other articles in this issue.

The key barrier that was encountered was that the venue we had available, Harmony Lodge, does not have wifi. While there certainly is technology to deal with that, it added a lot of complexity to this first attempt. And as I fully understood, more complexity is exactly the same as saying more risk that things will not work. So the best way to do something that would let us connect with the maximum number of members was to pick the simplest choice; and then learn our way into other options in the future.

Also, our July meeting was likely going to be virtual-only anyway because our clinician, Mike Tylick MMR©, is already scheduled to present virtually instead of traveling here from Boston. Further, we lost the planned venue for that month, and have not found a replacement yet. So again, the choice is to do the simplest and surest plan in these uncertain times.

This will allow Chuck to focus on the August meeting, which we do hope to do live, with a guest clinician traveling here to present a whole afternoon's worth of clinics. We hope to invite folks from the surrounding divisions to this event; so it needs the focus. Since most model rail-road events have been cancelled, our "Clinicfest" could be one of the first chances for us modelers to get together.

I am out of travel pictures, so I hope a number of you took Dave up on his request to submit pictures and/or stories showing what you have been doing during the "lock down". You <u>have</u> been making good use of the time, right? While the N Scale Convention was one of the events that have been cancelled for this summer, the N Scale Enthusiasts group has been holding regular on-line auctions during the stay at home time. The result being that I have had a regular series of packages being delivered, with new rolling stock and a couple of engines arriving. So far they are only logged in to my roster, as any test running has to wait until the Ross Schools club room opens up again.

Since the unexpected extension of winter weather seems to finally be broken, after I get my flowers into the planters on the deck, I plan to get my T Trak module outside to do some more work on the scenery. Given the challenging weather, I guess it's a good thing that I don't have to take it to the Regional Convention as planned (since it is little changed since last seen at the Fall Show). Not only is it less cleanup when working outside, but the lighting is better. [Feel free to offer other excuses I can use. This still sounds like I could have gotten something done in the last 6 months]

Hope to "see" you on Zoom in June; and once again, hang in there and be safe until we can actually meet in person again.



SECOND SECTION

Exciting news! We're restarting our monthly meetings at 2 pm on Sunday, June 14, using a popular virtual meeting technology, called Zoom. Now, any of us with a computer, notebook or smart phone should be able to participate, and there are no biological contamination dangers. The only catch is <u>we must have your email id in order to send you the link to this virtual meeting</u>. If you didn't receive the mid-May e-Oil Can via email, then we don't have your id. If so, please email our e-Oil Can distributor Bob Shreve at <u>eoilcan@cincy-div7.org</u> to give it to him. The next sections outline how this all works.

Virtual Monthly Meeting Procedures

About a week before the meeting date, we'll email you an invitation that includes a **link** to the meeting, plus an attachment containing our 1-page Zoom Meetings Quick Guide. That guide is also in this Oil Can and on our website. Our host will open the meeting about 30 minutes early so everyone can have time to join in and work any issues, especially joining for the first time. After clicking on the link in the email, and possibly being asked to make a short download, you'll be in the waiting room. We'll then admit you to the session. Virtual Monthly Contest Procedures

Within the meeting invite email, we'll also share instructions on how to submit and vote on entries for the contest. The contest is simplified for these virtual meets, with all entries being electronic photos (preferably JPEGS) and only two categories: models or prototypes (real trains). The entries must feature either the Model or the Photo Contest topics given in the monthly program table. When these topics are different, you can use either. Each contestant can have up to 3 entries per month. Entries will be closed about 2 days prior to the meeting. One or two pdf files containing sequentially numbered and similarly sized entries will then be posted within the contest tab on our website. About 2 days before the meeting, all members will receive a meeting reminder email, including email voting instructions. Winners will be reported at the meeting and afterwards, as usual, on the website and in the next Oil Can.

Always check the Cincinnati Division 7 website for the most current info on programs and events.

<u>June 7th</u> – picnic **POSTPONED** indefinitely to a later date.

June 14th – Please join us virtually for our first meeting since the gathering restrictions! Contrary to earlier location postings, this meeting will be conducted 100% virtually. Please <u>DO NOT TRAVEL</u> to Harmony Lodge for this meeting! As mentioned above, we'll be using Zoom to run this meeting. **Bruce Knapp** will present a new PowerPoint clinic entitled "**Adding Passenger Service**". After that, in lieu of our normal inperson layout visits, we'll share the **contest winners**, plus some never-before-seen **photos from layout** photo shoots John Burchnall has attended. As related above, the monthly contest will be conducted during a few days prior to the virtual meeting, using email and our website. The topics are "Flat Car with Load" or "Train on Bridge/Trestle" for either model or prototype photos.

<u>July 12th to 19th</u> – NMRA National Convention **CANCELLED**.

<u>July 19th - (note date)</u> – Meeting location TBD (might be 100% virtual, as in June). Mike Tylick, MMR, will make a live remote video appearance to present "Quick Interiors for Structures". Contest topics for both models and photos will be "Steam Locomotive(s)". Layout visits or slides TBD.


I'm looking forward to "seeing" everyone via Zoom on June 14! Let's set an attendance record!



Zoom Meetings Quick Guide

Joining the Session

- A few minutes before the meeting, click on the <u>link</u> within your invite email
- If you have never run Zoom before, Zoom will ask you to download their software or app this goes quick
- At some point, Zoom may ask you to "Enter With or Enable Your Video and/or Audio" say "Yes" to both
- Zoom will then enter you into a <u>waiting room</u> until the host lets you join the meeting



Once in the Meeting

- Once in the meeting, make sure your video and audio are initially enabled (on) using the lower left buttons
- Adjust your in/out sound volumes within the audio settings under the Audio/Mute button
- Initially set your view to Gallery View to see everyone the same size before the meeting
- Select the Chat button to activate a chat area next to your viewing window(s)
- Type "text" questions to others at the base of the chat area especially useful during presentations
- Option: use a photo as a virtual background via setting in Video button (must have green screen capability)

During the Meeting

- Set your <u>audio to "mute"</u> so all your background noises will not interrupt the meeting/presentation
- Set your view to Speaker View to see the speaker larger
- Do not share your screen, unless the host specifically asks you to, using the Share Screen button
- Most meetings will be recorded <u>act responsibly</u> the host can unilaterally kick out unruly participants
- Ask silent questions using the chat box the host will group those and ask the presenter at the end
- After the host terminates the meeting for everyone, you should exit and/or close the Zoom app











John Listermann's HO-scale Layout

Great Northern Railway Operating Session on June 20 at 7 PM (Saturday).

NOTE: Contact Sam Parfitt prior to attending, in order to confirm the Operating Session. --- Ed.

One of the large 4 day RC warbirds events that I attend in St. Charles, Ill has been cancelled so I will have an additional ops session on that Saturday. This is a 'month to month' arrangement as RC plane flyins are cancelled in the future due to the coronavirus.

I've moved all my vintage metal Athearn/Varney and wood Silver Streak/Ambroid freight cars to Seattle, so freight drags will dominate, plus passenger trains of your choice.

NEW PROJECTS:

Installed decoders in 7 more engines.

Began installing hardware needed to, remotely, control turnouts via the track schematic on the PC's monitor screen: Along with the signaling system, this is also LCC.

Most testing done with passenger trains seems to be ending, as the longer passenger cars are about twice the length of a regular freight car and pose different problems, but they seem to be finally resolved.

New vintage metal Athearn/Varney and wood Silver Streak/Ambroid freight cars have been tested, and are working well over the mainline.

Finished adding the last tunnel portals that I failed to do, 40 years ago.

Got to do some PM on 3-4 engines.

New passenger yard completed.

The signaling system using LCC is complete along with monitor showing train positions on the layout.

Mission Statement: Main theme of my railroad (besides modeling the Great Northern Railway): when building the railroad, I wanted to model mainline running with big time steam and 'scale like' trains of 25-45 cars on single track mainline with passing sidings.

The GNRW has been updated to handle DCC operations.

As I used to do in the 80's and 90's, should you have a DCC engine, you may bring it to operate on the GNRW.

Seattle freight yard: 14 tracks, 550 car capacity.

Seattle roundhouse: 24 stalls

St. Paul freight yard: 12 tracks, 420 car capacity

St. Paul roundhouse: 24 stalls Cascade tunnel electrics: operator (2)

Ore dock: 120 car capacity. Main panel dispatcher.

Swan river logging railroad: operator (2)

USUAL STATS:

Time: 1938. All steam and electrics. The GN railway is a point to point railroad, 400' mainline with two 400-500 car yards at Seattle, Wash and St Paul, Minn, each having 20+ track turntables and one staging yard holding 300 cars. Minimum radius, 48" with #10 turnouts; Track all hand laid on individual wooden ties. 100% scenery.

Four track 12' ore dock.

Interface railroads: NP, SP&S, Milwaukee, DM&IR, UP, SP, D&RGW, SF and CN.

Swan Lake logging railroad: Has interface with GNRW, yard, John Allen's 'time saver' and double switchback into the valley.

The Cimarron Northern

Long before I started my new layout, I was modeling a fictious western railroad loosely based of Santa Fe prototypes and practices, the Cimarron Northern Railway. The line ran from Denver, CO to Amarillo, TX, roughly paralleling (replacing) the Burlington (C&S), and interchanging with the Santa Fe at Raton, NM. The Cimarron Northern second-version was a rebuild of the late John Robert's Blue Ridge and Southern.

How do you make West Virginia look like New Mexico? Very carefully. Firstly, pay attention (?) to details, and topography. Much of the CN motive power was second-hand Santa Fe power like 1950 class 2-8-0's, 3200 class 2-8-2's, plus some ex-KCMO 2-10-0's. My F-units and GP-7's were right at home on John's tight radius main line, but my poor Santa Fe 4-6-4 could only do the short staging to main line.

When we moved to our new house, I had a much larger space for my layout --- do I expand the Cimarron Northern, or do I start a new railroad? I was much more comfortable with my knowledge of the Santa Fe, as I had really fallen in love with the Raton Pass portion of the Santa Fe, plus I also had my Santa Fe experts, John Altshool and Rick Stern. The notorious Sunday Afternoon Boys (Keith Corman and Merlyn Jarman) helped disassemble the old layout, though I did save a few scenes. Now I had a great space to plan and build the layout of my dreams. I will now have a home for my 3800 class 2-10-2's, and my 3700 class 4-8-4's. The minimum mainline radius will be 28" with #6 and #8 mainline turnouts. I picked 1951, as that was a big year for steam on the Pass.

Progress on the Raton Pass

Speaking of the Raton Pass, it is back to working on my Raton Pass. Our Sunday Outing Boys have added Pat Homan and Chuck Endreola, so we not only have the talent but the man (person) power to make progress actually happen. Sadly, we did lose one of our technical experts, John Altshool who succumbed to bladder cancer. Stay tuned for future progress (?) reports.

Next Meeting

Our Superintendent, John Shields, assigned a "blue-ribbon" committee to investigate a safer way to have a division meeting. COVID-19 is still out there and most of us fall in the prime candidate category. So, for this month and maybe even July, we are holding a virtual meeting.

I am going to miss seeing all of you and sharing in the excitement of our monthly raffle. (We met and picked the winning tickets already). I am excited to be this month's clinician, and have rehearsed with John Burchnall, who managed to stay awake through the whole presentation.
