



Mark also brought the actual model so we could see the results. I was interested to learn that Mark had not actually been to the building, but had been able to get the pictures he needed from on-line sources. It was also interesting to learn that he found out only after building the model with a track under the building (because that is the way the Cornerstone kit he used for the kitbash was designed) that there actually was a track that ran under part of the real Crosley building. After the meeting, we visited Sam Parfitt's HO Great Northern and Ed Bley's HO Pennsylvania RR Monongahela Division.

#### Looking ahead:

There is no meeting in March because of the annual Flea Market at Lakota West Freshman School. There were signup sheets at the January and February meetings for the usual setup, tear down, and admissions jobs; and for the Division Booth; so if you signed up, remember to be there at the appropriate times. And if you still want to help, contact Peter or Brad to volunteer. The date of the Flea Market is Saturday March 11<sup>th</sup> and the time is 10:00am to 3:00pm.

Our next regular meeting will be April 9<sup>th</sup>, at Harmony Lodge in Winton Place (Spring Grove Village) for a joint meeting with the Cincinnati Railroad Club. Our clinician will be Michael Abraham, from Blacksburg Virginia, who is the author of a new book called "Chasing the Powhatan Arrow; A Travelogue in Economic Geography". As the title suggests, this is not just a book about trains, but about the region and the people who live there and how this has changed as the railroad service has changed. Michael will have copies of the book to sell, as well as his other books. Layout visits will be to the O Scale Cincinnati Model Railway Club there at Harmony Lodge and to Dan Hadley's HO Sierra Northern layout.

In July, we will be up north in Mason at St Susanna Church. Between the July and August meetings, the NMRA National Convention will take place in Orlando. The dates this year are July 30<sup>th</sup> through August 6<sup>th</sup>. In August, we will be back at Good Shepherd in Kenwood. And in September we will return to West Chester.

While not an NMRA event, I also want to plug the Train Show at Ross School on Saturday March the 4<sup>th</sup> from 9:00 to 2:00. The six model railroad clubs located at Ross take part in this event each year which benefits the school music programs. This is important to the school and is part of the deal that makes the space available to the clubs located there. There really cannot be too many model railroad events, right?



## KNAPP'S NOTES

I'll be working with Frank Bongiovanni on our usual (only better) brass upgrade clinics, plus I may do one on locomotive maintenance. I always enjoy working with Frank, as we tend to learn from each other (heck with the audience). I still remember my first regional clinic in Dayton; my clinic room was next to a John Armstrong clinic. Periodically there were outbursts of laughter coming from John's clinic. I was horrified; this is serious business, this is a hobby; clinic attendees shouldn't be having a good time, it makes the rest of us look bad. I had David Barrow in my clinic; at least the laughter from John Armstrong's clinic kept Dave awake. 
