

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

HEADLIGHTS

Another Model Train and Trade Show is in the books. Attendance on both Saturday and Sunday was the best in several years, in spite of the balmy weather (although the nice weather did make setup and takedown easier). Thanks to all of the members who helped with setup, takedown, admissions, the membership booth, and all the other activities needed to put on a successful show.

Congratulations to Sam Swanson for earning MMR #600. This honor is well deserved. Sam has wowed us for many years and is also known nationally for his modelling abilities.

For the first time in a while, there will be two candidates running for one of the offices up for election this year. During the October meeting, the Division BOD had a short meeting to determine the process we will use to collect ballots. The board voted to investigate using an electronic voting program for this election. Both National and Regional elections have been done using this method. Division 7members for whom we have an Email address will receive an Email containing an individual ID number you will use to record your vote electronically. Members who have not provided an Email address will receive a paper ballot. If you do not receive the *Oil Can* by email but rather have to go online to read it, we don't have your correct email address, and you will not receive an electronic ballot. We need your correct email address for this to work! A quick email to NMRA HQ at mmrahq@aol.com will give us your correct address for future electronic mailings. Elsewhere in this issue of the *Oil Can* the nominating committee has published the slate of nominees for the upcoming election, along with biographical information of each candidate. Please read the information provided and take the time to vote.

To paraphrase Steve Martin from the movie "The Jerk", "The new cars are in! The new cards are in!" Our latest car project cars are available for purchase. The car is a 36' double sheathed wood boxcar. Three are lettered for the V & O railroad, while the fourth is lettered for the Miami Valley Railroad, a V & O predecessor. Cars are available from the company store.

The Fall MCR BOD meeting was held on October 22nd in Columbus. I provided an update on our plans for the 2018 convention. Steve Zapytowski from Division 1 gave an update on the 2019 regional convention to be held in Boardman, Ohio just south of Youngstown. The name of their convention is "The A,C, & Y Bullet", after the name of a train on the Akron, Canton, & Youngstown railroad. The BOD voted to approve a bid by Division 2 to hold the 2020 regional convention in the Pittsburgh area. Tentative title for this convention is "Trains, Family, & Fun". In other action, plans are underway to create a new Division 12 consisting of three counties in New York and five counties in Pennsylvania. These counties were transferred from the Niagara Frontier Region to the Mid Central region a couple of years ago. Initially, they were added to Division 5 in the far northeast corner of Ohio. The desire to create a new division is based on the where the members in these counties are primarily located, and how the geography of the area hinders east – west travel. The people who attended the BOD meeting from this new division were very excited about the opportunity.

One of the points I made while discussing the convention during the BOD meeting was the importance of registering early so you get higher priority when selecting tours or operating sessions. The convention registration package will be sent to those people who have pre-registered prior to its publication in the Kingpin. The number of pre-registrants was in the 60-65 range at the time of the Fall show. If there are some activities you really want to do at the convention, you should get your registration in soon to have your best chance.

I was reading the latest "NMRA Turntable" Email when I noticed that the clinics we had recorded at the Orlando convention were available on the NMRA web site. I was anxious to see how they looked and sounded. As I expected, you could really tell the difference between the ones I recorded using my "in camera" mic compared to the ones that used a remote lapel mic. Fortunately, the sound for the clinics I recorded came out pretty good, considering. I'll still look for a different camera that can utilize an external mic to do more recording next year.

Let's see. That's 46 Headlights articles down, 2 to go. See you in Miamisburg on November 12th.





SECOND SECTION

Our October meeting on the 8th was held at the Kenton County Library branch in Erlanger on a very rainy day. Dan Finfrock gave a clinic on several industrial lines in Butler County, featuring the Middletown branch of the B&O (serving Armco Steel), but including several others that most of us may not have known about. Our layout visits afterwards were to Perry Simpson's HO L&N and to Tom Vogt's highly detailed HO freelanced layout. This was our first time visiting Tom's layout.

The following weekend, October 14th and 15th, was our 50th Annual Cincinnati Model Train Show at Lakota West High School. Preliminary results are that we increased attendance compared to the last couple of years, in spite of gorgeous weather on Saturday that would tempt people to spend one last day outdoors. Rick Crumrine and all of the Show committee did an exceptional job of making this show special. It was neat seeing all of the volunteers circulating around the show in their golden T-shirts. There was even an anniversary cake (to go with the usual pizza) during set up on Friday night.

Looking ahead:

Our next meeting, on November 12th, is our joint meeting with Dayton Division 3. The meeting location is the Washington Township recreation center (a change from the previously described location). This is located on State Route 725, just east of I-675 (State Route 725 is the Dayton Mall exit). Our special clinician for this meeting is Stephen Priest, MMR and the editor of *Railroad Model Craftsman*. His topic is "Working with Manufacturers, How Models Get from Concept to your Basement". We will have our scheduled model and photo contest, as well as our raffle. In addition, our usual fall engine raffle is under way, with the final drawing to be held in December. I understand that Division 3 will also be having their raffle; so you can get in that as well. (Hint: bring enough money to cover all of these) Layout visits after the meeting will include Bob Lawson's Southern Railway "Rat Hole" Division and Todd Smalley's [replacing Greg Simpson, but see below] C&O HO layouts (from our Division) and Wes Reece's HO Virginia Southern (from Dayton).

Our December meeting on 12/10 will be at Westwood United Methodist Church. This will be our traditional pot luck slide/digital photo/ video show and snackfest. It's not too early to start going through your slides and videos and seeing what you might bring. It would be good to see some new presenters this year. If you visited a tourist railroad in the past couple of years, I bet you have pictures! Why not share them? After all, this would be a much friendlier audience than your neighbors who probably wonder why you still "play with trains", (especially if you have a LOT of pictures). Layouts open after the meeting will be Michael Shannon's HO layout and Randy Seiler's HO layout.

In January, we will be back again in Kenwood on the 14th at Good Shepherd Lutheran. Our clinician will be Joe Ross with a talk on the laying of continuous welded rail on Norfolk Southern. After the meeting, we will be doing a return visit to Jim Stewart's HO Port Arthur Railway and Navigation Co. In February (2/11), we will be at West Chester library, with clinician Tom Ford giving a presentation on C&O Maintenance of Way Motorcars. After the meeting we will visit Greg Simpson's OO British layout (since he had to cancel for the November joint meeting). And on Saturday March 10th, we will have our annual Flea Market at Lakota West Freshman School.

I'm really looking forward to this coming meeting. If anyone asks you why they should join the NMRA, tell them about this meeting. As a member in Cincinnati, you don't even have local dues to pay. You get monthly meetings with great clinics, including national clinicians on a fairly regular basis. You get home layouts to visit, including a large number of really great published layouts. You get a chance to interact with other modelers, including events like this one with Dayton. We have just had our 50th Annual Model Train Show. We are a couple of weeks away from the Dayton Train Show, and now just a few months away from our Regional Convention. In other years, we would be planning our annual bus tour. It is certainly possible to enjoy this hobby by yourself, cooped up in your basement; but you get so much when you share the hobby with others.

I hope to see you in Dayton on November the 12th.

Statement from Superintendent Candidate John Shields:

I am currently serving as your Assistant Superintendent, and ask for your support to be the next Division Superintendent.

I have been an NMRA Member since 1994. Past president and currently secretary/treasurer of the Queen City N-Gineers modular railroad club. Member of the B&O Railroad Historical Society and of the N&W Railway Historical Society. Modeler since ~1961, having started as an "assistant" to my Dad in the building and operating of his HO scale Queen & Crescent RR (which was on the home layout tours at the 1966 National Convention here in Cincinnati). Switched to N Scale in 1968. Primary modeling period – 1955-1960. Primary modeling interest – B&O.

Native Cincinnatian. Graduate of University of Cincinnati College of Engineering, retired from Procter and Gamble after 38 years in 2015. Married to Marsha W. Shields for 33 years. Marsha died in 2016. One son, Larry (33), graduate of Ohio University, former reporter for WCPO channel 9, and news operations manager at WXIX channel 19; now the communications director for the St. Vincent de Paul Society in Cincinnati.

After four years as secretary, and four years as assistant super; working diligently with Mr. Kerka and Mr. Shreve and the rest of the great leadership of your Division, I want to continue to improve the NMRA experience for you, the members; first by delivering a great MCR Convention, and then by continuing our traditional monthly and yearly events, and by finding new ways to promote our hobby in our area.

Statement from Assistant-Superintendent Candidate Kevin Orcutt:

I am hoping to be the Division's next Assistant Superintendent. I'm a fourth generation model railroader. My Mother's Grandfather and my Father's Father were both some of the original/charter members of the New York Society of Model Engineers group. Some of my earliest memories are of Model Trains, dating back to Lionel trains in the basement, right alongside of my Dad's HO layout. That started a life-long fascination with Trains, both model and the 1:1 stuff that I enjoy railfanning.

The loop didn't last too long and I found out the Lionel and sandboxes don't mix too well... After we left that first basement, we moved to SC where our house didn't have a basement. After a while, Dad had an addition built onto the back of the house to host his layout. I remember helping him build the benchwork and other things. We moved again, this time up to Upstate New York. where We did have a basement to have fun in. Before either my Dad or I started anything downstairs, Dad acquired a 4x8 layout from someone at his work for me to start with. I did learn quite a bit on that one, especially in terms of electronics, needless to say, live 120v and aluminum control panels are a bad combination, ask me about it sometime! I finally started my own layout down in a corner of our basement. It had a couple of towns, along with a hidden staging yard, and a connection over to my Dad's larger layout. This one lasted me through the High School years. I do remember doing some modeling in college.

Then came my Army years. My modeling dropped off a bit, but I still remember finding a hobby shop close by out in Monterey were I found a nice little building kit. It was one of my first wooden kits, and I still have it today. While overseas, I didn't do much modeling, but found it interesting to find an EMD SD7 serving the South Korean Railway system. When I came back, I was stationed at Ft Meade Maryland. While there I found out one of the premier Model Railroad shows around. The Timonium shows, held four times a year. Somehow I got hooked up with the Show's Organizer - Howard Zane. Found out that he was only about 10 minutes away from where I lived, so I soon became a regular member of his work crew. All I can say is "Wow." He is a great character, and that is some layout!

I worked on that for quite a few years before I moved to the Cincinnati area. I remember one night Howard gathered all of us around and said he had something for us. He then proceeded to hand out little bronze cards that granted us Lifetime pass to the Timonium shows. Just a few months before I moved out here, I came out and went with my Dad to my first NMRA National Convention up in Madison. I remember meeting Allen McClelland for the first time up there and becoming a V&O Historical Society member.

Once I moved out here, I think my Dad was Treasurer of the Division at the time, I quickly started attending meetings and started some of my volunteering with the Division. I remember helping Dad with the Monthly raffle when he ran it. I remember starting to help out with our Fall show. It was at the Cincinnati Gardens when I first came out here... I volunteered to help Rick Crumrine out on the Show's committee. That's when it moved over to the Kentucky Convention Center. I worked with Roy Hord and used a CAD program to arrange the tables. Great fun.

A little later on, I remember the BOD meeting in Gerry Albers' crew lounge where the Division decided to enter our bid to host the 2005 National. Just a short five years later, I enjoyed meeting every Saturday from January up to right before the Convention working with Roy again, Jim Hodde, Jim Stewart, and my Dad handling all of the Convention registration activities. I think it was some of the activities at our National Convention that got me really hooked onto the Operations side of things. I've really enjoyed operating on some of this area's finest layouts. More recently, picked up the Video lending Library for the Division. With all that, it may be time for me to serve in a more Official type of role. That's why I'm asking for your vote to allow me to serve as your next Assistant Superintendent.

Statement from Assistant-Superintendent Candidate Chuck Endreola:

Most of you know me as the publisher of our Division's electronic Oil Can newsletter – I send you each edition in an email message every month. My active participation in our great hobby and the NMRA does not start or end there. I have also been a consistent volunteer at our annual Train Shows and Flea Markets, a model contest winner at Region and Division levels and a Regional Contest Judge. Even more importantly, I have extensive hands-on leadership experience in successfully dealing with people and running a business. I humbly seek your support in allowing me to serve you as your next Assistant Superintendent.

I was born and raised in Cleveland, Ohio, then attended the University of Cincinnati for two years before leaving school to join the family business, Carlo's Pizza. Several years later, when the youngest was a teenager, I opened and operated an Italian Deli and Catering firm, featuring fresh made pasta. I plan to apply the organizational and leadership skills developed in these businesses to benefit Division 7.



I am elated to contribute to one of the most active, successful and well-regarded divisions in the NMRA. It is a privilege to rub elbows with and learn from some of the most talented and respected modelers in the country.

Based on my experiences, skills and passions, I feel the time is right for me to give back to the Division by expanding my contributions and commitment by serving as your new Assistant Superintendent. I would strive to continue to build Division 7's success and reputation. One of my goals would be to increase our efforts in welcoming and engaging new members, so they are exposed to all the benefits of being a member of Div. 7, just as I have.
