



# HEADLIGHTS

We had our October monthly meeting, in-person and on-line, on Sunday October 3<sup>rd</sup>. Our clinician was our own Peter Weiglin, whose topic was "USRA steam locomotives and rolling stock". This talk was a little bit history lesson, a little bit business commentary, and a little bit train spotting guide. While the USRA government takeover of the railroads was done to speed the flow of material to the ports and on to Europe, its most lasting effect was the creation of "standard" (and relatively state-of-the-art) designs for most of the basic classes of steam engines and for freight cars. A number were built during the war – mostly for eastern and Midwestern railroads; and mostly for moving coal and grain. It was interesting to see that only four of the eight freight car designs were built during the war. However lots of "USRA" engines and cars were built by the railroads themselves after the war. It is easy to imagine this was a boon to smaller and less financially stable railroads, to have the cost of designing modern equipment provided for them.

The following weekend was our annual Cincinnati Fall Train and Trade Show at Lakota West High School, back after a one year hiatus due to covid. I don't have any official numbers as I write this (less than two weeks later), but we certainly had a good crowd on Saturday. In fact, we opened the doors early because the line was getting so long. Unofficially, I am hearing that we had "about the same attendance as normal (pre-covid)" which would be considered "success." We did have a few less dealers. Whether this reflects a permanent drop in the number of folks willing to spend weekends traveling the country to do shows like ours, or just a slower return to normal post-covid will have to be seen. I know that Coryville Station, one of our larger dealers, have decided, after a year off, to not return to the "gypsy" lifestyle. It's not even clear if they will become an on-line dealer, or return to being full time farmers. Like many of us, many of our dealers are "older". A forced year off can be bad for a small business, but can also force a review of one's priorities and plans for the future. I hope that local train shows do not follow brick and mortar hobby shops in to a decline. As I think we have learned from our covid experience, a good bit of the enjoyment of our hobby comes from live face-to-face interactions with folks who share a similar interest in the hobby.

Our next meeting is at the Erlanger Branch of the Kenton County Library on November 14<sup>th</sup>. For all the important details, see Chuck's column and the coming events table in this Oil Can and on the website. I just want to highlight that we will be seeing two NEW layouts after this meeting, belonging to folks that have only recently joined our Division. To expand on my comment about the social aspect of the hobby, these home layout tours that we offer after each monthly meeting are one of the key benefits that we offer our members. We are very lucky to have a large number of great home layouts in our Division; and Chuck works very hard to arrange these monthly visits to both let you see them, but also to allow our talented members to show their work. Yes, there are on-line videos of home layouts; but an in-person visit allows for talking with the builders, asking questions, and perhaps creating on-going contacts. What a great reason to get out of the house and join us.

It was really great to see so many of you at Anderson and/or at the Show and I look forward to seeing all of you again, <u>in-person</u> or on zoom, at the November meeting at the Kenton County Library in Erlanger on November 14.





# **SECOND SECTION**

Division 7's Fall Show, America's oldest continuous model railroad show, suffered a hiccup in 2020. Because of the Covid-19 pandemic, the show wasn't held. I maintain that it wasn't cancelled but "postponed" until conditions allowed. Even well into 2021, there were many factors at work that complicated the planning for our Fall Show team leaders, Rick Crumrine and Roy Hord. "Crumrine & Hord" are Division 7's "Barnum and Bailey". The circus owned and controlled its entire system of attractions. They only needed some flat ground upon which to pitch a tent. Our boys had to deal with venue availability and restrictions, hesitant vendors and exhibitors, unpredictable attendance, foodservice, and volunteer recruitment, all under the ever changing local, state and federal guidelines and mandates. And now we add the "Ringling Brothers". Randy Kerka and John Burchnall. Randy oversees a database that fosters 7000 post card mailings & John manages the posting of signs all over town. Year after year, the success of our shows is the result of the hard work of those four and the many committed Division 7 volunteers.

Unfortunately, I was unable to attend October's meeting in person because of a family commitment that took me out of town. I was able to attend through Zoom for only a few minutes, as my schedule was rather demanding. The A/V team dealt with an audio snafu in good fashion. I noted that the attendance of over a dozen on Zoom did not diminish the average number of in-person attendees (about 50). So, the overall attendance was greater than normal. The aim of Superintendent Shield's promotion of simulcasting our live meetings were to increase attendance, by offering those who cannot "be there" the opportunity to participate. So far, it appears to be achieving that goal.





Installed decoders in several more engines. A selection of 50 engines can now be done.

Mission Statement: Main theme of my railroad (besides modeling the Great Northern Railway): when building the railroad, I wanted to model mainline running with big time steam and 'scale like' trains of 25-45 cars on single track mainline with passing sidings.

#### **USUAL STATS:**

Time: 1938. All steam and electrics. The GN railway is a point to point railroad, 400' mainline with two 400-500 car yards at Seattle, Wash and St Paul, Minn, each having 20+ track turntables and one staging yard holding 300 cars. ### **HOLIDAY JUNCTION RETURNS FOR THE 2021 HOLIDAY SEASON**

Holiday Junction, a beloved Cincinnati holiday tradition, pulls in to the Cincinnati Museum Center at Union Terminal on Friday, November 12, 2021. This year marks 75 years since the Duke Energy Holiday Trains made their first appearance in the Cincinnati Gas & Electric (CG&E) lobby, much to the delight of generations of Greater Cincinnatians through the years.

The historic O-scale B&O layout's history in Cincinnati goes back to 1946 when the Baltimore & Ohio Railroad shipped it (by rail of course) to town on loan to CG&E to be displayed in their downtown Cincinnati lobby during the holiday season. And so began one of our much loved holiday traditions, filling generations of Greater Cincinnatians with so many memories through the years. The layout has around 1,000 ft. of track, 60 locomotives, and 300 railroad cars which travel approximately 100,000 scale miles in a normal pre-pandemic season.

Don't forget to check out the no-touch interactive storybook filled with photos and the history of the Duke Energy Holiday Trains!

There is more to Holiday Junction than the Duke Energy Holiday Trains. You'll find multiple operating model rail-roads and railroad artifacts throughout the exhibit. Watch one of the earliest electric toy trains, the c. 1904 Carlisle & Finch train, travel around its track. There's also the winter-themed garden railway layout created by our friends at the Greater Cincinnati Garden Railway Society, Thomas the Train G-scale layout, a 1960s era Lionel Super O layout, and the Lionel pre-war layout for (my favorite to operate). Let's not forget about the impressive Brickopolis exhibit created by the talented folks at OKILug, filled with operating trains and other scenes made with LEGO bricks in a separate gallery.

Again this year, the children's train ride will not be operating. In its place is a scavenger hunt for themed items hidden throughout the garden railway layout. Another advantage of the children's train ride not operating is that adults can now view the entire garden railway layout which just wasn't possible with the ride operating around the layout. So don't forget to take advantage of the view!

Santa will be coming back to the Public Landing beginning on Nov. 26<sup>th</sup>, where he'll be looking out his window to chat and take photos with guests from a safe distance.

Holiday Junction runs November 12, 2021 through January 3, 2022 & is open 10:00am-4:00pm Thursday through Monday & some special holiday hours. Admission is free for CMC Members. Non-member admission is \$10 each for adults & children over 2 or \$5 each if added to regular museum admission. ### **DCC HELP NEEDED**


I'm looking for advice on installing a keep alive in an HO scale Atlas HH660. This has a QSI Titan G decoder, which seems to be an odd design just for this model...there's not documentation on line for it. There's no blue common wire for lights on the connector. I think I can solder the Keep Alive wires to the outputs of the rectifier diodes on the board, black/white to the DC-minus and blue to the DC-plus. I think I've identified them correctly as shown in the picture.

The decoder has two capacitors already installed. I'm not sure what they're for. I assume I can ignore them in adding the Keep Alive.

Has anyone else done an install like this?

Am I on the right track?




