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

HEADLIGHTS

As I stated in my column last month, I was attending a wedding in Maryland last month, so was not at the September meeting. I understand Assistant Superintendent John Shields did an admirable job leading the meeting.

At the quarterly Division 7 BOD meeting in September, I announced the formation of an Operations Activities committee. For several years, Rick Stern has been the liaison between Division 7 and the various groups in other parts of the country which organize operating sessions on a regional basis. By forming an official Operations Activities committee, it will be possible for SWOOPS events, and other OpSIG events held in our division to be covered by the NMRA insurance. Because of his current involvement in these activities, Rick Stern will be chairman of this committee. In addition to the OpSIG interaction, I have asked Rick to be the point of contact within the Division for people who are interested in hosting, or wish to participate in, operating sessions. Rick already has started a list of people in our division who host sessions. If you would like to begin participating in operating sessions, contact Rick and he will try to match you up with a session. Similarly, if you are hosting operating sessions and are looking for more operators, contact Rick and he might have some names for you.

Another way Rick can be of service in this capacity would be to help people get started hosting operating sessions on their layouts. Remember that participating in operating sessions earns you hours towards the Dispatcher AP certificate. Of course, that also means you will get gentle reminders from Frank Koch to complete the paperwork needed to get the certificate.

We're getting down to the wire for this year's installment of the Cincinnati Model Train Show. I hope everybody is getting the word out to all their friends about the show. We've had flyers in the hobby shops for several months, and we're counting on our members to get flyers out to other places where the general public can see them. Look for any bulletin boards where you can post notices about community events. Most workplaces have boards like this, also.

Randy Kerka has been working with the area newspapers to get advertisements and other announcements in place for the week prior to the show. He has also acquired yard signs that can be placed in your yard or on a street corner to promote the show. John Burchnall is organizing groups of people to post the signs in the West Chester / Mason area. Be sure to see John or Randy at the October meeting to get a sign or two. The show is the weekend after the meeting.

Another form of publicity for the show is the "past attendee" name database. Randy Kerka has been maintaining this list for several years. This year, we will be sending out 5500 postcards. Since these postcards are being sent to people who have attended the show in the past, we hope to get a large return on the money invested. Randy has also revamped the giveaway prize entry forms to get better information on how the attendees are hearing about the show.

There could also still be open time slots available for you to help at the admissions table or membership booth during the show. And as always, we will need help with setup and takedown before and after the show. There will be more info about these opportunities at the October meeting.

SECOND SECTION

The September meeting was on Sunday September 14th, in Northern Kentucky at the Erlanger Library. Our clinician was Charles Bogart from Lexington, who gave a presentation on Street Cars and Interurbans of Kentucky. Growing up in a "big" city, I've just always thought about street cars as a way of commuting into town. What I learned from Chuck's clinic was that the street car lines in many smaller towns connected the railroad station to the center of town (or to the "other" railroad station if the town was served by two railroads). And after that, the other two common destinations for lines were amusement parks (like Chester Park and Coney Island here in Cincinnati) and cemeteries! After the meeting, we visited Bob Adams' N scale Norfolk &Western layout and Perry Simpson's HO Louisville & Nashville.

In October, we will be meeting a week earlier than normal on October 5th (because the Cincinnati Model Train Show will be on the following weekend) at the West Chester Library. At this meeting we will be doing another round of the "Bring and Brag" for the modeling contest of Off-Line Structures. The photo contest is for Weathered/Damaged Freight Cars. We will have a mini-clinic on Roadbeds from John Burchnall, Brad Jonas and Mike Tener. Afterwards, the layout visits will be to Brad Jonas and Ric Case.

The Annual Cincinnati Model Train Show is on the weekend of October 11th and 12th at Lakota West High School. If you did not already, expect to be asked to sign up for any of the normal volunteer roles at the October meeting. Besides set-up, tear down, NMRA booth, admissions, and distribution of flyers; we really need the help of members to place yard signs this year. We will be coordinating teams to get a lot of signs around West Chester. The assumption we are making is that the most likely first time attendees, especially families, will be people who live in the area who might make a last minute decision to stop in because they see a sign and are already nearby. We will still be on the various media bulletin boards and in the paper, for people all around the region who plan ahead and look for events on these listings. And, of course, we will be sending postcards to our ever growing data base of previous attendees.

In November, we will make our normal visit to Hamilton, on November 9th. The meeting venue is the Partners in Prime (formerly known as the Hamilton Senior Center). Dick Briggs will be down from Columbus to give a clinic on the paperwork and the ins and outs of entering model contests. Our contests that day will be models of railroad vehicles and photos of bridges. After the meeting we will be visiting John Burchnall's to see the Eastern Loggers layout and Ed Bley's Pennsylvania RR.

We will end the year as we usually do, at the Westwood United Methodist Church, on December 14th. This will be the annual pot luck digital photo show and food fest. The layout visits will be to Terry Judd in Westwood and to Jack Sibert in Cleves.

In January, we will be at Hyde Park United Methodist Church. In February we will be back in West Chester with Allen McClelland giving us his latest V&O clinic. And then in March it is the annual Flea Market and Swap Meet at Lakota Freshman School (and therefore no regular meeting).

This year we have had the final run on a couple of area layouts that we have had the pleasure to enjoy on several occasions. Hopefully, this reminds you to take advantage of these opportunities that we arrange after every regular meeting here in Division 7. We are very fortunate to have a number of really excellent layouts in the area, AND that the owners of these layouts are willing to share them with the rest of us. John Burchnall keeps a running list of all the layouts that we have had published in the national modeling magazines. But we get to see them in person!! However, I'm sure there are more out there that we don't know about. If you know of a layout that we have not visited, please let me (or John Burchnall) know. It does not have to be a magazine quality layout completely finished. I get as much out of seeing a new layout under construction as I do from some finished layouts. And if you happen to be the builder of a layout we have never visited, I understand it is VERY motivating for getting a new phase of the work done to agree to host a visit. Hobbies should not be rushed. It's how we relieve some of the pressure in our lives. But an occasional deadline can still be a "good" thing. So get on our list.

September 2014 Car Projects Report

Our 2014 car project, Virginian & Ohio USRA 2-bay hoppers, by Accurail, in four numbers, are priced at \$18 for singles, and \$70 for a four-car set, plus Ohio sales tax. They will be offered for sale at our October meeting, through our Company Store. We have sold 273 cars during the first 6 months, mostly via mail order sales. We have 228 car kits available.

Our 2013 car project, Merchants Despatch Transportation's 40' ice reefers, by Accurail, in wood or all-steel versions, are offered in two numbers for each type of reefer, and are priced at \$18 for singles, and \$70 for a four-car set, plus Ohio sales tax. We have sold 346 cars during the first 15 months, and have 156 car kits available.

Our 2012 car project, Allegheny Midland 41'-6" steel gondolas, by Accurail, are offered in three numbers, priced at \$18 for singles, and \$51 for a three-car set, plus Ohio sales tax. We have sold 259 cars during the first 27 months. We have 132 car kits available. We will be mailing postcards to buyers who have bought the AM 70-ton triple hoppers in the past, to stimulate sales of the remaining car kits.

I will have a table for car project sales at our Fall Train Show on Saturday, October 11th, so please stop by and purchase some cars to support our division's charitable work in the community.






