



HEADLIGHTS

Our August meeting was in Kenwood. Jack Sibert talked about, and answered questions about, what real railroad crew members do. Many of us may know stories about how things worked years ago, but changes in work rules and in railroad ownership have brought about changes. Crews are smaller and have to work together to get the work done. Thank you to Jim Stewart and Roy Allan for opening their home layouts for us to see.

Our meeting was a week later than usual to avoid overlapping on the NMRA National Convention in Kansas City. I had the opportunity to attend that event and reported about it at the August meeting, but let me take part of this space to give the rest of you some of what I thought of as highlights. The opening event on Sunday night was a dinner train ride. When that section of railroad was being returned to service for that purpose, the state regulatory body required that the line be described as to where it ran from and to. The operation is located in Baldwin City, Kansas, but they were restoring rail as they could and had no "other end"; so they filled in the form with "Nowhere" as the destination. So now as you roll down the line, you pass a sign along the right of way at the original end of tracks that lets you know you have officially arrived at Nowhere. (I'm not sure if we were in the middle of it).

I focused on doing layout tours. I saw 17 layouts over four days. The best were probably Jim EuDaly's O scale Chesapeake and Ohio and Stephen Priest's HO ATSF, St. Louis Division. Multi-level big steam in O scale in a separate free-standing building is hard to beat. When the scenery almost literally runs from the floor to the ceiling, one feels like he really is in the mountains of West Virginia. Stephen's layout is a classic example of the current style of narrow shelf, multi-deck layouts designed for operation; but in this case designed for photography as well. The despatcher's office even has a TV monitor disguised as a window looking out on the main interlocking location, showing a camera view of what is actually happening there. A third highlight was an HO version of the East Broad Top and the Pennsylvania Railroad including Horseshoe Curve. Imagine finding those (in addition to the C&O) in Kansas/Missouri.


I skipped the railroading one evening to take advantage of a tour to a Kansas City Royals ballgame. They are playing even worse than the Reds, but they rose to the occasion and beat the visiting Chicago Cubs! This was especially sweet given that about half of our tour group were Cubs' fans. I can recommend the foot long Sheboygan brat, and the souvenir cup soft drink, which entitles you to free refills!

I also attended 14 clinics. As a history buff, to me the highlight was the clinic on the cable cars in Kansas City. Yea, who knew? Like in San Francisco and here in Cincinnati, horse cars could not pull the hills; so before electric streetcars, the early solution was cable cars with the cable powered by steam. [You did not know Cincinnati had cable cars? Look it up. History can be fun!] Kansas City had multiple lines and they lasted well in to the Twentieth Century, before being replaced by electric street cars. Speaking of street cars, Kansas City has one very similar to ours (except it is free to ride). This was the way to get from the hotel to the National Train Show on Saturday and Sunday. I chose to ride the whole loop (technically it is point to loop), to see all of downtown and the market district (like Findley Market, sort of) that is the north end of the line.

The Train Show was good. More layouts and more manufacturers, and fewer dealers than our annual train show. Although, I did find a couple of things to buy. They had the world's largest T-Trak set up, reportedly well over 300 modules. Some new items were announced by the manufacturers, but nothing in N scale that I saw so I did not pay much attention. And I have neglected to mention the silent auction and the banquet. Too much to see and not enough space to write about it. But I guess that is the point. A week goes by very quickly.

I hope to see you in West Chester on September 9th.

I don't know if I will deplete a local hobby shop of its stock as John Shields did in KC, but I'll probably put a dent in one! Hope to give a short report on how NNG convention compares to the NMRA's.






LAYOUT VISIT to Roy Allan's F-Scale Layout










LAYOUT VISIT to Jim Stewart's HO Scale Layout





A single photo may be submitted for each listing.



Early on Thursday, August 25th I caught the westbound Cardinal on the first leg of my trip to California. I got a chance to experience AMTRAK'S temporary facility, while Cincinnati Union Terminal is being renovated. The temporary structure is very comfortable and easy to access. Train 51 arrived on time at 1:20 am and I boarded quickly and headed for my bedroom, which was already prepared. I was asleep before we got to Glendale. Breakfast on the Cardinal was their AMTRAK French Toast "(a microwaved item), and then back to my room for a shower.

We arrived in Chicago about 12 minutes late, but since I had a five hour "lay-over", it really wasn't a problem. AMTRAK's new Metropolitan Lounge is at least three times larger than the previous one, plus there were more snacks and even a cash bar. AMTRAK's #3, The Southwest Limited, began boarding at 2:30 for a 3:00 pm departure. I was in bedroom D, which I found was very close to the dining car and lounge (oh goody). We departed promptly at 3:00 and headed west on the BNSF commuter line, and I settled in for my usual enjoyable trip, back in time to the old Super Chief.

The only snag in the trip to California was that a portion of the trackage just south of Lamy, New Mexico was washed out; AMTRAK's solution was unloading the train at Lamy and bussing us to Albuquerque. It was well planned and executed, but it still made us five hours late into Los Angeles, again since I was catching a Metro Link train out to Rancho Cucamonga, it wasn't a problem.

I can tell you from experience that Mr. Anderson's (AMTRAK's new CEO) plan of using buses for part of the Chief is beyond stupid. Thankfully, the Senate had the sense to torpedo that idea. (amazing!) My trip on train 3 was delightful (even with the bus ride), and I will do it again gladly.

The meals on the Chief are prepared on the train, and neither "box lunches' nor microwaved airline fare. I had a really excellent steak on Thursday night, and some excellent seafood on Friday. I see Mr. Anderson (a Delta survivor) would like to curtail dining car service; did I mention that I am not too impressed with Mr. Anderson? More about my AMTRAK adventure next month. By the way, next year I will use the Zephyr to go to the convention.

Everything is up to Date in Kansas City

My next AMTRAK stop was this year's NMRA National Convention in Kansas City. (guess who worked on the musical Oklahoma?). It turned out to be a thoroughly enjoyable experience, thanks to great planning, beautiful weather, and a super venue. The Westin Kansas City was directly across the square from Kansas City Union Terminal. (Talk about convenient). I enjoyed the entire event, from the venue, the super clinics, the many prototype and layout tours, plus the National Train Show. One of my favorite trips was to Abilene, where we visited the Eisenhower home and library. We also rode the Abilene and Smokey Valley Railroad, behind steam. The railroad's main motive power was a 1919 Baldwin product, Santa Fe #3415, a beautifully restored 4-6-2. More about the convention next month. Hopefully, I will still be around for the October *Oil Can*.


