It's an indoor Postal series of matches consisting of 21 matches, shot at the Oneonta Sportsmen's Club. We meet every Monday from 4_{pm} to 6_{pm} all year. .22 calibers rifles are available (if needed). The cost is \$3.00/week for adults and \$1.00 for juniors. Competitors must be a club member. FIVE STAND/SPORTING CLAYS: The "Woods" will be open as soon as weather permits. The Sporting Clays Course is open Sunday mornings (weather permitting) with 23 different shooting traps to choose from. Sporting Clay's participation has picked up so please arrive early in case we need to run multiple squads. When Not in the "Woods", Five Stand is open every Sunday rain or shine.

TRAP/SKEET: Trap and skeet is open every Sunday and Wednesday morning. Field #1 is combination Trap, Skeet and Five Stand. Field #2 is skeet only. Field #3 is combination Trap and Skeet, with the trap machine capable of throwing Singles, Doubles and Wobble. All Trap machines are equipped with wireless voice activated release systems.

PISTOL TEAM: The Team finished the 2024-2025 season in 3rd place out of 6 teams with a 12-8 record and high team score of 1089-16X. Team participation averaged 10 per night with 20 different shooters. Mid-Season the league introduced a "2 Hand Class" for new shooters. Juniors saw 13 different shooters participating. Their season concluded March 16th with a 900 shoot On February 22nd 5 juniors traveled to SCFGPA in New Jersey to compete in NRA Sectionals.
