INTRODUCTION.

Every born-again Christian who knew that there was a spiritual stronghold over their City would wish that it was removed as soon as possible. Complete agreement as to the nature of the stronghold and how to deal with it will probably prove to be elusive.

Gathering information about your City will establish more of a consensus of opinion. If results can be corroborated independently by different intercessors with prophetic insight and others with the gift of discerning of spirits, then we are on the verge of a breakthrough.

Strategic prayer actions, tactics and timing within God's purposes could lead to significant progress of the Kingdom of God. It is not my purpose to present the case for Spiritual Mapping, but to present a tool for carrying it out.

In Level Two of this Project, simply find a piece of information that you feel is relevant and type it in to one of the Reference Sheets to be completed, be sure to include a Keyword at the start of your reference so that a computer sorted Index can be generated if you so wish.

In the File or Book code column choose a three-letter code to identify your File source if it is an extract from a book or periodical, use FIL for this purpose. Add a page code using a three digit system e. g. 001 for page 1 to give a six character code such as FIL001.

For a book, choose a three-letter code from the title, e.g. Kirkby the City page 154 would become KTC154 and so on. Avoid using the letter "O" if possible, to avoid confusion with the number 0 (zero). Keep a separate table of Book codes and one of File articles that you have allocated for quick reference. Source and page number are vital so that references can be checked and validated later.

In the first column allocate a Question Code from the sixty-three questions provided. This seems a daunting task but after several readings of the question list I can assure you that it does become a lot easier. This system can be used without completing the first column.

You may enter the References and File or Book Codes at one time and complete the question codes at any other date if you so wish. One person may complete the Question Codes whilst another is working on References and File or Book Codes. Many References can be added under any Question and the work will simply increase as you proceed. This approach is suitable where larger volumes of information are anticipated. Level Three provides for even larger studies and is probably only suitable for experienced users of Microsoft Word.

Whichever approach is chosen, information should be passed on to Intercessors and a team of people with Prophetic ability and Discerning of spirits for guidance on Prayer Actions, Strategies and Timing.

It is recommended that any potential user reads through the introductions to Level One, Level Two and Level Three before deciding which one is most appropriate to use. The advantages of higher levels should become apparent and will allow for greater expansion of data in a manageable form.

Take careful note of the "Rules for taking a City" which follow the questions.

A separate table of sources of information should be kept, stating author, title, printer, and ISBN of all Books used. A similar table should be kept for File articles. Suitable tables are provided below.

Tables are also provided for lists of Researchers and Intercessors.

The Questions and a worked example of a Reference Sheet are provided. Reference sheets may be photocopied for use in Libraries or at home, information can be transferred to computer tables at your convenience. The Reference Sheets can be extended by inserting rows using the Table pulldown window.

Please note that if a second Reference Sheet Table is started then of course it will be not sort as one table. Tables should be continuous. If you make a mistake in this, it is, of course, possible to cut and paste from one table to another.

I. THE HISTORY OF THE CITY

A. *The Founding of the City.*

HIA01 - Who were the people who founded the City?

HIA02 – (i) What was the personal or corporate reason for founding the City?
(ii) What were their beliefs and philosophies?
(iii) What was their vision for the future of the City?

HIA03 – (i) What was the significance of the original name of the City?
(ii) Has the name been changed?
(iii) Are there other names or popular designations for the City?
(iv) - Do these names have any meaning? Eg.
Are they linked to religion of any sort?
Are they demonic or occultic names?
Do they signify blessing or curse?
Do they highlight the City's redemptive gift?
Do they reflect the character of the people of the City?

B. *The Later History of the City,*

HIB01 - What role has the City played in the life and character of the nation as a whole?

HIB02 - As prominent leaders have emerged in the City, what was their vision for their City?

HIB03 - Have any radical changes taken place in the government or political leadership of the City?

HIB04 - Have there been significant or sudden changes in the economic life of the City?
Famine?
Depression?
Technology?
Industry?
Discovery of natural resources?

HIB05 – (i) What significant immigration has occurred?
(ii) Was there ever an imposition of a new language or culture on the City as a whole?

HIB06 – (i) How have the immigrants been treated?
(ii) How have races or ethnic groups related to one another?
(iii) Have City laws legitimised racism of any kind?

HIB07 - Have City leaders broken any treaties, contracts or covenants?

HIB08 – (i) Have any wars directly affected the City?
(ii) Were any battles fought in the City?
(iii) Was there any bloodshed?

HIB09 – (i) How has the City treated the poor and oppressed?
(ii) Has greed characterised City leaders?
(iii) Is there evidence of corruption among political, economic or religious leaders and institutions?

HIB10 - What natural disasters have affected the City?

HIB11 - Does the City have a motto or slogan? What is its meaning?

HIB12 – (i) What kinds of music do the people listen to?
(ii) What is the message they receive from that music?

HIB13 – (i) What five words would most people in the City use to characterise the positive features of the City today?

A. *Non-Christian Religion*

HIIA01 - What were the religious views and practices of the people who inhabited the area before the City was founded?

HIIA02 - Were religious considerations important in the founding of the City?

HIIA03 - Have any Non -Christian religions entered the City in significant proportions?

HIIA04 - What secret orders (such as Freemasonry) have been present in the City?

HIIA05 - What witches` covens, Satanist groups or other such cults have operated in the City?

B. *Christianity*

HIIB01 – (i) When, if ever, did Christianity enter the City?
(ii) Under what circumstances?

HIIB02 - Have any of the early or later Christian leaders been Freemasons?

HIIB03 – (i) What role has the Christian community played in the life of the City as a whole?
(ii) Have there been changes in this?

HIIB04 - Is Christianity in the City growing, plateaued or declining?

C. *Relationships*

HIIC01 - Has there ever been conflict between religions in the City?

HIIC02- Has there been conflict between Christians?

HIIC03 - What is the history of the church splits in the City?

PHYSICAL RESEARCH

- P01 - Locate different maps of the City, especially the older ones.
What changes have taken place in the physical characteristics of the City?
- P02 - Who were the City planners who designed the City?
Were any Freemasons?
- P03 - Are there any significant discernible designs or symbols embedded in the original plan or layout of the City?
- P04 - Is there any significance in the architecture, location or positional relationship of the central buildings, especially those representing the political, economic, educational or religious powers in the City?
Did Freemasons lay any of the cornerstones?
- P05 – (i) Has there been any historical significance in the particular plot of land upon which one or more of these buildings are located?
(ii) Who originally owned this land?
- P06- (i) What is the background of the City's parks and plazas?
(ii) Who commissioned and funded them?
(iii) What significance might their names have?
- P07 – (i) What is the background and possible significance of the statues and monuments of the City?
(ii) Do any reflect demonic characteristics or glorify the creature rather than the Creator?
- P08 – (i) What other artwork is featured in the City, especially on or in public buildings, museums or theatres?
(ii) Look especially for sensual or demonic art.
- P09 – (i) Are there any prominent archaeological sites in the City?
(ii) What meaning might they have?
- P10 - What is the location of highly visible centres of sin such as abortion clinics, bookstores or theatres, areas of prostitution, gambling, taverns, homosexual activities, etc.?
- P11 - Where are the areas that concentrate greed, exploitation, poverty, discrimination, violence, disease or frequent accidents?
- P12 - Where are locations of past or present bloodshed through massacre, war or murder?
- P13 - Does the position of trees, hills, stones, or rivers form any apparently significant pattern?
- P14 - Do certain landmarks of the City have names that would not glorify God?
- P15 - What is the highest geographical point in the City and what is built or located there?
This can be a statement of authority?
- P16 - Which zones or sectors of neighbourhoods of your City seem to have characteristics of their own?
Attempt to discern areas of the City that seem to have different spiritual environments.

SPIRITUAL RESEARCH

A. Non -Christian

SA01 - What are the names of the principal deities or territorial spirits associated with the City past or present?

SA02 - What are the locations of high places, alters, temples, monuments or buildings associated with witchcraft, occult, fortune-telling, Satanism, Freemasonry, Mormonism, Eastern religions, Jehovah's Witnesses and the like.
Do these form any patterns when plotted on a map?

SA03 - What are the sites of pagan worship from the past, even before the City was founded?

SA04 - What are the different cultural centres that might contain art or artefacts connected with pagan worship?

SA05 - Has any City leader knowingly dedicated himself or herself to any pagan god or a principality?

SA06 - Were any known curses placed by the original inhabitants on the land or people who founded the City?

B. Christian

SB01 - How have God's messengers been received by the City?

SB02 - Has evangelism been easy or hard?

SB03 – (i) Where are the churches located?
(ii) Which of them would you see as "life giving" churches?

SB04 - What is the health of the churches in the City?

SB05 - Who are the Christian leaders considered as "elders of the City"?

SB06 - Is it easy to pray in all areas of the City?

SB07 - What is the status of unity among Christian leaders across ethnic and denominational lines?

SB08 - What is the view of City leaders toward Christian morality?

C. Revelation

SC01 - What are the recognised, mature intercessors hearing from God concerning the City?

SC02 - What is the identity of the ranking principalities seemingly in control of the City as a whole or certain areas of the City's life or territory?

STEP TWO: ACTING ON THE INFORMATION

RULES FOR TAKING A CITY

Rule 1: The Area

Select a manageable geographical area with discernible spiritual boundaries.

Rule 2: The Pastors

Secure the unity of the pastors and other Christian leaders in the area and begin to pray together on a regular basis.

Rule 3: The Body of Christ

Project a clear image that the effort is not an activity simply of Pentecostals and Charismatic, but of the whole Body of Christ.

Rule 4: The Spiritual Preparation

Assure the spiritual preparation of participating leaders and other Christians through repentance, humility, and holiness.

Rule 5: The Research

Research the historical background of the City in order to reveal spiritual forces shaping the City. (This was covered in the first part of this chapter: "Gathering the Information.")

Rule 6: The Intercessors

Work with intercessors especially gifted and called to strategic-level spiritual warfare, seeking God's revelation of:

- (a) the redemptive gift or gifts of the City;
- (b) Satan's strongholds in the City;
- (c) territorial spirits assigned to the City;
- (d) corporate sin past and present that needs to be dealt with;
- (e) God's plan of attack and timing.
