Make a sunflower, which turns its head to follow the sun.

What you need:

- Paper plate
- Yellow marker
- Scissors
- Yarn (black and brown)


What you do:

- 1. Color the entire plate yellow.
- 2. Around the edge, cut out an odd number of triangles. Evenly space the cuts to form flower petals.
- 3. Poke a hole in the plate's center. String black yarn through the hole and over one triangle cut. Tie a knot at the back of the plate.
- 4. Continue looping yarn through the hole and over the remaining cuts. Secure the end. The flower should look like a wagon wheel with black spokes.
- 5. Tie the brown yarn to a black "spoke." Weave the brown yarn over and under the spokes in a circle.

 Continue until the sunflower has a large center.

 Then tie the end.
- 6. Display your craft as a reminder to follow the Son, Jesus!

See light, be light...



In January 2021, National Youth Poet Laureate Amanda Gorman presented her poem "The Hill We Climb" at the presidential inauguration. The final lines read: "For there is always light, / if only we're brave enough to see it. / If only we're brave enough to be it."

How often we long for light! In recent years we've agonized amid pandemic, angry politics and new awareness of racism. Some have suffered deep sorrow. But Jesus says, "I am the light of the world" (John 8:12) and invites us to turn to him. God is always bringing light into darkness, through helpers, healers, peacemakers, friends. Sometimes bravery is required to turn our focus from the negative to the positive — to see the light of God.

Jesus also says, "You are the light of the world" (Matthew 5:14, emphasis added) and calls us to brighten the gloom. That requires bravery, as Gorman notes, but as Christians we're urged to look for light not just to make our own lives better but to shine into others' lives too. The Holy Spirit gives us the needed courage — to both *see* and *be* light.

The year 2020 was a strange, troubling, life-altering, and enlightening year for all of us. So many changes were brought about because of COVID, and businesses, schools, and churches were greatly impacted. But now, life is moving toward a more normal existence.

That said, the Emma Fink Sunday Class has been looking toward the 2021 Cabarrus County Fair. As you know, there was no fair last year, but we heard on May 3 that, at this time, there will be a fair this year. The Cold Springs fair booth began 27 years ago when Darrell Long asked to have a booth at the old fair grounds to help finance a building team trip. That small booth has evolved into what we have today. The members of the church who spearheaded and worked that booth were much younger than they are today. It is with mixed feelings that the Emma Fink Class has made the difficult decision that we need to give up our long outreach mission of heading the fair booth because many of us are physically unable to continue because of limitations that age has placed on many of us.

The money generated by the booth has benefited people in the Cold Springs community, the Mt. Pleasant area, each of the Mt. Pleasant Schools, Cabarrus County, and members of Cold Springs over the years. We ask that the church members, church groups, and church classes prayerfully consider stepping into the leadership position and continuing the Cold Springs Food Booth at the fair. If anyone decides to take on this outreach, the Emma Fink Class will mentor you during the 2021 fair in any way you would want or need. This decision must be made by June 6. Sadly, if no one feels led to take on this outreach, there will no longer be a food booth from Cold Springs at the fair.

While in London, Timothy Merrill was intrigued that signs with arrows read WAY OUT, rather than EXIT, as they do in America. "Everywhere I went, signs that showed me WAY OUT," he writes. That made him ponder all the Bible characters who looked for a WAY OUT of predicaments. Moses looked for a WAY OUT Egypt, Daniel certainly wanted a WAY OUT of the lions' den and countless people thought (and still think) there's no WAY OUT from their sins.

"The good news of the Gospel," Merrill writes, "is that Jesus Christ is the WAY OUT! He is our exit from the messes and disasters we create. He is the exit from sin and unright-eousness. He is the WAY OUT of a life without purpose and the WAY IN to an abundant life. And the symbol of the WAY OUT is not an arrow but a cross.
