Don't use summer as an excuse to skip church! By gathering in corporate worship, we obey God's command, become equipped for Christian living, and minister to our fellow pilgrims. Consider these tips for engaging in corporate worship.

Come prepared. Do you need to confess anything or remove any hindrance? As you worship, consider how each part of the service displays the gospel: greeting, singing, confessing, reading Scripture, hearing Biblebased teaching, praying, giving and communing.

Be careful not to compartmentalize corporate worship as separate from the rest of life. Instead, consider how you'll carry the experience into the coming week. Come ready to receive; then let that overflow fuel you for the days ahead. Come prepared to participate, knowing that worshiping together is a rehearsal for heaven. But most importantly? Just come.

and we saw the changing of the guard at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier as well as President Kennedy's grave and the eternal fame. We also saw a military funeral in progress and learned that there are 25 to 30 funerals each day. Full Day 1 was a walk of the monuments including The Washington, the Lincoln, World War II, Korean, Martin Luther King and Vietnam where they did a rubbing of a soldier's name as a memory. Their challenge was to find the word GOD, scripture or reference to freedom of religion. The afternoon was spent at the Holocaust museum for a very somber time of reflec-Day 2 was the Natural History Smithsonian and the American History Smithsonian. It was "history" but they enjoyed it. We walked to the White House and were surprised that the only barriers currently around it were the permanent black fencing so they were able to get good pictures. Day 3 was the Air and Space museum at Dulles Airport which houses hundreds of planes in huge hangers. These planes were flown in many wars or have other historical value. learned to navigate the Metro and we rode the 2nd tallest escalator in the WORLD twice. Our Circle Time each night brought lots of conversation. They realized there was so much more to see and learn and we told them that this might be their first visit to DC but we were sure it would not be the last.



We completed a service project on April 30th at Jane Wiley's house. Since she has been unable to work in her yard due to her shoulder injury, we pulled weeds, trimmed shrubbery and cut limbs. We are always looking for a ser-

vice project once a month. In the past, we have tied blankets for children who might be homeless and gave about 25 to the Salvation Army.


ample rather than focusing on revenge.

"Sadder still is when entire churches are disrupted by petty squabbles, partisan politics and overzealous opinions," he writes. "Relationships have been ruptured, marriages dissolved and families torn apart due to a harsh response to hurts instead of a spirit of forgiveness and an attitude of reconciliation."

Christians may sometimes feel tempted to seek payback, but Jesus calls us to live differently. "We need to be reminded that we are to be a transformed people, not conformed to the attitudes and actions of this world (Romans 12:1-2)," says Weliever. "To be light in a world of darkness. And to be the pure, preserving salt in a society that's become corrupted and impure (Matthew 5:13-16)."










JESUS' FAMILY TREE


Matthew records a timeline of Jesus' family dating back to Abraham. Do you know who is in Jesus' family tree?
