




Milkhouse or Room Cleaning Facilities; Cleanliness: DEBIT #32

Milk and equipment properly protected



DEBIT #71

 All milkhouse openings effectively screened or otherwise protected; doors tight and self-closing; screen doors open outward

Utensils and Equipment Storage:

Single-service articles properly stored

DATCP AND DNR WELL CONSISTENCY

- 50 foot set back per PMO vs NR 812 requirements
- Compliance reports –

EXAMPLE: COMPLIANCE OF SPRING BOXES AND NON-PRESSURIZED STORAGE VESSELS

- Requirements
- Reality
- Bringing farms into compliance

EXAMPLES: COMMUNICATION TO IMPROVE CORRELATION

- Top 10 list of debits in inspections and surveys
- Outreach at Dairy Plant Field Representatives meeting
- Outreach at Milk Haulers Association meeting
- Blast e-mails on key topics
- Mutual expectations for milk producers and sanitarians

COMPUTER-AIDED EFFICIENCY GAINS

- Electronic coversheets for farm inspections
 - Shout out to MSRO Bob Carrier!
 - Program started in May
 - E-mail and print copies
 - Looming issue? printers in winter

COMPUTER-AIDED EFFICIENCY GAINS

- Sign ups for bulk milk weigher sampler inspections
 - At county fairgrounds
 - Summer 2019
 - Cost savings!



COMPUTER-AIDED EFFICIENCY GAINS: IN PROGRESS

- New Department-wide electronic management system
 - Conversion from "legacy" system
 - External: on-line licensing
 - Internal: inspection dates, compliance
 - Complex!

CALCULATIONS, CURRENT AND PLANNED

- Inspection frequency vs. survey scores
 - Evaluation in ca. 2012 showed best mean score with 2 x per year inspection
 - Evaluation of 2016-2018 data set showed number of inspections in preceding year weakly correlated with number of debits in next inspection
 - Average survey score vs. percentage of farms requiring reinspection, for each sanitarian

CALCULATIONS, CURRENT AND PLANNED

- Create visual and numerical consistency between regulatory farm inspection and surveys
- Percentage of inspections done during milking time for program and each sanitarian
- Percentage of inspections resulting in a reinspection, for program and each sanitarian
