





Arizona is the 48th state - achieving statehood on February 14, 1912 The Grand Canyon State - also known as the Copper State

Arizona is large enough to fit all of New England plus the state of Pennsylvania inside of it.




Arizona Doesn't Follow Daylight Savings Time

- Stay Hydrated


Drink plenty of water throughout the day Avoid alcohol and drinks with high caffeine or sugar
