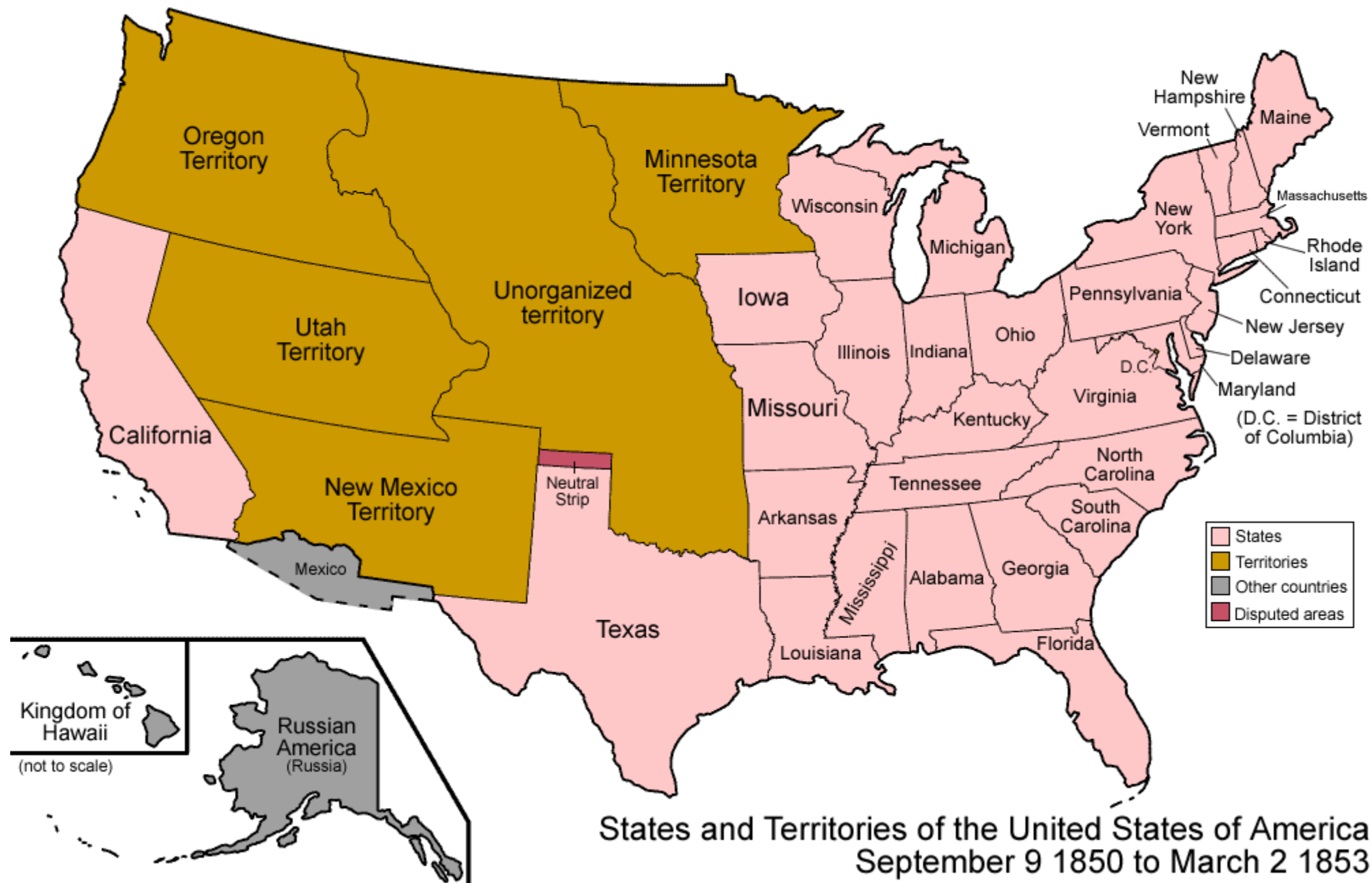
ABOUT ARIZONA

Arizona is the 48th state - achieving statehood on February 14, 1912

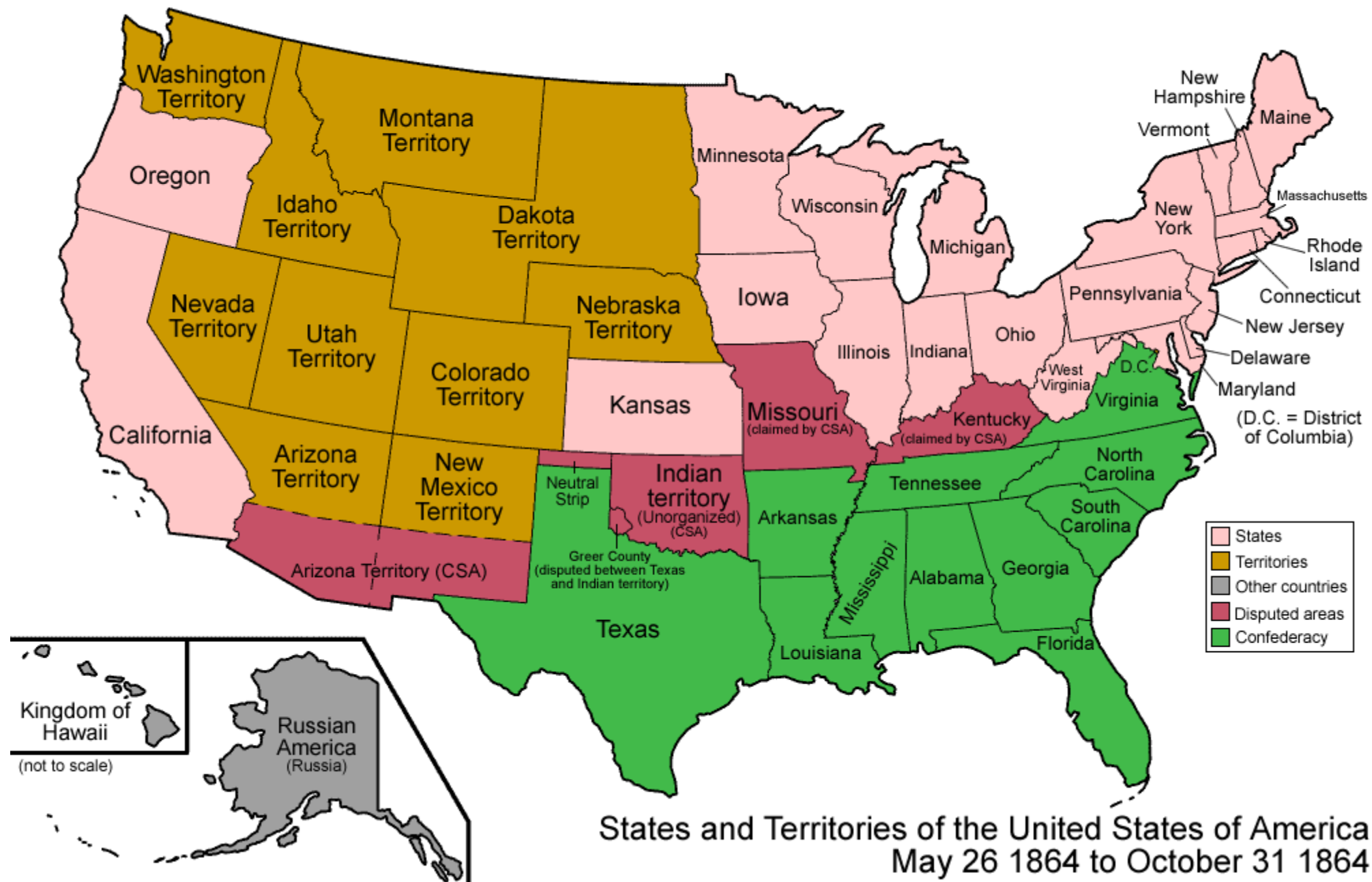
The Grand Canyon State - also known as the Copper State

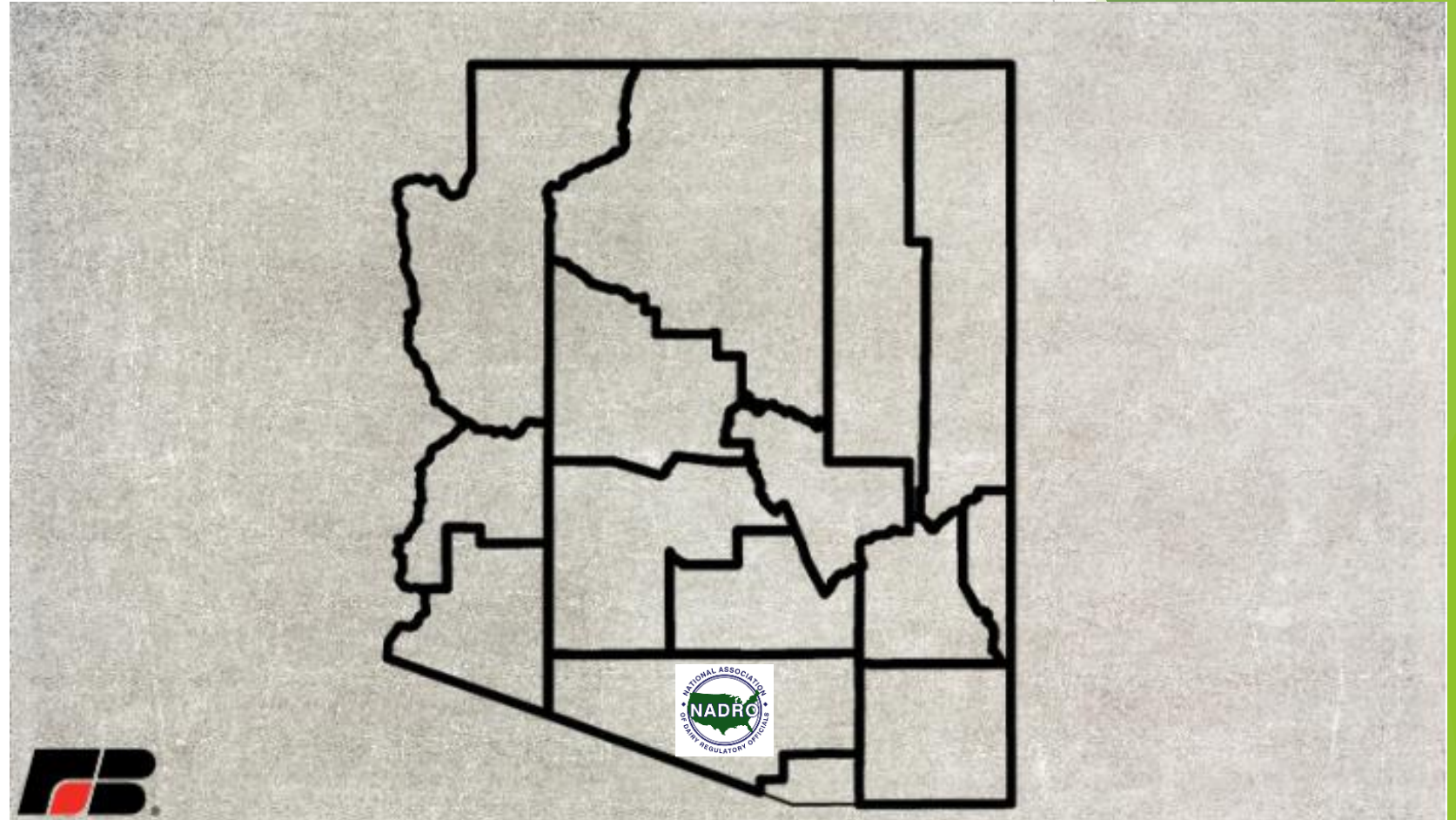

Arizona is large enough to fit all of New England plus the state of Pennsylvania inside of it.

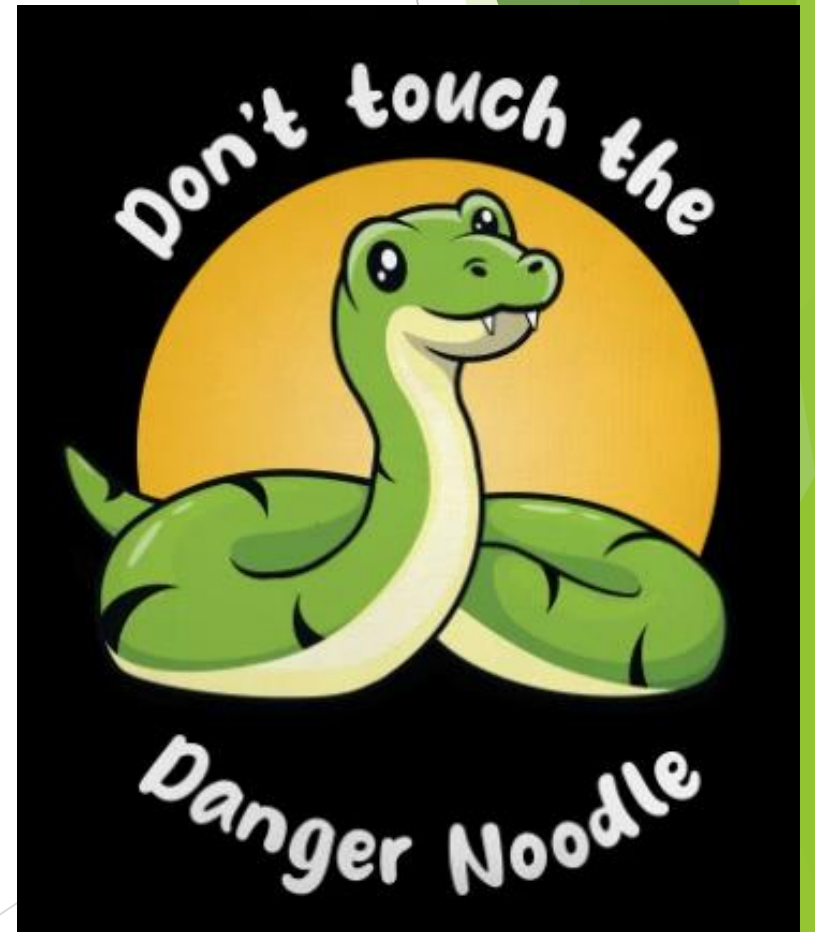


Arizona Doesn't Follow

The Grand Canyon National Park is one of the Seven Natural Wonders of the World, and the only one located within the United States.





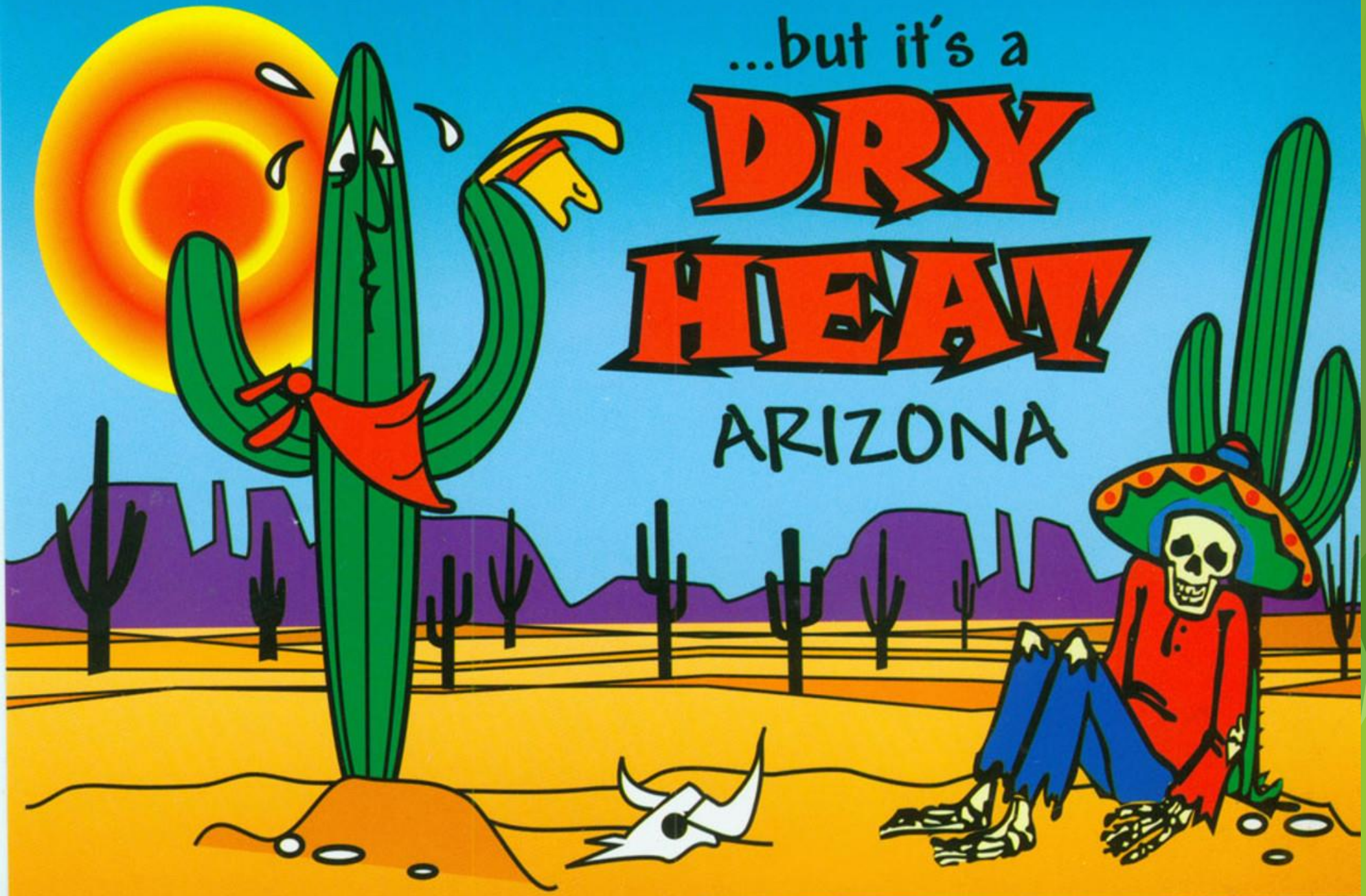
