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



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

Priority (P) are SROs past due or coming due in 2022.

Current (C) are SROs that will be coming due in 2023 and later.



• That is a Substantial Commitment in Time and Resources from our State Partners.



Milk / Shellfish Cooperative Agreement CY 2020-2024 Sub-awards



Cooperative Agreement: Summary of Key Details

- 5 Years of Funding CY 2020 thru CY 2024
 - \$2.8 million for Year 1;
 - \$3 million per year projected for remaining years
- 75% of funds must go to State, Tribal, Territorial, DC jurisdictions -
 - \$2.1 million for Year 1;
 - \$2.25 million for years 2-5
 - ➤ The budget for each year includes \$25,000 sub-awards for ISSC and NCIMS

- **❖** Training \$1,277,275
- ❖ Special training:
 - o NCIMS: \$203,943
 - o State Hosted & FD375: \$124,685
 - o FD577: \$7,558
- **❖** Milk Sampling Assignment:

Shellfish Awarded Funding

- **Training \$511,322**

Equipment:

- ➤ Available funding for equipment
- >~\$1,186,000
- ➤ Currently have ~\$1,000,000 being requested in combined programs



Possible Rollover to FY24:

> ~\$200,000



Ideas to move forward

Pros?

- \$25,000 for equipment, possibly increase this amount for a special expenditure
- Limit to 5 states per year
- Course in a box request
- Milk related State staff meetings
- University courses

Cons?

- Must be topic/program specific and not general use
- Creates competition
- Adds to MS work sched



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

Dr. Califf's Public Statement

"With a human food landscape that is rapidly evolving as consumer preferences, products, and manufacturing processes grow increasingly complex and public health needs increase, the FDA must build a stronger Human Foods Program and Office of Regulatory Affairs. Earlier this year the FDA announced steps to modernize and streamline our food program, including field operations, to address these mounting challenges," said FDA Commissioner Robert M. Califf, M.D. "Listening closely to feedback provided by employees and stakeholders, our thinking has significantly broadened. We know that in front of us is a once-in-ageneration opportunity to unify our field work with the priorities of program offices and Centers.
