New Administration and HHS/FDA



Issue: Deregulation, government downsizing, budget reductions/restrictions, major HHS/FDA reorganizations *slow federal policymaking*, while States fill the void *creating chaos*.

Why this Matters: Potential to Inhibit industry's ability to innovate, adopt new technologies, and use new and novel ingredients.









White House OMB Request for Information

- Issue: OMB RFI solicits ideas for deregulation, IDFA submitted comments May 12; HHS also solicits ideas for deregulation, IDFA submitted comments July 13.
- Why this Matters: Opportunity to drive smart policymaking that directly impacts dairy
- Comment Recommendations
 - Rescind Parts of Preamble in Yogurt SOI Final Rule
 - Update Dairy SOIs to Permit UF/MF/NF Milk and Permit it to be Called Milk in Ingredient Statements on Product Labels
 - Review Food Traceability Final Rule
 - Revoke Recordkeeping Requirements for Hydrolyzed/Fermented Foods w/ "Gluten-Free" Claims
 - Rescind USDA cuts to the family WIC milk allotment





What Is Make America Healthy Again?

Began as a political action committee (PAC) in September 2024

 To advance "the health-focused policies championed by Robert F. Kennedy Jr. (RFK Jr.) through the reelection of President Donald J. Trump" – MAHA PAC

Aligns strongly with:

- Reducing corporate influence in public health & environmental policy
- 2. Eliminating harmful chemicals from food, water, & air
- 3. Reducing chronic disease, especially in children
- 4. Project 2025 priorities to restructure key public health agencies (FDA, CDC)

IDFA's New Member Commitments





- Eliminate: Red 3, Red 40, Green 3, Blue 1, Blue 2, Yellow 5, and Yellow 6
- <u>In</u>: All milk, cheese and yogurt products sold to K-12 schools for use in the National School Lunch Program and/or School Breakfast Program
- By: Start of 2026/2027 school year



- <u>Eliminate</u>: Red 3, Red 40, Green 3, Blue 1, Blue 2, Yellow 5, and Yellow 6
- <u>In</u>: Ice cream products made with real milk
- **By**: Dec. 31, 2027

IDFA's MAHA State Legislative Advocacy



- States defining "ultra processed food" using food and color additives as a proxy for processing
- Impacts business costs, competition, R&D costs, food safety, and quality

Ban certain foods and certified colors in schools

IDFA Continues to Lead FDA Foods Coalition



- IDFA led FDA Foods Coalition resumes quarterly meetings with FDA's Human Foods Program leaders
- Why this Matters: Provides opportunities to raise issues & inform/drive smart policymaking that we would not otherwise have
- Key Takeaways of April 17 Meeting:
 - Food microbiological safety**, food chemical safety & nutrition remain policy priorities
 - Increase domestic and foreign food facility inspections
 - New domestic inspection model under development
 - Embracing Ai & leveraging third-party audit system to work smarter
 - No regulations identified for rescission

Coalition Workstream Priorities

- Advocate on planned FDA reorganizations
- Advocate for adequate funding/resources/expertise for Human Foods Program
- Inform and drive GRAS, inspection, and recall modernization



Food Safety: Cronobacter Controls



Infant Formula & Cronobacter Still in Spotlight

- IDFA Cronobacter Working Group
 - Follow-up FDA meeting cancelled due to communications freeze
 - FDA contacted to reschedule, agency willing pending indicator organism method review
- Meeting with Biomerieux
 - Initiative to develop a private database for Cronobacter WGS to expand knowledge on this bacteria; opportunity for IDFA members to participate in a working group
- March 2025: FDA Announced Operation Stork Speed
 - To accelerate the review of new infant formula submissions
 - Address ongoing concerns about contaminants including heavy metals in infant formula

Food Safety: Lm Coalition & Pilot Program



Improve Flexibility and Safety

- Collaboration with American Frozen Food Institute continues.
- Achieve better public health outcomes by:
 - Elevating food contact surface environmental monitoring.
 - Non-zero tolerance finished product sampling program.
- Developed a Pilot Program; FDA Meetings 12/24 and 1/25
- Nutritional Shake Recall Causes FDA to Rethink Pilot and Non-Zero Tolerance Policy for Lm 2/25
- Revised Pilot Program Launch 5/2
- Concurrently IDFA to Provide EMP Best Practices/New Sampling Models through Webinars; May Engage in Mentoring, EMP Reviews

- Proposed 30 Month Delay
- FDA realization that it was not implementable
- Partnership for Food Traceability
 - Interoperability Challenges
 - Data Transfer Challenges
 - Pilot Studies Industry Partners
- OMB/HHS Deregulation RFIs: IDFA Commented to Review this Rule




Implications Beyond Regulations

Foundation for Safe Dairy Processing

- Brings together equipment manufacturers, dairy processors, and regulators to set standards for hygienic design.
- Certifies inspectors and licenses symbol.
- 3-A standards required in PMO.
- Founding members: IDFA, IAFP, FPSA, and USDA/FDA
- IDFA is Vice Chair of Board, sits on TPV Committee
- Expanding to Other Food Sectors
