County Curbside Waste is regulated by the Tennessee Department of Environment and Conservation. So for environmental, legal, and safety reasons, there are certain items/materials that are unacceptable to dispose of in your garbage can.

## **Unacceptable Materials**

- Aerosol cans
- · All liquids
- · Ammunition, fireworks
- Animals
- Antifreeze
- Appliances or appliance parts
- Asbestos
- Ashes, hot or cold
- · Barrels
- Batteries
- Chemical products
- Concrete
- · Contaminated oil (mixed with solvents, gasoline, etc.)
- Dehumidifiers
- · Electronics: computers, radios, TVs, etc.
- · Dirt
- · Fluorescent light tubes
- · Hazardous waste
- · Herbicides & pesticides
- · Items containing Freon: Refrigerator, Air Conditioner, etc.
- Items containing lead
- · Items containing mercury
- · Industrial waste
- · Lubricating/hydraulic oil
- Medical waste
- · Microwaves
- Monitors
- Motor oil
- · Oil filters
- · Other flammable liquids
- Paint (except completely dried latex paint cans, no liquids)
- · Petroleum-contaminated soil/lead paint chips
- Propane tanks
- Radioactive material
- Railroad ties
- Solvents
- · Tires
- Transmission oil
- Yard waste: if not bagged
