We seek your response regarding 6 points in your press release:

5.	Your original announcement of the transaction on 7 th May 2024 also included a commitment that Browns "will pay an above-market premium to Kenyan smallholders offering double what farmers would previously have received securing a substantial uplift in farmers' livelihoods."	There is no mention of this commitment in your 3 rd April 2025 press release. Our local understanding from smallholders in Kericho is that there has been no evidence to show that this commitment has been met. Please explain.
6.	"LIPTON Teas and Infusions and Browns are appointing independent experts to listen to the needs of local people"	The views of the local community – including local community organisations, major local co-operatives and SACCOs and local county government - were clearly expressed to the Board of Lipton on 1 st May 2024 (see attached). These views were ignored. The issue of historic injustices relating to community land remains unresolved. Please explain.
