Governor Kathy Hochul unveiled her first State of the State proposals outlining new steps to strengthen online safety for children and address the youth mental health crisis across New York State. The proposals build on existing efforts to protect young people from online predators, scammers, and harmful artificial intelligence features integrated into digital platforms. The legislative package includes new protections aimed at reducing risks posed by social media and online gaming platforms, along with a first-of-its-kind statewide expansion of Teen Mental Health First Aid training designed to equip young people with tools to recognize and respond to mental health and substance use challenges among their peers.

These initiatives build on Governor Hochul's previous actions, including banning smartphones in schools, enacting social media warning labels, restricting addictive online features, and creating safeguards against harmful AI companions. Her administration has also expanded school-based mental health clinics, community-based treatment programs, and peer support services for youth and adults.

"As New York's first mom Governor, the well-being and safety of our children has always been one of my top priorities, and today we are continuing to break new ground to give our kids the tools and safeguards they need to contend with the unprecedented mental health challenges and real world dangers that can sometimes be a byproduct of navigating today's digital world," Governor Hochul said. "These proposals will create a nation-leading standard that will ensure our kids' safety in online and real world environments where they spend time."

Multiple lawsuits and investigations have alleged that online platforms have failed to take adequate steps to protect children, allowing users worldwide to communicate freely and increasing the risk of grooming, abuse, and exposure to violent or inappropriate content, including material related to suicide. Governor Hochul's proposed legislation would introduce expanded age verification requirements, including for online gaming platforms. The measures would require the highest privacy settings by default for children, disable certain AI chatbot features for minors, and mandate parental controls that allow limits on children's financial transactions. Location services would be turned off by default, and children under 13 would need parental approval to add new connections.

The Governor will also propose making Teen Mental Health First Aid training available to all 10th-grade students statewide. The program would be phased in to reach more than 180,000 students annually, with the goal of ensuring that most high school students eventually receive the training.

Research shows that teens often turn first to peers when experiencing mental health or substance use challenges. With proper training, young people can identify warning signs and respond in ways that improve and even save lives. The training focuses on recognizing mental health and substance use challenges, understanding the impact of bullying and school violence, engaging in meaningful conversations, seeking help from trusted adults, and practicing self-care.

The state will also offer Youth Mental Health First Aid training for adults who regularly interact with young people in schools and community programs, using a nationally recognized curriculum that addresses adolescent development and a five-step action plan for assisting youth in both crisis and non-crisis situations.

These proposals build on broader statewide initiatives, including the SAFE for Kids Act, the Child Data Protection Act, AI Companion safeguards, the Unplug and Play Agenda, the Distraction Free Learning Policy, and warning labels required on social media platforms.

Governor Hochul's \$1 billion mental health initiative, along with additional funding in subsequent budgets, has expanded access to care by increasing in-patient and residential capacity and strengthening community-based services that allow youth to remain at home.

New York now supports 1,300 school-based mental health clinic satellites, up from 872 in 2020, covering 25 percent of public schools statewide. The state also funds 42 Youth Assertive Community Treatment teams, with 23 currently operational across 31 counties, and 65 Home-Based Crisis Intervention teams serving youth ages 5 to 20.

Governor Hochul established the Youth Mental Health Advisory Board, a 30-member panel of youth ages 11 to 17, and expanded Youth Safe Spaces programs for young people ages 12 to 24. With input from the advisory board, the Office of Mental Health awarded \$7.5 million to establish four new Youth Safe Spaces sites this fall and is soliciting proposals for additional locations to be awarded early next year.

- 6. Improve your health:** Poor mental health is linked to various medical issues, including poor sleep, obesity, digestive problems, and other illnesses. Seeking help minimizes the risk of developing other health conditions which can make things much worse.
- 7. Restore some balance:** Mental health treatment brings about balance in people’s lives and recovery. Counseling is therapy through which people can achieve tools and techniques for controlling their stress. A person with the proper help is then enabled to handle their problems without relapsing.
- 8. Increase your self-esteem:** Mental health problems can lead to low self-esteem. A mental health professional can help you improve your self-esteem and develop a positive outlook on life. Therapy can significantly boost self-esteem by helping individuals identify and challenge negative thought patterns, cultivate self-compassion, and develop a stronger sense of self-worth and confidence.
- 9. You will be in a supportive environment:** You will have people in your corner who will be able to help improve your mental health issues. You won’t feel alone when attempting to manage your fears. It is best to be with others who are supportive and who will understand your situation. This will make things easier when it comes to your fears and anxieties.
- 10. It’s an investment in yourself:** Therapy can equip you with the tools and strategies to navigate life’s challenges and setbacks, fostering personal growth and self-improvement. It is a way to invest in your future and create a healthier and happier life.

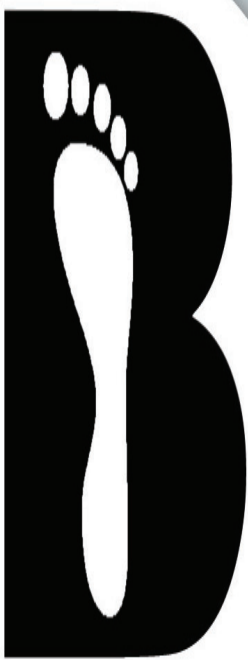

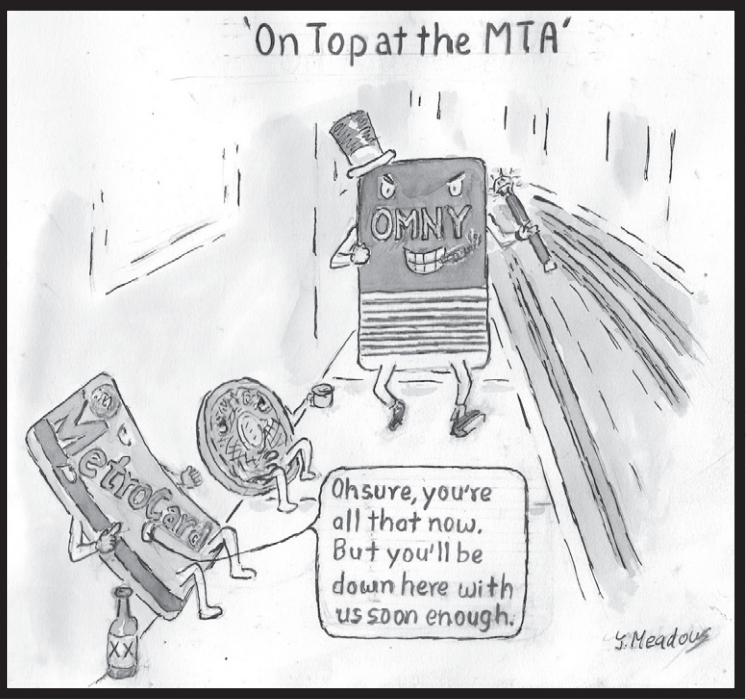
