

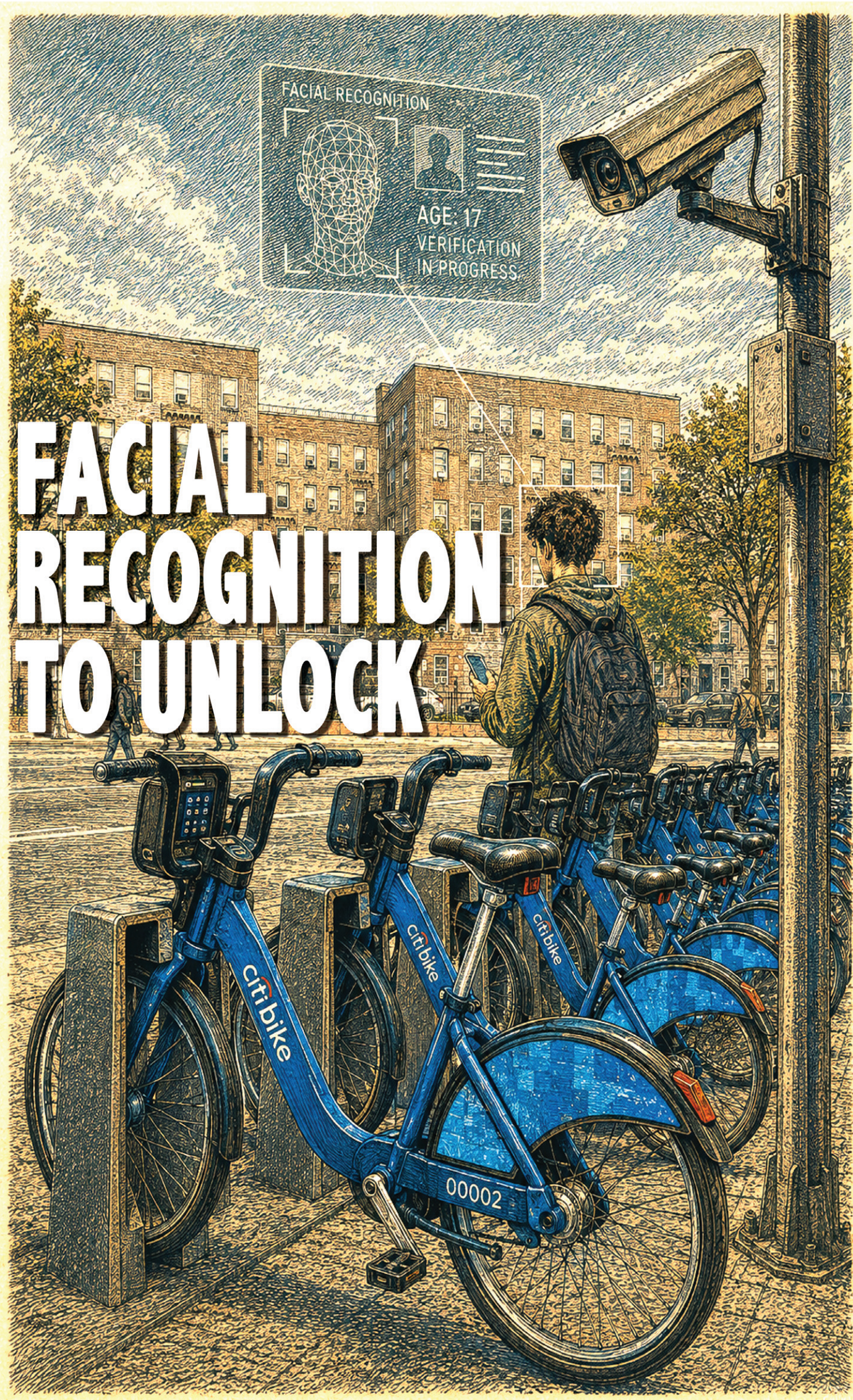

FACIAL RECOGNITION TO UNLOCK

MAMDANI ADMINISTRATION ASKS LYFT NOT TO USE FACIAL RECOGNITION FOR CITI BIKE AGE CHECKS

The Mamdani administration has asked Lyft not to move forward with a plan to use facial-recognition technology to verify the age of Citi Bike riders, citing privacy, accuracy and bias concerns, according to sources and a City Hall spokesman.

City officials are concerned the system could put riders' personally identifying information at risk if it were hacked, spokesman Jeremy Edwards said in a statement. The administration has also raised concerns about facial recognition's tendency to misidentify younger users and about possible racial bias, sources said.

Lyft had been examining biometric screening, using photos or videos of prospective riders' faces, as part of an age-verification system for Citi Bike. The effort stemmed from an Adams administration-era push to keep riders under 16 off the bike-share system.

Lyft first said in August that it would require age verification after a request from then-Mayor Eric Adams' administration. Adams' first deputy mayor, Randy Mastro, had directed the company to find a way to keep underage riders off Citi Bikes.

Both Mastro and venture capitalist and political strategist Bradley Tusk had suggested using government-issued identification to verify riders' ages. A Lyft spokesman said riders who did not upload IDs — or who, like many minors, did not have one — would have had their age verified through a selfie.

The Mamdani administration's intervention leaves uncertain whether the bike-share program will proceed with age verification at all. As an Assembly member, Mamdani was a critic of digital surveillance, especially by the NYPD. He sponsored legislation that would have barred law enforcement from creating fake electronic communication service accounts and collecting users' account information, but that measure did not pass.

As mayor, Mamdani has not publicly moved to change the NYPD's use of facial-recognition technology, drones or other surveillance tools.

PERSISTENT FEARS AND ANXIETIES

3. **Get all of the facts of the situation:** Gathering the facts of a certain event can prevent us from relying on exaggerated and fearful assumptions. By focusing on the facts, a person can rely on what is reality and what is not. This is a great way to take control of your mental health.

4. **Use Self-Visualization:** Sometimes, we can get anxious over a task that we will have to perform in the near future. When this happens, visualize yourself doing the task in your mind. For instance, you have to play in the championship volleyball game in front of a large group of people in the next few days. Before the big day comes, imagine yourself playing the game in your mind. By doing this, you will be better prepared when the time comes.

5. **You can't predict the future:** While the consequences of a particular fear may seem real, there are usually other factors that cannot be anticipated and can affect the results of any situation. We may be ninety-nine percent correct in predicting the future, but all it takes is for that one percent to make a world of difference.

6. **Think of a red stop sign:** At times, a person might encounter a fearful thought that may be difficult to manage. When this happens, visualize a red stop sign, which can serve as a reminder to stop thinking about that thought. Regardless of how scary the thought may be, do not dwell on it. This technique is great in dealing with your negative thinking and will help reduce your fears.

7. **Get some help:** Sometimes, it helps to be able to talk to someone about your stressful situations. Talking to a trusted friend, counselor, or clergyman can give you additional advice and insights on how to deal with your current problem. Overcoming fear and anxiety takes practice. In time, you will become better able to deal with your stressful problems

My friend Mel just got back from an Aunt's funeral, where he met family members he did not know he had. Personally, I've met more relatives at funerals than I have at weddings...but maybe it's because weddings require an invitation.

Last month, my Uncle told me that my third cousin had died. No, two cousins didn't die before her. She was my third cousin because our great-grandmothers were sisters. Confusing, huh? The word "removed" just means a different generation. So, my first cousin's children would be my first cousins once removed.

I had not met the deceased, but her obituary photo looked just like my Uncle...but without the beard. I went to her memorial service so I could mingle with familiar relatives, plus meet new ones. As one of my buddies says, "You need to know cousins in several states, so you can travel cross-country for free."

The deceased cousin was 97, and she had lived a busy life. She'd been married four times, each one an upgrade from her prior spouse. At one time she'd also been a softball umpire. Maybe that's why she married so much. When a husband disputed her decision, she just called him "out."

Since the funeral was at the grave site, attendees then walked to a nearby large tent for a reception. I've never seen so many familiar-looking folks whose names I didn't know. I talked to several second cousins, third cousins, and even one old guy who looked like he'd wandered over because he smelled coffee. After the event, I remembered what an old friend told me: "Any time an event serves food outdoors, you'll see lots of aunts."

HAPPY NATIONAL BIKE MONTH!

Hello fellow Woodside riders! In a calendar chock full of special interest holidays, we cyclists get a whole month to stand out: May is National Bike Month! While the point is to promote cycling generally as a safe, low-cost, and environmentally friendly way to get around, it's also a convenient time weather-wise to encourage folks to dust off their old two-wheeler and take it for a spin. Read on for some inspiration.

Hitch a Ride

While getting on any bike at any point this month counts as participation, there are themed weeks and days to do so, as well as local rides planned all around the city. Next week, May 11-15, is Bike to Work Week, with next Friday May 15 being the official Bike to Work Day. As I've mentioned in years past, a 5-minute ride from Grand Central to your midtown office counts, it certainly does not need to be your full commute. But if you have biked that whole way to your job in the past and want to take it back up, please consider doing so again this month. This is a great month to ride to work, before it gets too hot again over the summer.

Local Options Aboard

If you didn't notice, Skillman Avenue was milled last week between 52nd all the way down to Queens Boulevard. While this would normally be a massive inconvenience for cyclists, we would do well to consider ourselves lucky to have multiple detours available compared to the last time Skillman, or 43rd for that matter, were milled. With protected lanes on Queens Boulevard, sections of 39th Avenue, and Northern Boulevard, you should be well covered until the pavement (and markings!) are restored. Who knows, you may discover a new westbound route in the process.

Are you ready to get on a bike on the occasion of this Bike Month? We have organized rides, themed days, and plenty of safe biking infrastructure in our area. If you're not able to, feel free to encourage your friends and coworkers to take to two wheels. Every ride makes a difference, whether it's an extra seat on a subway car or a car trip not taken. So consider getting into the game and taking at least one ride to participate this month, and as always, ride safe, Woodside!
