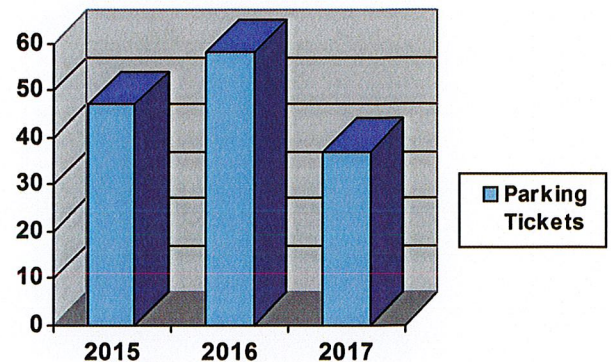
Traffic Tickets Issued

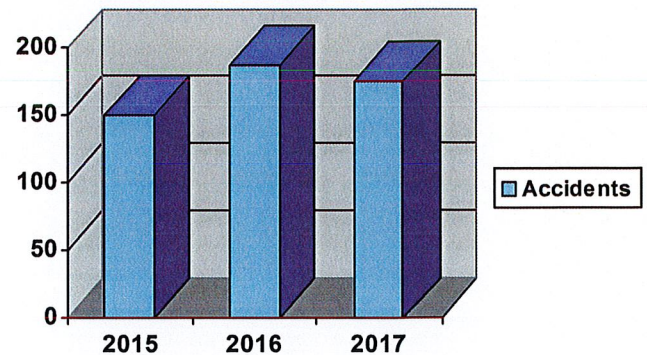
Parking Tickets Issued

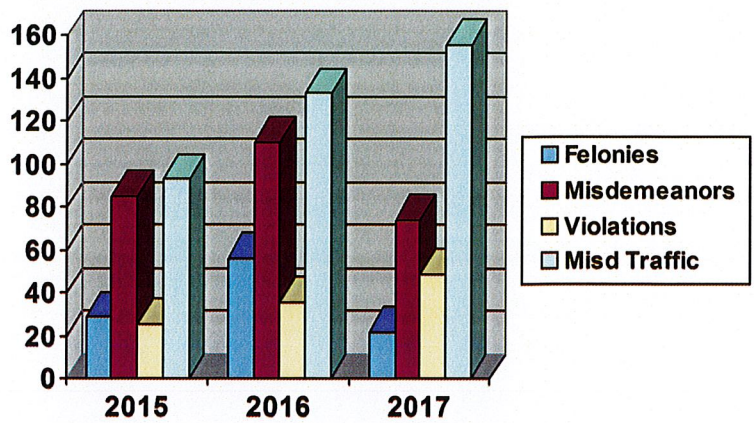
Motor Vehicle Accidents

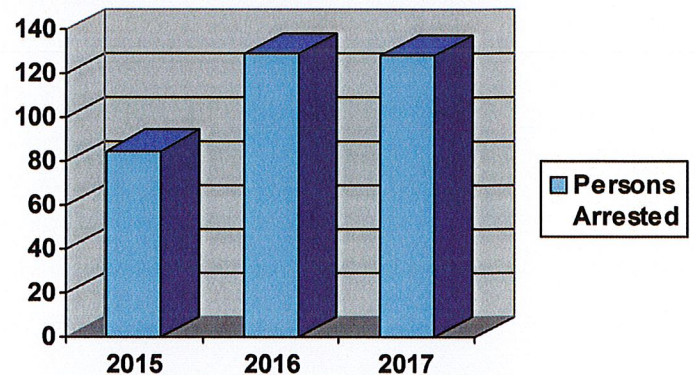

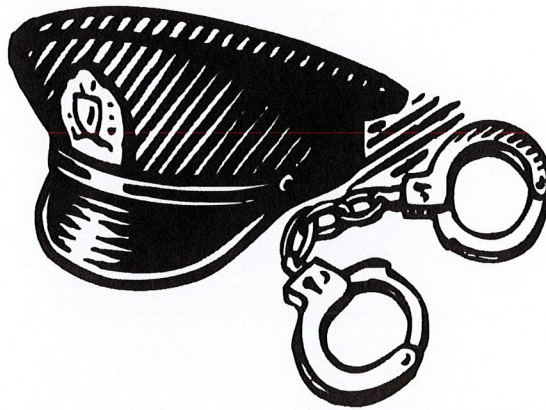
