The North Syracuse Police Departments 2021 annual report, reflects only a portion of the daily arduous work accomplished by the dedicated men and women of the Village of North Syracuse Police Department.

The Village of North Syracuse Police Department has continued to provide high quality services to our community since its inception in November of 1948. While law enforcement operations have changed significantly in the past two years, to include Raise the Age, Bail Reform, Justice Reform and Police Reform each reform being a unfunded mandate initiated by the State of New York. The North Syracuse Police Department remained determined in its commitment to providing the highest level of law enforcement services to our communities' residents and business owners, while continuously developing programs that target quality of life concerns. Even during the height of the COVID pandemic, our agencies officers continued to develop specialty teams such as our Evidence Technician Team used to process and secure evidence from crime scenes. Our Departments Officers are all highly trained professionals with some having training in specialized technical areas of policing, but all share one common objective for our community, "problem solving". 
Traffic Tickets Issued




Motor Vehicle Accidents






