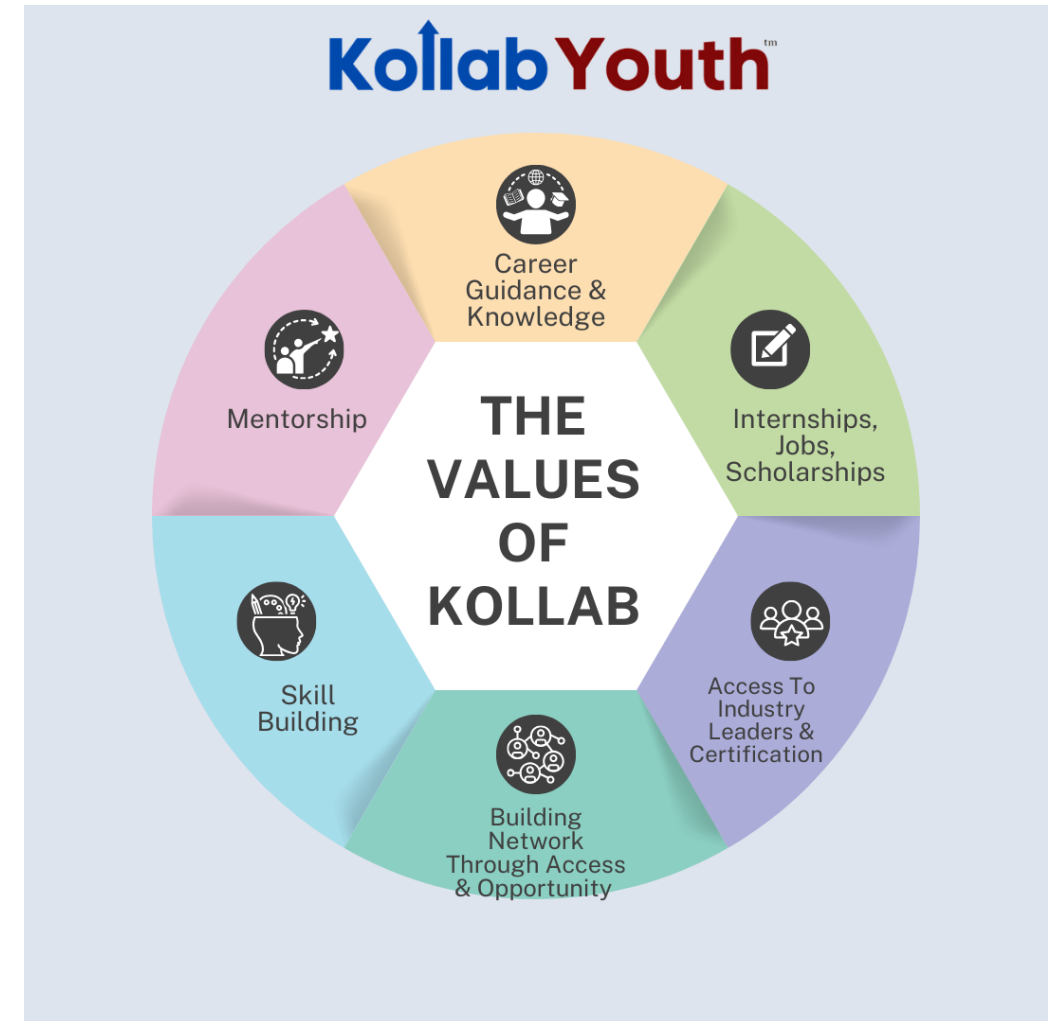

Resume Building with SoCalGas

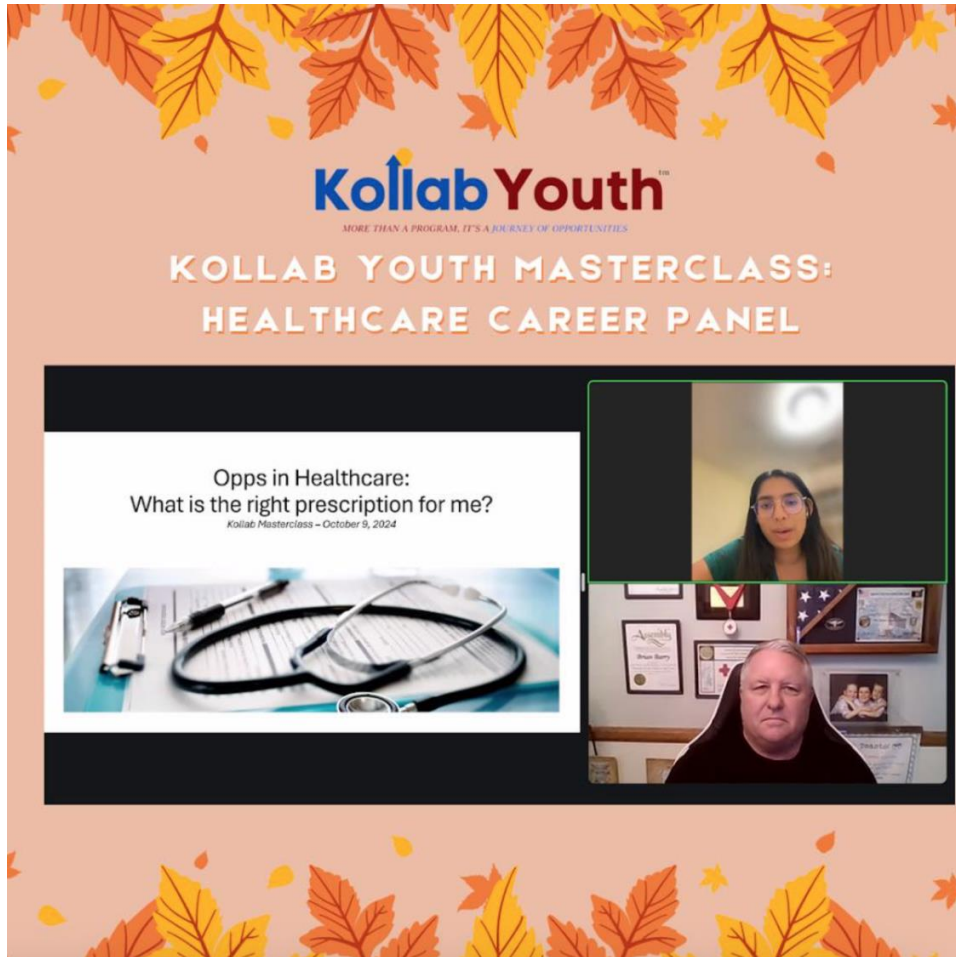

STUDENT DEMOGRAPHICS

Data Introduction

We're heading into perhaps the biggest skills gap we've seen, as we watch a mass exodus of older generations leave the workforce without enough trained workers to fill the gap.

We believe our program is a true game-changer that provides skills and opportunities for our future employees that need access and opportunity for income and economic mobility.

This is why data is a crucial component of our program, enabling us to interpret and analyze results. This helps the team make strategic decisions and gain insights into outcomes and trends. Our data significantly improves our ability to better serve our youth and to measure the impacts these programs have on participants' employment and earnings. We track youth from 2020 to present to gauge impact, outcomes and provide continued support for our youth if they need it. This can be certification, resume building, contacts, assistance with internships/apprenticeships, jobs and more. Our data provides concrete evidence of the positive change Kollab Youth is creating and demonstrates our effectiveness to donors and funders. We also allocate resources more efficiently by identifying aspects of our program with the highest impact and areas where improvements are needed. We constantly assess our effectiveness, identify areas for improvement, and refine our program design based on our data.

Gender

Pie chart depicting the Gender breakdown of the youths in our Fall 2024 Cohort. The numbers inside each slice represent the actual number of youths reporting the given gender. The proportion of female youths decreased from our Summer Cohort from 70.4% to 61%. This corresponds with an increase in the proportion of male youths from 29.6% to 37.7%, which reflects our initiatives to attract more male youths to the program. Additionally, the proportion of youths reporting their gender as Other (Genderqueer) increased from 0% to 1.3%.

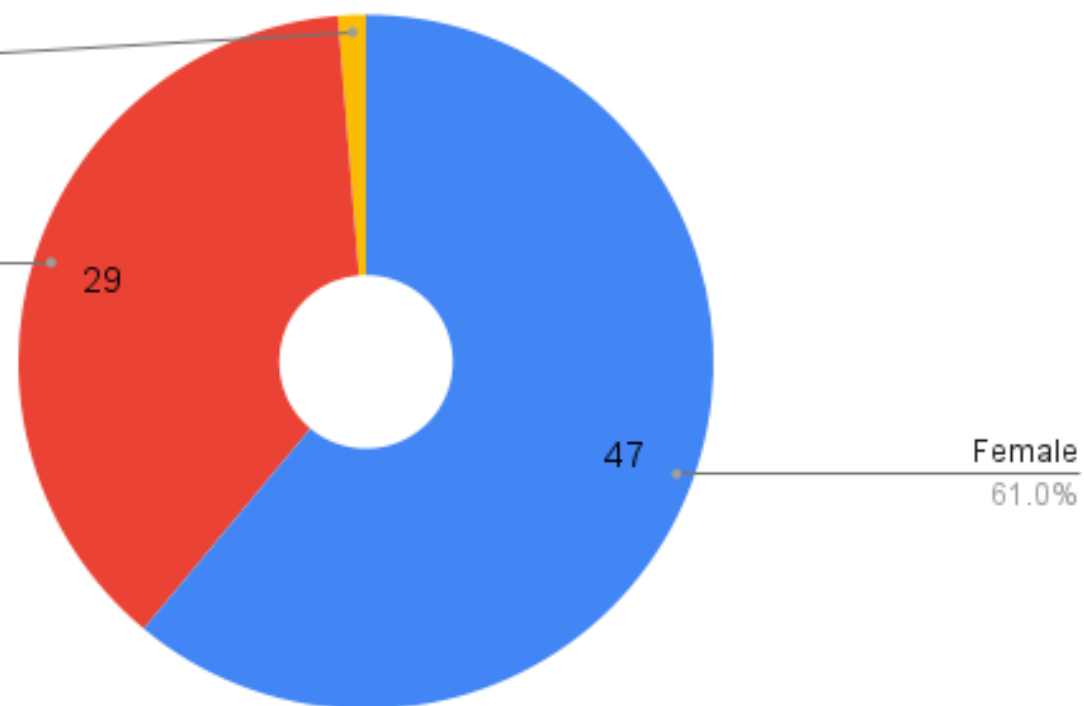

Ethnicity

Pie chart depicting the Race / Ethnicity breakdown of our Fall 2024 Cohort. The numbers inside each slice represent the actual number of youths reporting the given race / ethnicity. From our Summer 2024 Cohort, these statistics represent an increase in the proportion of youths reporting the following ethnicities: American Indian or Alaskan Native (0% to 1.3%), Asian / Pacific Islander (9.3% to 10.4%), Black / African American (13% to 14.3%), and White / Caucasian (0% to 2.6%). From the Summer 2024 Cohort to the Fall 2024 Cohort, the proportion of youths reporting the following ethnicities decreased: Hispanic (68.5% to 67.5%) and Multiple Ethnicity / Other (9.3% to 3.9%)

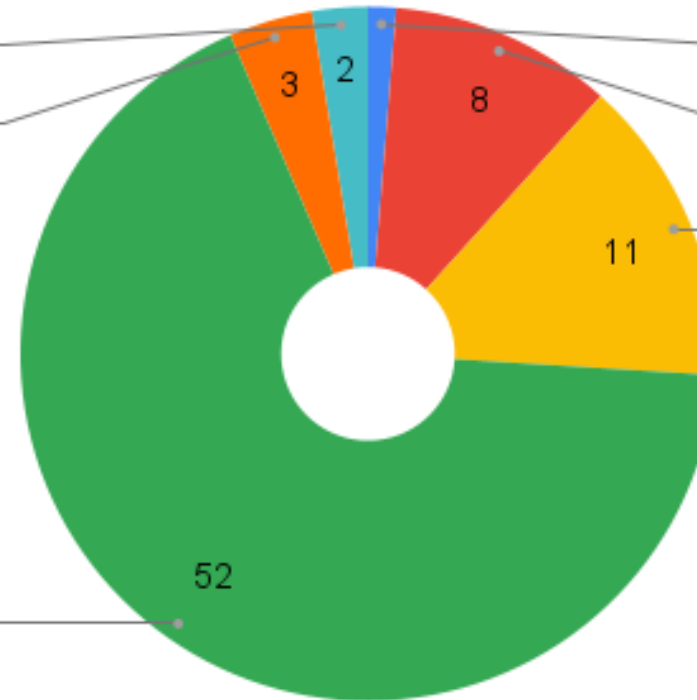

Attached are the labels for age in years, and the proportion of the cohort each age makes up. Notably, 70% of our Fall Cohort was aged 16 or older (a decrease from 85% during the Summer Cohort) – the age we start offering mentorships, and the age when most internships begin.

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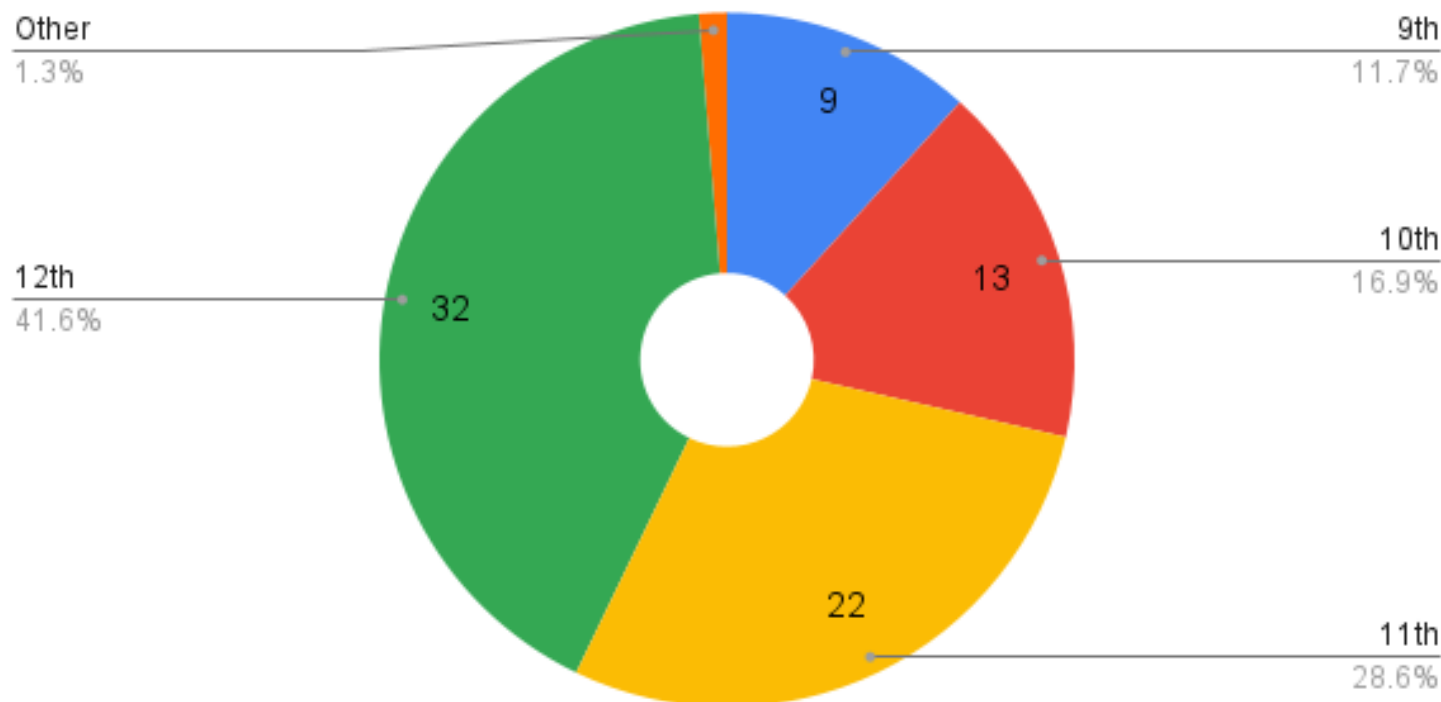
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Grade

Attached are the grade labels, and the proportion of the cohort each grade level makes up. In this case, the “Other” category represents youths in either Middle School, College, or youths who have graduated high school and are now no longer in school.

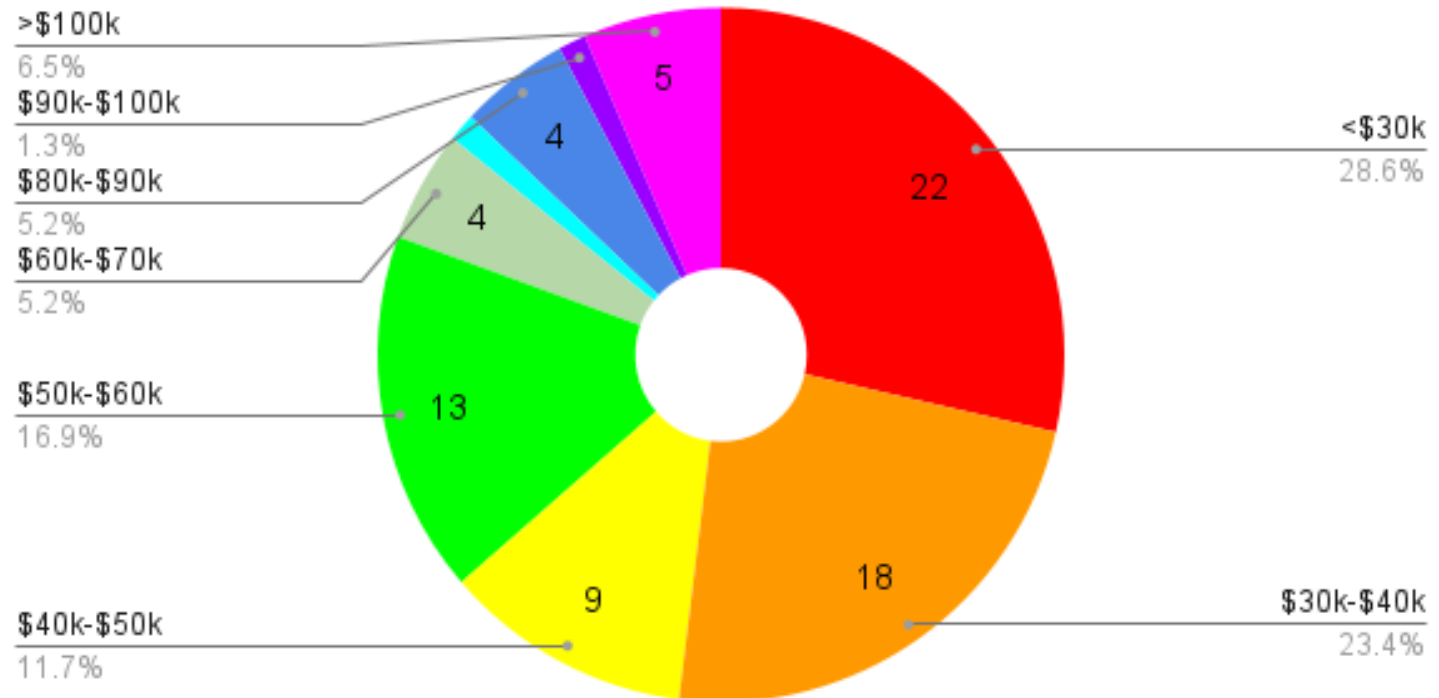


Parent Income

Pie chart depicting the reported annual income of the parents of youths in our Fall 2024 Cohort. The numbers inside each slice represent the number of youths reporting the given income bracket. Attached are the income bracket labels, and the proportion of the cohort each income bracket makes up. Notably, the percentage of the cohort making less than \$50,000 annually is 64% - almost 2/3 of our program. Additionally, [according to the Department of Housing and Urban Development](#): for a household size of 4 (our average in the Summer was 4.8), an annual income of \$63,050 is “Very Low”. This means that roughly 80% of the Fall Cohort had a “Very Low” income level.

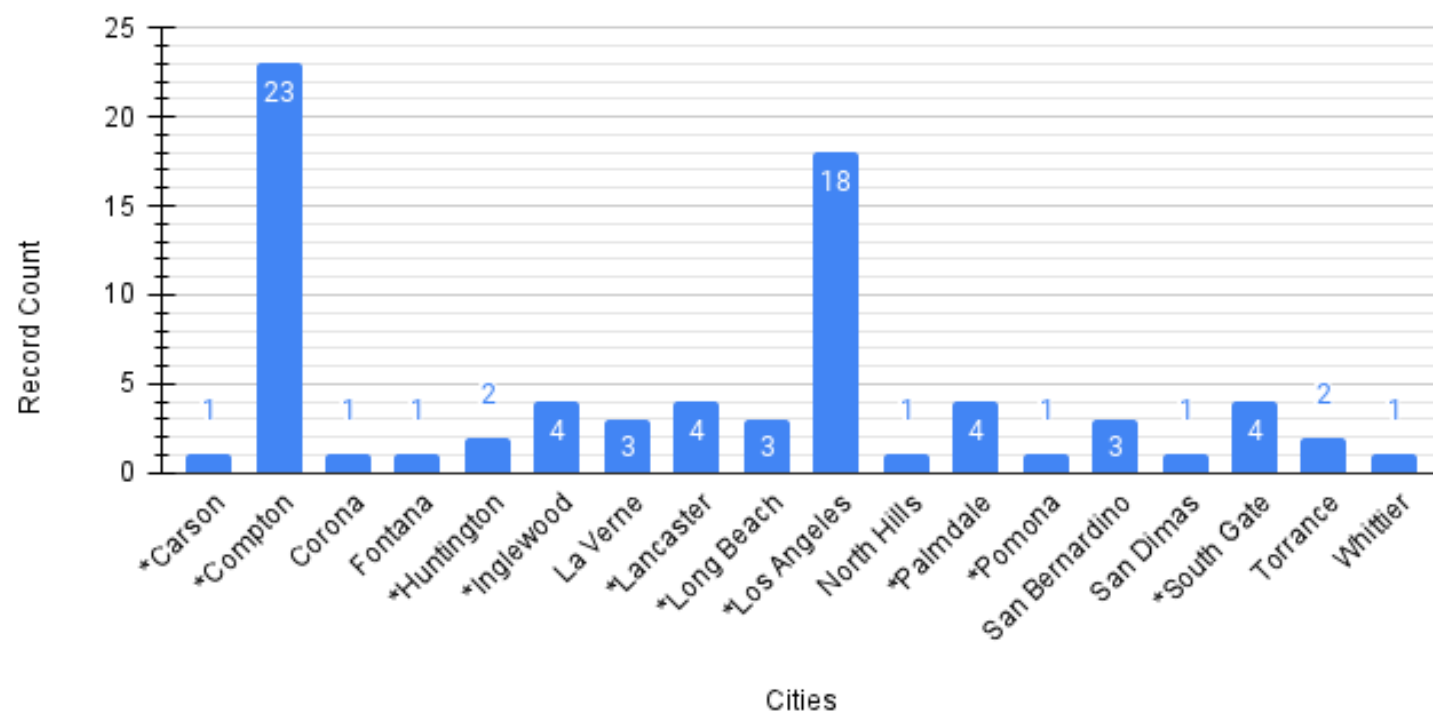


Student Location (by city)

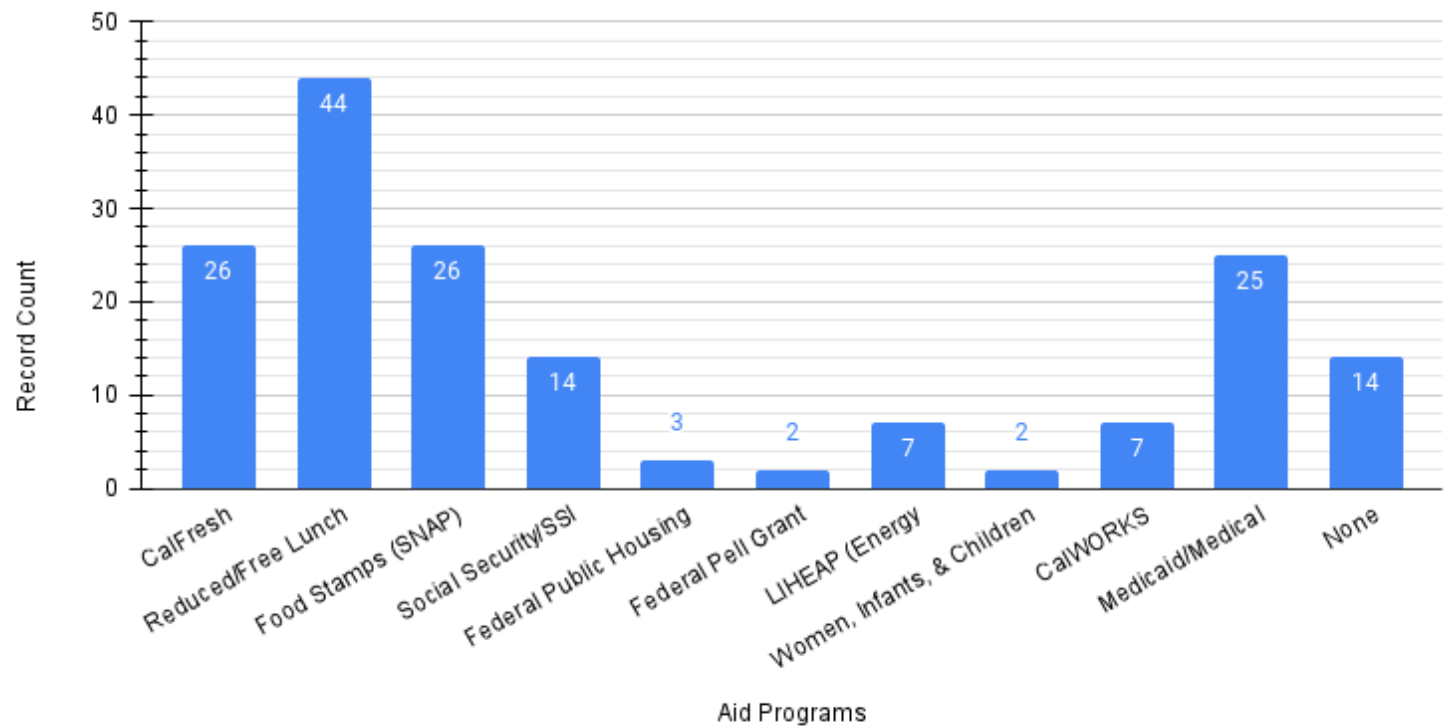


Aid Programs

During the Fall 2024 Cohort, the majority of our youths were enrolled in various aid programs. Among these programs, 67% of all aid received being some form of food aid. A detailed breakdown of the programs our youth were enrolled in is shown above. Please note that because some youths were enrolled in multiple programs, the total here (170) is higher than the number of youths enrolled for the cohort (77).

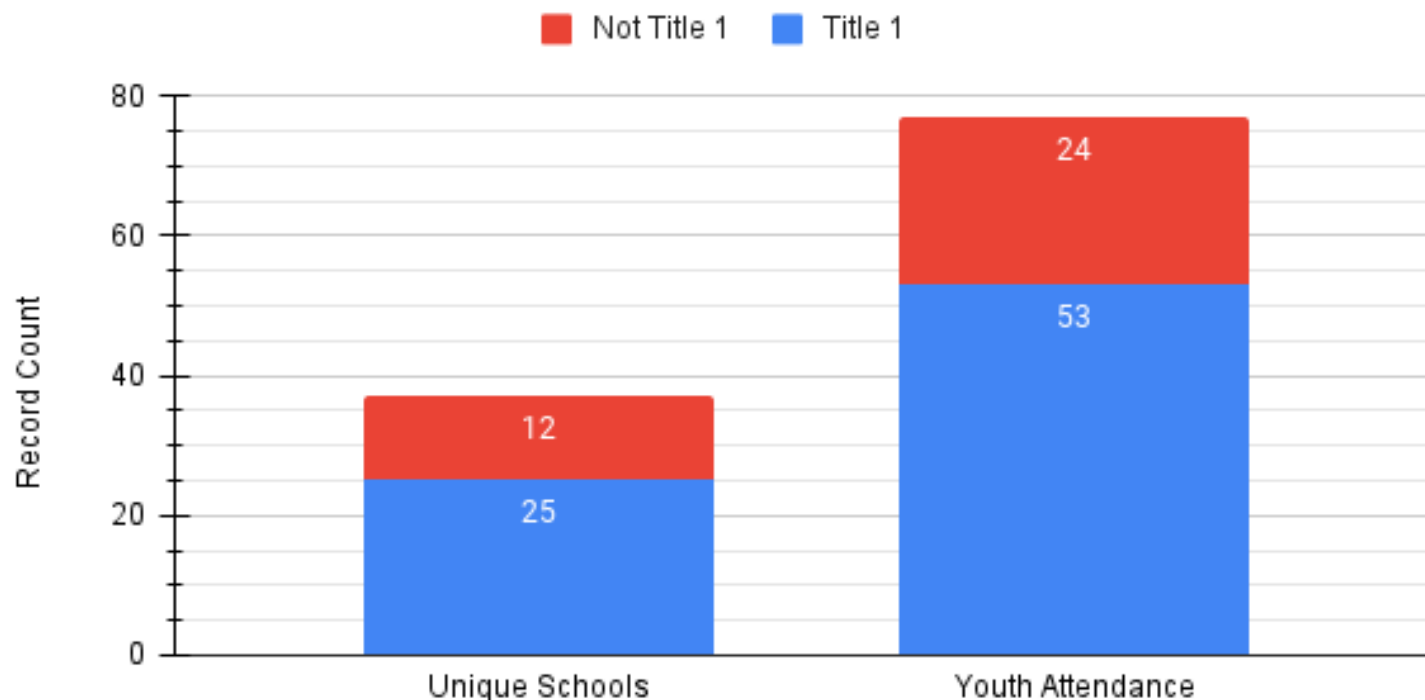


Schools

The intent of Title I program is to meet the educational needs of children in low-income households and children in local institutions for neglected or delinquent children. Participants include students who are at risk of failing, disabled, and English Learners. During the Fall 2024 Cohort, our youths attended 37 unique schools – 25 of which (or 68%) were Title I schools. In terms of youths, 53 (or 69%) attended a Title I school.

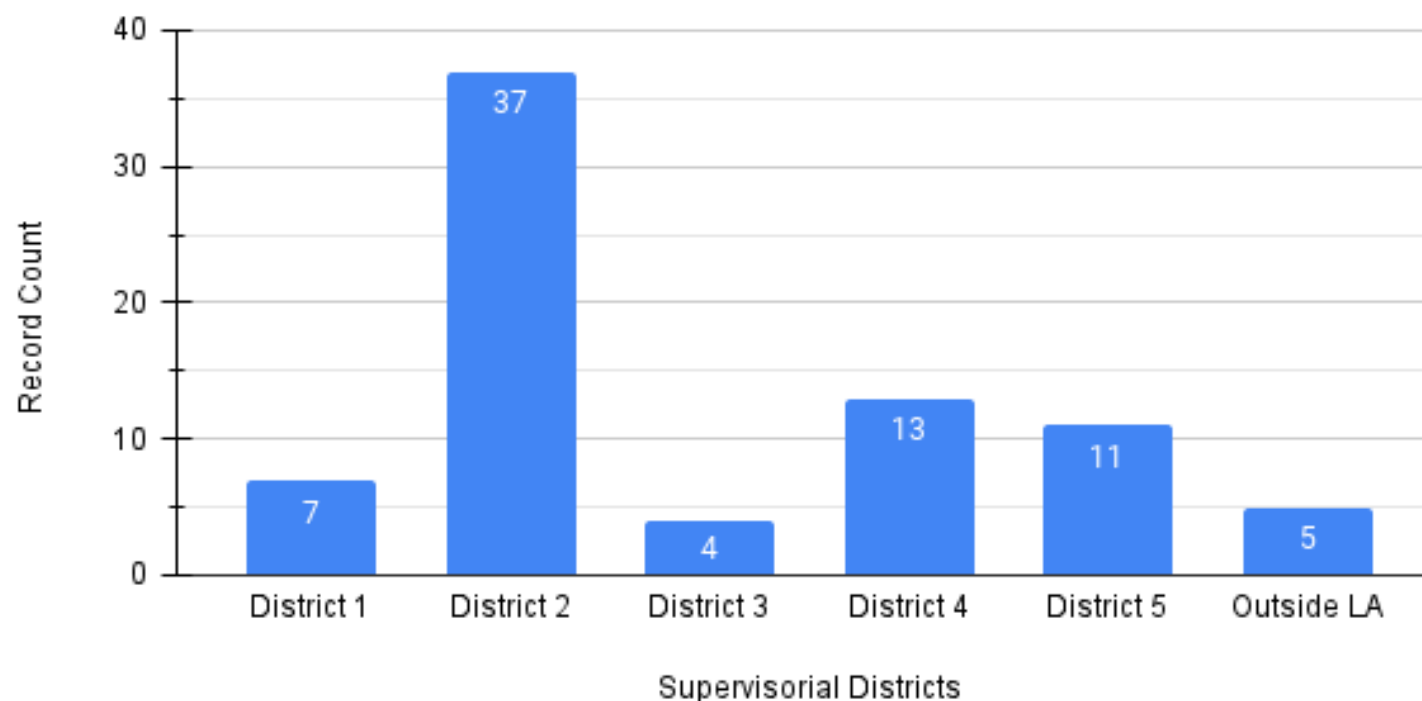


Districts

Kollab Youth recognizes and rewards participants in various ways to encourage engagement and performance. Here's a breakdown of the incentives provided:

- Class Engagement Awards: During each class, we acknowledge and reward youth for their active participation, such as keeping their cameras on, asking insightful questions, and maintaining a consistent presence.
- Cohort Completion Prizes: At the end of each cohort, we award monetary stipend/prizes based on participants' overall scores.
- Top Performer Scholarships: We grant scholarships to the top four performers in each cohort, celebrating their outstanding achievements.

*In total, approximately **\$9,000** was awarded to the youth participating in our Fall session. We believe that positive recognition is an excellent way to motivate progression and good behavior in students.*

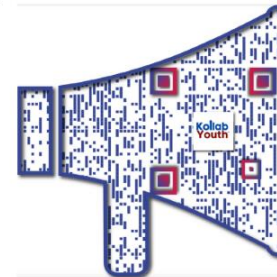
