- The Teen Summit event held on January 28th, at the Grand Central Air Terminal in Glendale, was attended by approximately 200 youths ages 13 to 19.
- The youth were greeted by keynote speaker, Academy Award winning actor and director Regina King, who provided insight to concepts and philosophies that served her well in such a competitive industry.
- The youth were focused on her message and held signs to show her where they were from in Los Angeles County such as Compton, East LA, South LA, Norwalk, Antelope Valley, Santa Clarita, Temple City, LA Harbor, and more.

- Regina King was given the Kollab Youth "Champion of Youth" award "for your steadfast support of our Kollab Youth by focusing on economic and income mobility to change lives and create a better world." The morning session had ABC7 reporter Eric Resendiz and Social & Emotional Founder and CEO Sarah Young Sheppard of SEWI (Social & Emotional Wellness Initiative), discussing tools for youth to navigate challenges and how self-doubt that can impede them from realizing their dreams of being a better person. They also highlighted that mental health is not merely the absence of disease or a mental health disorder, and that it included emotional well-being, psychological well-being, social well-being, and being able to:

- Navigate successfully the complexities of life,
- Develop fulfilling relationships,
- Adapt to change,
- Utilize appropriate coping mechanisms to achieve well-being without discrimination,
- Realize their potential,
- Have their needs met, and
- Develop skills that help them navigate the different environments they inhabit

The youth were also treated to a special presentation by Presley Aronson, a country music artist and storyteller.

Aronson formed his own production company at age 14.

As CEO of Presley Aronson Enterprise (PAE), he oversees multiple units, production managers, and crew, as well as mentors, interns.
