THE BEATITUDES

Thesis: The Beatitudes are eight characteristics that Yah says one must have in order to be blessed I.E. make the Kingdom.

- 1. Matthew 5:1-3
 - Poor in Spirit=Destitute of wealth of learning and intellectual culture which the schools afford (men of this class most readily give themselves up to Christ's teaching and proved themselves fitted to lay hold of the heavenly treasure). Also those who are aware they are poor in spirit or in need spiritually and needing the physician's help. Remember what we covered earlier this week with blaspheming the Holy Ghost. Forgiveness requires repentance. Those who know they are poor in spirit will accept repentance.

2. Matthew 5:4

- Mourn=πενθέω penthéō, pen-theh'-o; from G3997; to grieve (the feeling or the act):—mourn, (be-)wail. Strong's Greek 3996
- Grieve=To feel pain of mind or heart; to be in pain on account of an evil; to sorrow; to mourn. To give pain of mind to; to afflict; to wound the feelings.
 Nothing grieves a parent like the conduct of a profligate child. (Webster 1828)
- Blessed are those who are angered/uncomfortable with sin.
- Deuteronomy 17:2-13 (You must be ready to revenge sin. When your obedience is fulfilled. Meaning First Resurrection. Verses 9-11=In a new covenant going to the church/pastor and him telling you what to do according to the scriptures because you could not figure it out.)

3. Matthew 5:5

- Meek=πραΰς praÿs, prah-ooce'; apparently a primary word; mild, i.e. (by implication) humble:—meek. Strongs Greek 4239
- 1. Mild of temper; soft; gentle; not easily provoked or irritated; yielding; given to forbearance under injuries. Now the man Moses was very meek above all men. Numbers 12:3. Appropriately, humble, in an evangelical sense; submissive to the divine will; not proud, self-sufficient or refractory; not peevish and apt to complain of divine dispensations. Christ says, 'Learn of me, for I am meek and lowly in heart, and ye shall find rest to your souls.' Matthew 11:29. Blessed are the meek for they shall inherit the earth. Matthew 5:5. (Websters 1828)
- Believers must be humble and practice not sinning when angered.

6. Matthew 5:8

- καθαρός katharós, kath-ar-os'; of uncertain affinity; clean (literally or figuratively):—clean, clear, pure. Stong's Greek 2513
- καρδία kardía, kar-dee'-ah; prolonged from a primary κάρ kár (Latin cor, "heart");
 the heart, i.e. (figuratively) the thoughts or feelings (mind); also (by analogy) the middle:—(+ broken-)heart(-ed). Strong's Greek 2588
- Blessed are those with clean/clear conscience in regards to sin. This comes from not willfully transgressing Yah's law.

Verses 6-7=Pertains to verse 4. Abusers or False Teachers/Pastors of the law turn people from salvation. In Paul's day it was Judaizers still teaching the

sacrificial law and Nicolaitans. In our day it is mostly Nicolaitans. Verses 8-11= That law or the Sacrificial law was meant for sinners see 1 John 3:4 and not for those in the New Covenant. In the New Covenant Christ has died for our sins and we are to be sin or leaven free after our passover. Verse 12-13=Paul blasphemed the Holy Ghost but came out of that state while he had "space to repent". Verse 19=Being pure in heart)
