The Secrets of Heating and Cooling: Mastering the Climate Enchantment

- The Propane Furnace: Controlled by the Nest Thermostat near the kitchen, this magical furnace only performs heating spells. Please leave it set at a cozy 60°F unless adjustments are needed.
- The Heat Pumps: The heat and cooling pumps located in the bedrooms, game room, and living room each have their own temperature spells. But be patient, as their magic takes a little time to work! Here are a few tips to master the climate:
 - Each heat pump is controlled by its own remote (which lives in a wall holder for safekeeping).
 - If a remote finds its way under a bed or into direct sunlight, it may disrupt the temperature balance.
 - The **bedroom** and **game room** heat pumps share a single outdoor heat exchanger, meaning they must either cool or heat together. If one room is cooling and another is set to heat, neither will function, and you'll hear an annoyed "beep" from the system! (This can be especially tricky during fall and spring.)
 - The **living room** heat pump, however, operates on its own magical system and won't interfere with the bedroom units—so feel free to control it independently.
