 Used kart is good option, but new kart if you can afford it best in long run.
 Be careful not to buy a fixer upper that is bent and may have issues...
- 3. Briggs Lo206 engine is cheapest, easiest to maintain, and best place to start
- 4. Need way to transport to the track (i.e. trailer or van, or pickup)
- 5. Safety first ... Need a certified helmet, suit, neck support, and shoes
- 6. Ask questions and get training...
- 7. Practice, it is all about seat time...
- 8. Bight the bullet and enter for first race!
