I know only a drop in this large pool of talent. I wish I knew each and every one of our alumni. I often wonder where many of those I knew during my time here have ended up.

Then I think about Wilber "Bullet Joe" Rogan who was a magnificent pitcher and hitter in the Negro League from 1920-38. He was recognized by many, but not all, and inducted into the National Baseball Hall of Fame and the Negro Hall of Fame. But neither the Oklahoma Sports Hall of Fame, his birthplace, nor The Missouri Sports Hall of Fame, the state where he played and later died, have recognized and inducted "Bullet Joe" into their sports Halls of Fame.

The PHHS Hall of Fame is not a sports Hall of Fame. I believe that we have many alumni out there who have been recognized by their community for their dedication and contributions, but we have not inducted these individuals into their own high school Hall of Fame. I encourage you to submit all of your family, friends, colleagues and classmates who are very deserving of this honor. Let us know who they are, so we can recognize them at home, unlike Wilber "Bullet Joe" Rogan. Applications are due June 1.

We have just begun the 4th and last quarter of the 2018-2019 school year. This school year is going by fast and the PHamily is continuing to do well.

In the fall, we welcomed 300 9th grade fresh faces into Patrick Henry High School's newly renovated spaces. We have updates to create a beautiful and welcoming entry (see picture on page 1 of this newsletter), office spaces, and an updated auditorium, just to name a few. We are headed into the last phases of construction here at Patrick Henry, and should be completed before we open our doors for the 2019-2020 school year in the fall. This year, we received a grant from the Cal Ripken Foundation that contributed to updating some of our athletic spaces as well.

We are proud to report that Patrick Henry High School still has one of the highest graduation rates in the Minneapolis Public School District. We have our amazing students and staff who work diligently everyday to create a caring and supportive environment so students can excel academically and socially.

This year we have seen many successes including student athletes who have joined the ranks to become state qualifiers, our concert choir partnering with another high school from Thief River Falls, the return of the Student Council, and the Herobotics Team winning the Chairman's Award (see separate article on page 3).

At the beginning of each school year, we create a School Improvement Plan (SIP). One of the goals we set as part of our SIP is to work diligently to increase our ACT scores. After a few practice tests and ACT prep classes, all of our 11th graders will be taking the ACT at the end of April. We are continuing to support a culture to ensure our students are career and/or college ready when they walk out of our doors after graduation.

FIRST Robotics Competition (FRC) 2500 Herobotics team

March 13-16, PHHS's <u>FRC2500 Herobotics</u> team placed 22 out of 52 teams (record 5-5-0) at the Great Northern Region Qualification Matches in Grand Forks, ND. They were not chosen for the final eight alliances, and competition ended for the team with the qualification matches. The team presented on the importance of diversity, inclusion and sustainability of urban FIRST Robotics teams. They performed well despite having lost build time due to bad winter weather in the last weeks of the build season.

The FRC2500 Herobotics team also competed at the Minnesota 10,000 Lakes Regional Competition March 27-30 at the University of Minnesota. They ranked 15 out of 63 teams (record 6-2-1) and was eliminated from competition during the quarterfinals (record 1-2-0) as a member of the 7th seed Alliance. The team took home the Regional Chairman's Award. For the 10th time in the team's 12 years of existence, the Herobotics team will be competing at the International FIRST Robotics Competition in Detroit, MI, April 24-27. Congratulations to the FRC 2500 Herobotics team!!
