## Foundation President's Message

We are fresh off our Patriots Hall of Fame luncheon where we celebrated and acknowledged six alumni from Patrick Henry who have excelled since their time at the school, now known as Camden High School. We understand that some alumni are still unhappy about the name change. That has shown up in your reduced involvement financially, participation and overall support of the Foundation that was started 25 years ago. Now is the time to consider moving past this and reenergize our Foundation with your help.

We are at a critical time for the Foundation to continue to survive and thrive, to be able to continue with our mission: *to enhance the learning environment and expand educational opportunities for students*. The students who come from the same neighborhoods our alumni grew up in. If you are willing to help – the time is now. What we need:

**Board Members:** We need board members who would consider becoming Secretary, Treasurer, webmaster, editor, Hall of Fame selection committee, grant writer, wish list coordinator or mentor to the board and/or students. These are the areas of greatest need for the board.

**Financial Support:** We need donations of any size from our alumni. Members of the classes of the 40's, 50s and 60's have been providing most of the financial support for the Foundation's first 25 years. As these generations age, donations have declined, and the number of donors has drastically decreased. People who receive the newsletters are likely financial donors. We could use your renewed financial support. If you receive our newsletter, but have yet to financially support the Foundation's budget to print and mail a paper newsletter. We considered doing only an online version of the newsletter but recognize this may be challenging for some of our alumni. As a compromise, we have decided to change to an annual instead of a semi-annual newsletter. The newsletter provides info about our alumni, our school, our Hall of Fame and more. We hope you will consider being a donor, so we can continue to support our mission.

Without help in these areas, the Foundation Board of Directors will have to make some difficult decisions. Dissolution is possible if we don't increase the support of the Foundation. I would like to thank all the past donors, volunteers and board members for the past 25 years of their time, talent and financial support. Twenty-five years of providing scholarships, financial support of class projects and more at our high school is a significant accomplishment. I, like many of you, would feel sad if the Foundation ceased to exist. We hope you consider renewing financial support or, better yet, increasing your donation level.

If the difficult decision to dissolve the Foundation becomes a necessity, the board will ensure that remaining funds will be disbursed in a manner for which the money was donated. Scholarships to graduating seniors is an option that would provide remaining funds to students and since it is so expensive for higher education, it would not take long to earmark remaining funds for this purpose. Once funds are depleted, we will follow state and federal guidelines on dissolution.



## North Side Pride

It is nice to have sentimental roots. Celeste and I lived in the Mac-Groveland neighborhood of St Paul for 40 years and seldom crossed paths with old friends from Henry, except for the last 10 reunions. A series of events, I will call them dots on a page, have led me to a new vigor to connect the past with the present.

## A big change

When my family moved from Springfield Missouri to Minneapolis, my life got turned upside down. Entering Henry in the 9th grade, Mike Rico and his group of friends took me in and right-sided me, in spite of my home sickness for the Ozarks. Ms. Connie Blom was the first teacher to reach out and believe in me and she was the last one that I said "so long" to at graduation.

#### Extended family

Our '72 class was a good group of scholars, athletes, and personalities. But, in some ways, it felt like the class of 1969-1974. I looked up to schoolmates several years ahead of me and had special relationships with classmates a couple of years behind me. Mike Osgood '70 made me feel like a somebody, Mary Nyquist '71 sang in the halls, the "buzz saws" Danny Bergstrom '71 & Jeff Lundeen '71 made a difference, Glenn Teske '71 made his shots, Bob Majkozak '72 & Gary Langley '72 were buds, Tommy Lundeen '73 got the big hit, Scott Llewellyn '74 was memorable, and Doug Laliberte '72 IS Santa Claus. We had fun at Long Lake, played ball for the GREAT DICK CASSIDY, skied in Canada, played on the Drive, hung out at Wanda's, Hi-Y'ed around town, raced milk cartons, and went on the world's greatest bike hike. For sure, we didn't let the books get in the way of our education.

#### **Recent reconnections**

- It was a proud moment when we sat in Target Arena and watched Henry defeat North for the state basketball championship. Better yet, we just happened to buy tickets next to all the Rico sisters, who taught me how to ice skate at Loring School when I was in the 9th grade.
- My son-in-law, Ben is a pastor at Hope Lutheran Church. Ben and Amy's kids started school at Loring, and they embraced the Victory neighborhood. Several years ago, we went to the HOLIDAY on 44th Festival, which terminated at a craft fair inside the gym at Henry. I was impressed to see the plaques of the Henry Hall of Fame (HOF), which I didn't even know existed.
- Last year, we toured the school as part of our 50th class of '72 reunion. Marcus Zackery showed us around and it was evident that our halls were upgrad-

ed over the years and school spirit was everywhere. It got my attention.

#### New awakening to Camden High School and the Patriot Foundation

In December 2024, Steve Anderson '72 was inducted into the HOF. As I attended the luncheon, I couldn't help but think back about all the irreplaceable moments with friends, teachers, and activities that prepared me for the next level of life's lessons.

In a way, I have gone full circle, starting at Henry, raising a family in St Paul, Ben & Amy just happening to move into our old stomping grounds and re-acquainting me with where I started as a smooth-talking hillbilly.
